SENATE BILL NO. 2890 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 57-1-55, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TO 1 2 EMPLOY LICENSED REAL ESTATE BROKERS AND APPRAISERS NECESSARY FOR 3 4 THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT OF ANY REAL ESTATE UNDER THE OWNERSHIP OR CONTROL OF THE DEPARTMENT; TO PROVIDE THAT STATE PROMOTION 5 <u>CONTRACTS AND SUCH INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT CONTRACTS SHALL BE</u> <u>SUBJECT TO PUBLIC BID PROCEDURES;</u> AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 6 7 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 57-1-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows: 57-1-55. (1) The Department of Economic and Community 11 Development shall have the following general powers and duties: 12 To develop and manage programs which enhance the climate for 13 14 economic growth through assistance to private sector businesses, 15 local communities and individuals, and through an extensive national and international marketing effort. 16 (2) The Department of Economic and Community Development 17 shall have the following general powers and duties with respect to 18 economic development: 19 (a) To plan, supervise and direct an active program of 20 solicitation of industries to locate within the state; 21 22 To prepare, maintain and disseminate information (b) which is needed by companies in evaluating site locations; 23 24 (c) To consult with, advise and assist prospective industries wishing to locate within the state; 25 (d) To encourage new or expanding industries, which 26 27 will add to the economy, to locate within the state; 28 (e) To maintain a coordinated liaison function with

No. 2890 99\SS26\R1095SG PAGE 1 29 other development groups, including state and federal agencies, and planning and development districts, utility companies, 30 31 chambers of commerce and railroads; To assist communities and counties within the state 32 (f) 33 in preparation for economic growth; 34 To assist new and existing business and industry (g) and encourage their development and expansion; 35 To plan and conduct a nationwide advertising 36 (h) 37 program promoting the state to prospective industry. Any contract entered into for such purposes shall be advertised, bid and 38 accepted in accordance with the same procedure as prescribed for 39 40 the advertisement and acceptance of bids for the purchase of 41 commodities and contracts for public purchases under Chapter 7, Title 31, Mississippi Code of 1972; 42 To work with economic development agencies of the 43 (i) 44 federal government in areas of industrial development and provide information to industrial prospects regarding the availability of 45 federal funds and assistance; 46 47 (j) To work with the Department of Corrections, pursuant to the provisions of Section 47-5-501 et seq., in 48 49 identifying and evaluating acceptable industries and businesses and in acting as an agent of the Department of Corrections by 50 51 communicating with such concerns and aggressively soliciting their 52 participation in the Correctional Industries Work Program; 53 (k) To perform related work as required; 54 (1)To disseminate information about financial and other programs of the Department of Economic and Community 55 56 Development that will assist in the creation or expansion of industries processing wood products in this state; 57 58 (m) To market processed and raw agricultural products 59 domestically and abroad; \* \* \* (n) To aid in the establishment of business incubation 60 centers by private business interests, not for profit 61

The department may provide funds by contract for the establishment of business 63 64 incubation centers and may contract for space in which business incubation centers will be located. Business incubation centers 65 66 are defined as facilities and support services that encourage the establishment of successful small businesses by providing a 67 short-term sheltered environment. The department may solicit and 68 accept grants and other financial aid or support from private or 69 70 public sources to aid in the development of business incubation 71 centers. In addition, advice and assistance to established business incubation centers may be provided by the department; and 72 73 (o) To employ licensed real estate brokers and 74 appraisers necessary for the industrial development of any real 75 estate under the ownership or control of the Department of Economic and Community Development. Any contract entered into for 76 such purposes shall be advertised, bid and accepted in accordance 77 78 with the same procedure as prescribed for the advertisement and acceptance of bids for the purchase of commodities and contracts 79 80 for public purchases under Chapter 7, Title 31, Mississippi Code 81 <u>of 1972.</u>

82 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 83 and after its passage.

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
