SENATE BILL NO. 3080 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO CREATE THE JACKSON CONVENTION AND VISITORS BUREAU 1 2 AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP OF SUCH BUREAU; TO IMPOSE A TAX IN THE AMOUNT OF 1% OF THE GROSS PROCEEDS OF SALES OF RESTAURANTS, 3 HOTELS AND MOTELS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS FOR OPERATION 4 5 OF THE BUREAU; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. As used in this act, the following terms shall 8 have the meanings ascribed to them in this section unless 9 otherwise clearly indicated by the context in which they are used: "Bureau" means the Jackson Convention and Visitors 10 (a) Bureau. 11 "Council" means the City Council of the City of 12 (b) 13 Jackson, Mississippi. 14 "Hotel" or "motel" means and includes a place of (C) lodging that at any one (1) time will accommodate transient guests 15 on a daily or weekly basis and that is known to the trade as such, 16 and which is located within the city limits of Jackson, 17 Mississippi. Such terms shall not include a place of lodging with 18 ten (10) or less rental units. 19 "Mayor" means the Mayor of the City of Jackson, 20 (d) 21 Mississippi. "Restaurant" means and includes all places where 2.2 (e) 23 prepared food is sold and whose annual gross proceeds of sales or gross income for the preceding calendar year equals or exceeds One 24 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00), and which are located 25 within the city limits of Jackson, Mississippi. For the purpose 26 27 of calculating gross proceeds of sales or gross income, the sales

or income of all establishments owned, operated or controlled by the same person, persons or corporation shall be aggregated.

30 SECTION 2. There is hereby created the Jackson Convention 31 and Visitors Bureau to be constituted and appointed as provided in 32 Section 3 of this act.

33 SECTION 3. (1) The Jackson Convention and Visitors Bureau 34 shall consist of nine (9) members, who shall be appointed, qualify 35 and take office within thirty (30) days of the enactment of this 36 act, and the appointments to the bureau and the initial terms of 37 the appointments shall be as follows:

38 (a) Two (2) hotel/motel members representing hotel or motel properties located within the city limits of Jackson, 39 40 Mississippi appointed by the Mayor with confirmation by the Council for terms of two (2) and four (4) years, respectively. 41 These members and their successors shall be appointed by the Mayor 42 with confirmation by the Council after being selected from a panel 43 44 of two (2) names for each membership position submitted by the 45 Jackson Chapter of the Mississippi Restaurant Association.

(b) Two (2) restaurant members appointed by the Mayor with confirmation by the Council for terms of two (2) and four (4) years, respectively. These members and their successors shall be appointed by the Mayor with confirmation by the Council after being selected from a panel of two (2) names for each membership position submitted by the Jackson Chapter of the Mississippi Restaurant Association.

One (1) member representing the business community 53 (C) 54 in the City of Jackson appointed by the Mayor with confirmation by 55 the Council for a term of two (2) years. This member and his successors shall be appointed by the Mayor with confirmation by 56 57 the Council after being selected from a panel of two (2) names submitted by the Metro Jackson Chamber of Commerce. The names 58 59 submitted by the Metro Jackson Chamber of Commerce shall be those of persons who represent businesses located within the city limits 60 of Jackson, Mississippi. 61

(d) One (1) member representing the arts community in
the City of Jackson appointed by the Mayor with confirmation by
the Council for a term of two (2) years.

(e) One (1) member representing the education community
in the City of Jackson appointed by the Mayor with confirmation by
the Council for a term of four (4) years.

(f) One (1) member representing the attractions
industry in the City of Jackson appointed by the Mayor with
confirmation by the Council for a term of two (2) years.

(g) One (1) at-large member appointed by the Mayor with
confirmation by the Council for a term of four (4) years.

73 (2) (a) All succeeding appointments shall be made for a 74 term of four (4) years from the date of expiration of the initial Any vacancy which may occur shall be filled by the 75 appointment. 76 mayor within ninety (90) days after such vacancy occurs in the same manner as the original appointment and shall be made for the 77 78 unexpired term. Each member of the bureau shall serve until his successor is appointed and qualified. 79

80 (b) No member of the bureau shall be an employee of the 81 City of Jackson or Hinds County. No member of the bureau shall be 82 an elected official.

83 (3) Any member may be disqualified and removed from office84 for any one (1) of the following reasons:

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(a) Conviction of a felony; or

86 (b) Failure to attend three (3) consecutive meetings87 without just cause; or

88 (c) Illegal use of a bureau motor vehicle as provided89 in Section 12 of this act.

90 If a member of the bureau is removed for one of the above 91 reasons, the vacancy shall be filled in the manner prescribed in 92 this section.

93 SECTION 4. Before entering upon the duties of the office, 94 each appointed member of the bureau shall enter into and give bond 95 to be approved by the Secretary of State of Mississippi in the sum 96 of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) conditioned upon the 97 faithful performance of his duties. Such bond shall be payable to

98 the State of Mississippi and, in the event of a breach thereof, 99 suit may be brought by the State of Mississippi for the benefit of 100 the bureau.

SECTION 5. When the members of the bureau shall have been 101 102 appointed and qualified as set forth herein, they shall establish 103 quarters and conduct a meeting after giving not less than ten (10) 104 days' notice of the time and place of such meeting by registered mail, postage prepaid, directed to each appointed member of the 105 106 bureau at his regular address given the Secretary of State at the 107 time of his qualification and posting bond. At such meeting a quorum shall consist of a majority of the members of the bureau 108 109 and a majority of those members attending shall elect a president 110 and secretary, both of whom shall be members of the bureau, and 111 adopt such rules and regulations as may govern the time and place for holding subsequent meetings, regular and special, and other 112 113 rules and regulations not inconsistent with the provisions of this 114 act.

