SENATE BILL NO. 2942 (As Passed the Senate)

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO

 REVISE THE SALARY OF THE COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY IN CERTAIN

 COUNTIES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE

 SECTION 1. Section 25-3-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 76 thousand (50,000) in the 1960 federal census, wherein is located a
- 77 state-supported university and in which U.S. Highways 49 and 11
- 78 intersect, the salary of the county prosecuting attorney shall be
- 79 not less than Seventeen Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$17,400.00)
- 80 per year. The Board of Supervisors of Forrest County,
- 81 Mississippi, may, in its discretion, and by agreement with the
- 82 county prosecuting attorney, employ the county prosecuting
- 83 attorney as a full-time elected official during his/her term of
- 84 office, designate additional duties and responsibilities of the
