SENATE BILL NO. 2825

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
2 REVISE REQUIREMENTS FOR SHOWING PROOF OF RESIDENCY TO OBTAIN A
3 RESIDENT HUNTING LICENSE; TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-19, MISSISSIPPI
4 CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE PROOF OF DOMICILE; AND FOR RELATED
5 PURPOSES.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

7 SECTION 1. Section 49-7-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
8 amended as follows:

9 49-7-3. (1) Any resident of the State of Mississippi shall
10 be entitled to receive a resident fishing license.

11 (2) Any person domiciled within the State of Mississippi
12 shall be entitled to receive a resident hunting license provided
13 in Section 49-7-5. The domicile of a person is that person's
14 principal or primary home or place of abode. A "principal or
15 primary home or place of abode" is that home or place in which a
16 person's habitation is fixed and to which he, whenever absent, has
17 the present intention of returning after a departure of absence
18 therefrom, regardless of the duration of the absence. The burden
19 of proving domicile shall be on the person claiming such
20 status. * * * The following evidence or other reliable evidence
21 may be considered in establishing, but is not necessarily
22 determinative of, domicile: driver's license, residence for
23 income or other tax purposes, homestead exemption receipt, or any
24 other means prescribed by the department. In the case of minors,
25 domicile of the parents shall be used as evidence of the minor's
26 domicile.

27 (3) A nondomiciliary of the state may be issued a resident

28 hunting or fishing license or combination resident hunting/fishing
29 license upon providing the following:

30 (a) A current identification card from a Mississippi
31 college or university; or

32 (b) A current military identification card showing that
33 the person is an active member of the Armed Forces (excluding
34 Reserves and the National Guard) and proof that the person is
35 stationed on a military base in Mississippi.

36 (4) A holder of a resident or nonresident license is
37 required to carry the license on his person while engaged in
38 hunting, trapping or fishing. Any penalty for not carrying a
39 license while engaged in hunting, trapping or fishing shall be
40 waived if the person can verify purchase of a license prior to the
41 date of the violation.

42 (5) Each application or filing made under this section shall
43 include the Social Security number(s) of the applicant in
44 accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 1972.

45 SECTION 2. Section 63-1-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
46 amended as follows:

47 63-1-19. Every applicant for a license issued pursuant to
48 this article shall file an application for such license, on a form
49 provided by the Department of Public Safety, with the commissioner
50 or an official license examiner of the department. All persons
51 not holding valid, unexpired licenses issued in this state shall
52 be required to secure an original license and show proof of
53 domicile in the state, except those specifically exempted from
54 licensing under Section 63-1-7. The application shall state the
55 name, date of birth, sex, race, color of eyes, color of hair,
56 weight, height and residence address, and whether or not the
57 applicant's privilege to drive has been suspended or revoked at
58 any time, and, if so, when, by whom, and for what cause, and
59 whether any previous application by him has been denied, and
60 whether he has any physical defects which would interfere with his

61 operating a motor vehicle safely upon the highways.

62 Each application or filing made under this section shall
63 include the Social Security number(s) of the applicant in
64 accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 1972.

65 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
66 and after July 1, 1999.
