SENATE BILL NO. 3125 (As Passed the Senate)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE 2 DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2000. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as 4 5 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to defray the 6 7 expenses of the Department of Finance and Administration for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999 and ending June 30, 2000..... 8 9 14,836,798.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 10 11 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 12 Treasury to the credit of the Department of Finance and Administration for the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred 13 14 in the operation of the various offices of the department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999 and ending June 30, 2000..... 15 16\$ 15,629,646.00. SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions 17 of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized: 18 19 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 20 Full Time. 358 Permanent: Part Time. 21 4 Time-Limited: Full Time. 2.2 0 23 Part Time. 0 24 Provided that a report based on expenditures incurred during 25 the current and immediate-past fiscal years shall be provided to each regularly scheduled legislative session. This report should 26

27 reflect expenditures as a result of the operation of the Robert E.
28 Lee Building, the Woolfolk State Office Building, the Gartin and
29 Sillers Buildings, the Capitol Buildings, the Central High School
30 Building, the 301 Building and other state buildings, and this
31 report should contain any steps taken to reduce operating costs.

32 It is also the intention of the Legislature that no
33 state-owned aircraft shall be utilized by any person except for
34 official business only.

SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 35 Section 2, the amount of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00), or 36 37 so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be expended for premium payments for flood insurance on state-owned facilities. However, 38 39 no such premium shall be paid until reviewed and approved by the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property Management. Said 40 41 payments are to be made from accrued interest earnings from loans under the Disaster Assistance Program. 42

SECTION 5. In addition to all other sums herein 43 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 44 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special 45 46 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Tort Claims Fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Tort Claims Board 47 48 in the administration of the Tort Claims Act for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 49\$ 11,104,004.00. 50 51 SECTION 6. With the funds appropriated under the provisions

52 of Section 5, the following positions are authorized:

58 SECTION 7. From the funds provided in this act, funds may be 59 expended for the following purposes, in compliance with the 60 policies established by the State Personnel Board and any 61 conditions placed on such expenditures:

62 (a) The components of the Variable Compensation Plan63 shall be maintained within the constraints of the funds

64 appropriated herein.

(b) Funds are provided to adjust the Variable
Compensation Plan, including realignment, to ensure that all
full-time employees with at least six (6) months of continuous
current service, as of June 30, 1999, receive an increase of One
Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). Funds are provided to
adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand
Dollars (\$1,000.00).

72 (C) If an employee is currently at or above the end 73 salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall be built into the employee's base salary. 74 To be eligible for any 75 increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the 76 77 effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above 78 79 during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase 80 effective the date of the rating.

It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.

Any transfers within each specific budget or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

93 SECTION 8. The Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property 94 Management of the Office of General Services is hereby expressly 95 authorized and empowered to receive, budget and expend any state, 96 local or other source funds designated for supplemental funding of

97 construction and/or repairs and renovation projects.

98 SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the 99 following amounts are authorized to be spent out of the Statewide 100 Cost Allocation Fund No. 3143 by the Department of Finance and 101 Administration:

102 (a) One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00)103 for the purpose of defraying computer expenses.

(b) Five Hundred Sixty Thousand Eight Hundred
Thirty-nine Dollars (\$560,839.00) for the purpose of defraying the
cost of the acquisition, development and implementation of the
Statewide Automated Accounting System.

108 (c) One Hundred Fifty-three Thousand Four Hundred
109 Dollars (\$153,400.00) for an imaging/electronic processing
110 feasibility study and initial phase of implementation.

111 SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Two 112 Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$275,000.00) is authorized 113 to be spent out of the Local Disaster Loan Fund No. 3144 by the 114 Department of Finance and Administration for the purpose of 115 defraying the cost of the Air Transport Services.

SECTION 11. The Office of Capitol Facilities, Department of 116 117 Finance and Administration, is hereby expressly authorized and empowered to receive funds from state agencies for the rent of 118 119 office space in the Eldon Bolton Office Building in Biloxi, 120 Mississippi, and the State Service Center in Hattiesburg, Mississippi. The Office of Capitol Facilities is further 121 122 authorized and empowered to budget and expend any such funds 123 received to operate and maintain, and up to Five Dollars (\$5.00) per square foot of rental receipts to finish tenant space, in the 124 125 Eldon Bolton Office Building in Biloxi, Mississippi, and the State Service Center in Hattiesburg, Mississippi, as state office 126 127 buildings. Monies received for rent of such office space are to be deposited in a special fund in the State Treasury. Any funds 128 129 on hand at the end of the fiscal year shall lapse into the State

130 General Fund.

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 131 SECTION 12. 132 Department of Finance and Administration shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 133 134 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 135 Year 1999. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 136 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2001 shall be 137 138 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 139 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2000 budget request process. 140

141 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that 142 positions currently assigned to the Department of Information Technology Services for operation of the Mississippi Management 143 and Reporting System and paid by funds of the Department of 144 145 Finance and Administration be transferred to the Department of 146 Finance and Administration. The Executive Director of the Department of Information Technology Services and the Executive 147 148 Director of the Department of Finance and Administration are hereby authorized to effect such transfers as of July 1, 1999. 149 150 The Department of Finance and Administration is further authorized 151 to escalate the number of positions herein authorized up to but 152 not to exceed fifteen (15) positions for such transfers.

153 This is a transfer of positions with no funds involved. SECTION 14. In addition to all other sums herein 154 155 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 156 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of 157 158 Finance and Administration for the purpose of providing funds to 159 conduct and prepare a study to determine whether there is a 160 significant statistical disparity between the qualified minority contractors in the State of Mississippi and the number of minority 161 162 contractors actually engaged by the State of Mississippi or the

prime contractors of the state, for the fiscal year beginning 163 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000.....\$ 300,000.00. 164 SECTION 15. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 165 166 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 167 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 168 169 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 170 SECTION 16. This act shall take effect and be in force from 171 and after July 1, 1999. 172
