COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2960

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 PROVIDE FOR A SALARY SUPPLEMENT FOR SCHOOL DISTRICT 3 SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGISTS AND AUDIOLOGISTS WHO OBTAIN THE 4 CERTIFICATE OF CLINICAL COMPETENCE FROM THE AMERICAN SPEECH-LANGUAGE-HEARING ASSOCIATION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows: 37-19-7. (1) The allowance in the minimum education program 9 for teachers' salaries in each county and separate school district 10 shall be determined and paid in accordance with the scale for 11 teachers' salaries as provided in this subsection for the number 12 13 of teachers employed not in excess of the number of teacher units 14 allotted. For teachers holding the following types of licenses or the equivalent as determined by the State Board of Education, and 15 16 the following number of years of teaching experience, the scale shall be as follows: 17 1999-2000 School Year 18 and School Years Thereafter 19 Less Than 25 Years of Teaching Experience 20 21 AAAA.....\$24,445.00 2.2 AAA 23,595.00 23 AA..... 22,745.00 24 A..... 21,695.00 25 25 or More Years of Teaching Experience AAAA.....\$25,445.00 26 27 28 AA..... 23,745.00

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30 It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made 31 available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall 32 33 be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal and compensation system implemented by the State Board of 34 The State Board of Education shall have the authority 35 Education. to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to 36 establish, administer and maintain the system. 37

38 All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no 39 40 school district shall receive any funds under this section for any 41 school year during which the local supplement paid to any individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that 42 paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties 43 44 from local supplement during the immediately preceding school 45 The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health year. and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the 46 47 aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a part of the amount of individual local supplement. 48

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Fifty-five Dollars (\$655.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

54 For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base 55 pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of 56 Five Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$590.00) for each year of teaching 57 experience possessed by the person holding such license until such 58 person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

59 For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay 60 specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Five 61 Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$520.00) for each year of teaching 62 experience possessed by the person holding such license until such

For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$425.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-one (21) years of teaching experience.

The level of professional training of each teacher to be used in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current school year.

74 Prior to April 15 of any school year in which a teacher (2)75 meets the standard requirements, any licensed teacher who shall 76 have met the requirements and acquired a Master Teacher 77 certificate from the National Board for Professional Teaching 78 Standards and who is employed by a local school board or the State 79 Board of Education as a teacher and not as an administrator shall receive a salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars 80 (\$6,000.00) in addition to any other compensation to which the 81 The teacher shall be reimbursed one (1) 82 teacher may be entitled. 83 time for the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring the Master Teacher certificate, regardless of whether or not the 84 85 process resulted in the award of the Master Teacher certificate. All such salary supplements and process reimbursement shall be 86 paid directly by the State Department of Education to the local 87 88 school district and shall be in addition to its minimum education 89 program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education, and 90 subject to appropriation by the Legislature. Local school 91 districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any 92 93 teacher receiving such salary supplement, and the teacher shall receive any local supplement to which teachers with similar 94 95 training and experience are otherwise entitled.

96 (3) Beginning with the next school year following the school
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year in which a school district speech-language pathologist and 97 98 audiologist meets the standard requirements, any full-time licensed speech-language pathologist and audiologist employed by a 99 local school district who shall have met the requirements and 100 101 acquired a Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American 102 Speech-Language-Hearing Association shall receive a Six Thousand Dollar (\$6,000.00) salary supplement plus fringe benefits in 103 addition to any other compensation to which the employee may be 104 entitled. All such salary supplements and fringe benefits shall 105 106 be paid directly by the State Department of Education to the local school district and shall be in addition to its minimum education 107 108 program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with 109 regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education, and subject to appropriation by the Legislature. Local school 110 districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any such 111 112 employee receiving such salary supplement, and the employee shall 113 receive any local supplement to which employees with similar training and experience are otherwise entitled. The salary 114 115 supplement authorized under this subsection (3) shall be discontinued two (2) years after the date on which the National 116 Board for Professional Teaching Standards offers a certification 117 process for a Master Teacher certificate for school speech 118 119 pathologists/audiologists and any such school speech 120 pathologists/audiologists will be required to complete the Master Teacher certificate process under subsection (2) in order to 121 122 continue receiving such salary supplement. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 123