The bureau is further authorized to contract for the employment of personnel, supplies, furnishings and other facilities necessary to administer the affairs and duties of the bureau and to pay for same out of the revenue provided by this act.

120 SECTION 6. The bureau shall have jurisdiction and authority 121 over all matters relating to the establishment, promotion and 122 development of tourism and conventions and related matters within 123 the City of Jackson, Mississippi.

The bureau is authorized to contract for the furnishing, equipping and operation of any and all facilities necessary or useful in the promotion of tourism and conventions, to receive and expend, subject to the provisions of this act, revenues from any source.

129 SECTION 7. (1) For the purpose of providing funds for the 130 promotion of tourism and conventions, there is hereby levied,

131 assessed and shall be collected from every person engaging in or 132 doing business in the City of Jackson, Mississippi, as specified 133 herein, a tax which may be cited as a "tourist and convention 134 tax," which shall be in addition to all other taxes now imposed, 135 as hereinafter provided.

136 (2) Such tax shall be one percent (1%) of the gross proceeds 137 of sales of restaurants, hotels and motels, including, but not 138 limited to, sales of beer and alcoholic beverages sold to be 139 consumed on the premises.

140 (3) Persons liable for the tax imposed herein shall add the 141 amount of tax to the sales price or gross proceeds of sales, and 142 in addition thereto shall collect, insofar as practicable, the 143 amount of the tax due by him from the person receiving the 144 services or goods at the time of payment therefor.

(4) Such tax shall be collected by and paid to the State Tax Commission on a form prescribed by the State Tax Commission, in the same manner that state sales taxes are computed, collected and paid; and the full enforcement provisions and all other provisions of Chapter 65, Title 27, Mississippi Code of 1972, shall apply as necessary to the implementation and administration of this act.

(5) The proceeds of such tax, less three percent (3%) thereof which shall be retained by the State Tax Commission to defray the cost of collection, shall be paid to the city on or before the fifteenth day of the month following the month in which collected by the State Tax Commission. The city, in turn, shall remit the funds to the bureau not later than ten (10) days after receiving the funds from the State Tax Commission.

158 (6) The proceeds of the tax shall not be considered by the 159 city as general fund revenues and shall be dedicated solely for 160 the purpose of carrying out programs and activities which are 161 designated by the Jackson Convention and Visitors Bureau and which 162 are designed to attract conventions and tourists into Jackson, 163 Mississippi.

164 (7) As a condition of the receipt of any funds provided by 165 the bureau for the support of any event, the person or 166 organization receiving such funds shall provide the bureau with a 167 written accounting of all expenditures of such funds. Such 168 accounting shall be made available to the public under the 169 provisions of the Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983.

SECTION 8. Before the taxes authorized by this act shall be imposed, the governing authorities of the City of Jackson shall adopt a resolution declaring its intention to levy the tax, setting forth the amount of such tax and establishing the date on which this tax initially shall be levied and collected. This date shall be not less than the first day of the second month from the date of adoption of the resolution.

177 The resolution shall be published in a local newspaper at least twice during the period from the adoption of the resolution 178 179 to the effective date of the taxation prescribed in this act, with 180 the last publication being made no later than ten (10) days prior to the effective date of such taxation. A certified copy of the 181 182 resolution shall be furnished to the State Tax Commission at least 183 thirty (30) days prior to the date on which the tax shall be 184 initially levied and collected.

SECTION 9. Before the expenditure of funds herein 185 186 prescribed, a budget reflecting the anticipated receipts and 187 expenditures for such purposes as promotion, advertising and operation, shall be approved by the bureau. The first budget of 188 189 receipts and expenditures shall cover the period beginning with 190 the effective date of the tax and ending with the end of the city's fiscal year, and thereafter the budget shall be on the same 191 192 fiscal basis as the budget of the City of Jackson.

193 SECTION 10. Accounting for receipts and expenditures of the 194 funds herein described shall be the responsibility of the bureau 195 and shall be made separately from the accounting of receipts and 196 expenditures of the general fund and any other funds of the

197 municipality to which it is originally paid. The records reflecting the receipts and expenditures of the funds prescribed 198 199 herein shall be audited annually by an independent certified public accountant, and such accountant shall make a written report 200 201 of his audit to the City Clerk of Jackson and to the bureau. The complete audit shall be made available by the bureau to any person 202 203 who requests a copy, under the provisions of Sections 25-61-1 204 through 25-61-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, also known as the "Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983." The audit shall be made 205 206 and completed as soon as practicable after the close of the fiscal 207 year, and the expenses of such audit may be paid from the funds 208 derived pursuant to Section 7 of this act. The State Auditor of 209 Public Accounts shall have the authority to conduct audits of the 210 bureau.

211 SECTION 11. The bureau shall not contract with any person 212 who is related to an employee of the bureau within the third 213 degree or who is the spouse of an employee of the bureau, nor shall the bureau contract with a business entity of which an 214 215 employee of the bureau is an officer, director, owner, partner or 216 employee, or is a holder of more than ten percent (10%) of the 217 fair market value, or from which an employee of the bureau or his 218 relative within the third degree derives more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) in annual income, or over which an employee of 219 220 the bureau or his relative within the third degree exercises 221 control.

SECTION 12. No motor vehicle owned or leased by the bureau shall be operated by any member or employee of the bureau except in the performance of his official duties directly related to the business of the bureau. Any violation of this prohibition may be punished by removal from office or employment.

227 SECTION 13. The bureau shall be subject to Sections 25-61-1 228 through 25-61-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, also known as the 229 "Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983."

230 SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from 231 and after its passage and shall stand repealed from and after July 232 1, 2004.
