SENATE BILL NO. 2828 (As Sent to Governor)

- 1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-27-12, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO INCREASE THE ANNUAL LICENSE RENEWAL FEE FOR PODIATRISTS AND PROVIDE THAT A PORTION OF THOSE FEES SHALL BE USED TO SUPPORT A 3 PROGRAM TO AID IMPAIRED LICENSEES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 73-27-12, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows: 73-27-12. (1) The license of every person licensed to 8 practice podiatry in the State of Mississippi shall be renewed 9 10 annually. On or before May 1 of each year, the State Board of Medical 11 12 Licensure shall mail an application for renewal of license to every podiatrist to whom a license was issued or renewed during 13 the current licensing year. The applicant shall complete the 14 15 application and return it to the board * * * before June 30 with the renewal fee of an amount established by the board, but not to 16 exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), a portion of which fee shall 17 be used to support a program to aid impaired podiatrists. Upon 18 19 receipt of the application and fee, the board * * * shall verify 20 the accuracy of the application and issue to applicant a certificate of renewal for the ensuing year, beginning July 1 and 21 22 expiring June 30 of the succeeding calendar year. Such renewal 23 shall render the holder thereof a legal practitioner as stated on
- 25 (2) Any podiatrist practicing in Mississippi who allows his 26 license to lapse by failing to renew the license as provided in 27 subsection (1) may be reinstated by the board * * * on

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the renewal form.

- 28 satisfactory explanation for such failure to renew, by completion
- 29 of a reinstatement form, and upon payment of the renewal fee for
- 30 the current year, and shall be assessed a fine of Twenty-five
- 31 Dollars (\$25.00) plus an additional fine of Five Dollars (\$5.00)
- 32 for each month thereafter that the license renewal remains
- 33 delinquent.
- 34 (3) Any podiatrist not practicing in Mississippi who allows
- 35 his license to lapse by failing to renew the license as provided
- 36 in subsection (1) may be reinstated by the board on satisfactory
- 37 explanation for such failure to renew, by completion of a
- 38 reinstatement form and upon payment of all arrearage and the
- 39 renewal fee for the current year.
- 40 (4) Any podiatrist who allows his license to lapse shall be
- 41 notified by the board of medical licensure within thirty (30) days
- 42 of such lapse.
- 43 (5) Any person practicing as a licensed podiatrist during
- 44 the time his license has lapsed shall be considered an illegal
- 45 practitioner and shall be subject to penalties set forth in
- 46 Section 73-27-17, provided he has not submitted the required
- 47 reinstatement form and fee within fifteen (15) days after
- 48 notification by the board * * * of such lapse.
- 49 (6) Fees collected under the provisions of this section
- 50 shall be used by the board * * * to defray expenses of
- 51 administering the licensure provisions of Title 73, Chapter 27,
- 52 Mississippi Code of 1972, and to support a program to aid impaired
- 53 podiatrists in an amount determined by the board.
- 54 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 55 and after its passage.
