## SENATE BILL NO. 2942 (As Sent to Governor)

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN CERTAIN COUNTIES TO INCREASE
- 3 THE SALARY OF THE COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY; AND FOR RELATED

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 25-3-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 9 of this section, the county prosecuting attorney may receive for
- 10 his services an annual salary to be paid by the board of
- 11 supervisors as follows:
- 12 (a) For counties with a total population of more than
- 13 two hundred thousand (200,000), a salary not to exceed
- 14 Twenty-eight Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$28,500.00).
- 15 (b) For counties with a total population of more than
- one hundred thousand (100,000) and not more than two hundred
- 17 thousand (200,000), a salary not to exceed Twenty-six Thousand
- 18 Five Hundred Dollars (\$26,500.00).
- 19 (c) For counties with a total population of more than
- 20 fifty thousand (50,000) and not more than one hundred thousand
- 21 (100,000), a salary not to exceed Twenty-one Thousand Seven
- 22 Hundred Dollars (\$21,700.00).
- 23 (d) For counties with a total population of more than
- 24 thirty-five thousand (35,000) and not more than fifty thousand
- 25 (50,000), a salary not to exceed Twenty Thousand Four Hundred
- 26 Dollars (\$20,400.00).
- (e) For counties with a total population of more than
- 28 twenty-five thousand (25,000) and not more than thirty-five

- 29 thousand (35,000), a salary not to exceed Nineteen Thousand Three
- 30 Hundred Dollars (\$19,300.00).
- 31 (f) For counties with a total population of more than

- 35 (g) For counties with a total population of more than

(w) In any county in which the 1975 assessed valuation was Forty Million Seven Hundred Thirty-nine Thousand Four Hundred Sixty-six Dollars (\$40,739,466.00) and wherein U.S. Highway 45 and Mississippi Highway 8 intersect, the salary of the county prosecuting attorney shall be equal to that of a member of the board of supervisors of such county \* \* \*.

having a population greater than fifty thousand (50,000) according to the 1980 federal decennial census and also having a national military park and national cemetery, an annual salary of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) or a salary equal to that of a member of the board of supervisors in such county, whichever is greater. - 419 attorney was elected.
- 420 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of
- 421 Mississippi shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by
- 422 the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a
- 423 veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the
- 424 United States District Court for the District of Columbia in
- 425 accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965,
- 426 as amended and extended.
- 427 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 428 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
- 429 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
