SENATE BILL NO. 3035

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-17-86, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO AUTHORIZE LOANS FROM THE WATER POLLUTION CONTROL EMERGENCY LOAN 3 FUND TO ASSIST POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS IN DEFRAYING THE COSTS OF 4 FACILITIES PLANNING AND PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING DESIGN FOR WATER 5 POLLUTION CONTROL REVOLVING FUND PROJECTS; TO LIMIT THE AMOUNT OF 6 LOANS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 49-17-86, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amend as follows:

49-17-86. (1) (a) There is created a fund in the State
Treasury to be designated as the "Water Pollution Control
Emergency Loan Fund" hereinafter referred to as "emergency fund."

(b) The emergency fund may receive proceeds from the sale of taxable bonds, grants, gifts, donations or funds from any source, public or private. The emergency fund shall be credited with all repayments of principal and interest derived from loans made from the emergency fund.

18 (c) The monies in the emergency fund may be expended19 only in amounts appropriated by the Legislature.

(d) The emergency fund shall be maintained in perpetuity for the purposes established in this act. Unexpended amount remaining in the emergency fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund. Any interest earned on amounts in the emergency fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund.

(2) The commission shall establish a loan program to assist
political subdivisions in making emergency improvements such as
repairs to or replacement of machinery, equipment, materials,

No. 3035 99\SS26\R1160 PAGE 1 29 structures or devices in existing water pollution abatement 30 projects or such other emergency water pollution abatement projects as the commission deems necessary. In addition, loans 31 from the emergency fund may be made to assist political 32 33 subdivisions in defraying the costs of facilities planning and preliminary engineering design for water pollution control 34 revolving fund projects; however, the amount of any loan for these 35 purposes shall not exceed Twenty-five Thousand Dollars 36 37 (\$25,000.00). Loans from the emergency fund may be made to political subdivisions as set forth in a loan agreement in amounts 38 not exceeding one hundred percent (100%) of eligible project costs 39 as established by the commission. The commission may require 40 41 local participation or funding from other sources, or otherwise limit the percentage of costs covered by loans from the emergency 42 43 fund. The commission may establish a maximum amount for any loan. 44 The emergency fund may be used only: (3) 45 To make loans on the condition that: (a) (i) Loans are made at or below market interest 46 rates, at terms not to exceed ten (10) years after project 47 48 completion; the interest rate may vary from time to time and from loan to loan at the discretion of the commission. 49 50 (ii) Periodic principal and interest payments will commence when required by the commission but not later than one 51 (1) year after project completion and all loans will be fully 52 53 amortized when required by the commission but not later than ten (10) years after project completion. 54 55 (iii) The recipient of a loan shall establish a dedicated source of revenue for repayment of loans. In addition, 56 57 the commission may require any loan recipient to impose a per 58 connection surcharge on each customer for repayment of any loan 59 funds provided under this section. (iv) The recipient of the loan is not in arrears 60 in repayments to the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund, the 61 62 Water Pollution Control Emergency Loan Fund or under the Water 63 Pollution Abatement Loan Program. 64 To provide financial assistance to political (b)

65 subdivisions in making emergency improvements such as repairs to

S. B. No. 3035 99\SS26\R1160 PAGE 2 or replacement of machinery, equipment, materials, structures or devices in existing water pollution abatement projects or such other emergency water pollution abatement projects as the commission deems necessary.

70 (4) The commission shall establish a system of evaluating 71 the eligibility of projects, including a determination of the 72 emergency nature of a situation for which funding is sought.

(5) The fund will be credited with all payments of principal
and interest derived from the fund uses described in subsection
(3) of this section.

The commission may establish and collect fees to defray 76 (6) 77 the reasonable costs of administering the emergency fund. Any administrative fees may be included in loan amounts to political 78 79 subdivisions for the purpose of facilitating payment to the commission; fees may not exceed five percent (5%) of the loan 80 81 amount. The commission may also use administrative fees collected 82 pursuant to Section 49-17-85 to defray the reasonable costs of 83 administering the emergency fund.

84 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 85 and after July 1, 1999.

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
