## SENATE BILL NO. 3135

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE AID OF THE PUBLIC 2 COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI FOR 3 FISCAL YEAR 2000. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 5 SECTION 1. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may 6 be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning 8 9 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... \$99,808,453.00. (2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 10 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 11 12 Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the 13 aid of public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 14 15 .....\$ 31,811,940.00. (3) The money appropriated by this act shall be apportioned 16 as follows: 17 The State Board for Community and Junior Colleges 18 (a) shall distribute to each of the public community and junior 19

20 colleges, out of any money appropriated from the State General Fund, the sum of Three Hundred Sixty-four Thousand Twenty-two 21 22 Dollars (\$364,022.00) and out of any money appropriated from the Education Enhancement Fund, the sum of One Hundred Six Thousand 23 Six Hundred Ninety-seven Dollars (\$106,697.00). 24

25 (b) The remainder of the appropriation for public 26 community and junior colleges shall be distributed in twelve (12)

27 monthly installments beginning July 25, 1999, on the basis of the 28 number of full-time academic and technical public community and junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the 29 30 last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent 31 of the preceding year counting only those students who reside 32 within the State of Mississippi. Provided, however, that technical students shall be weighted at 1.19 times that of 33 34 academic students.

The Director of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall visit each public community and junior college and shall determine, on the basis of an audit of students, who shall be counted in each college and shall certify the number to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.

If, pending determination of the full-time academic 40 enrollment of students at the public community and junior colleges 41 entitled to participate in this appropriation, as provided for in 42 this subsection, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges 43 44 shall find and determine that any such public or community junior college does not have sufficient funds on hand for payment of the 45 46 necessary expenses of its operation for the period commencing 47 July 1, 1999, until distribution of the funds appropriated hereby, 48 then, in that event, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges is expressly authorized to make an advance to any such 49 50 public community or junior college or colleges not having 51 sufficient operating funds for such period from the funds 52 appropriated hereby; provided, however, that the amount of any 53 such advance to any one public community or junior college shall not exceed thirty-three percent (33%) of the amount of state 54 appropriated funds received by such public community or junior 55 56 college during the preceding fiscal year; and provided, further, that the amount of any such advance shall be deducted from the pro 57 58 rata part of the funds appropriated hereby accruing to said public community or junior college when enrollment has been ascertained 59 60 and distribution of funds is made.

61 (4) No part of the amount herein appropriated shall be used
62 by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for
63 administrative or other purposes except in the manner and to the

64 extent authorized in the act making an appropriation for the expenses of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges. 65 66 SECTION 2. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the 67 68 State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support, 69 maintenance and equipping of vocational-technical departments in 70 the public community and junior colleges which meet the requirements for vocational-technical education departments for 71 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 72 73 2000....\$ 2,963,974.00. 74 The following sum, or so much thereof as may be (2) 75 necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the 76 Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the 77 support, maintenance and equipping of vocational-technical departments in the public community and junior colleges which meet 78 79 the requirements for vocational-technical education departments 80 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending 81 June 30, 2000..... \$ 949,103.00. 82 Such departments shall be open to students enrolled in (3) 83 the institutions, and to other students who may qualify for such 84 courses, and to those meeting requirements for either civilian or

85 veteran rehabilitation, whether or not enrolled in such 86 institutions as regular students.

87 (4) Such funds shall be disbursed to such public community 88 and junior colleges on the basis of the full-time vocational 89 enrollment of each such public community and junior college as of 90 the last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its 91 equivalent of the preceding year, counting only students who 92 reside within the State of Mississippi.

93 (5) No part of the funds hereby appropriated shall be spent94 for building or for regular academic instruction.

95 (6) The funds disbursed under the provisions of this act96 shall be accounted for through the State Board for Community and

97 Junior Colleges.

SECTION 3. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may 98 99 be necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the 100 State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support of 101 part-time academic credit courses operated by public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and 102 103 ending June 30, 2000..... \$ 14,172,048.00. 104 (2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 105 necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the 106 Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the 107 support of part-time academic credit courses operated by public 108 community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... \$ 4,538,072.00. 109 (3) These funds shall be disbursed by the State Board for 110 Community and Junior Colleges to such public community and junior 111 112 colleges as may qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time 113 equivalency of part-time and summer academic students, counting only students who reside within the State of Mississippi. 114 115 SECTION 4. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 116 117 General Fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for 118 Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of paying for nursing faculty supplement, in accordance with Section 37-129-1 et 119 120 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, and aid to nursing education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000 121 .....\$ 5,949,603.00. 122 123 (2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the 124 125 Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of 126 127 paying for nursing faculty supplement, in accordance with Section 37-129-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, and aid to nursing 128 129 education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending

130 June 30, 2000..... \$ 1,905,139.00.

SECTION 5. The following public community and junior colleges which qualify shall participate in the funds provided by Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of this act:

134 Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln Community College, 135 East Central Community College, East Mississippi Community College, Hinds Community College District, Holmes Community 136 137 College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior College, Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta Community College, 138 139 Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College District, Northeast Mississippi Community College, Northwest Mississippi Community 140 141 College, Pearl River Community College, and Southwest Mississippi 142 Community College.

143 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 144 of the General Funds appropriated herein shall be expended for the 145 purpose of paying salaries, wages, and fringe benefits of any 146 public community and junior college employee who is serving as a 147 member of the State of Mississippi Legislature.

148 SECTION 7. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 149 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 150 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated to the State 151 Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of hiring nursing and allied health teachers, awarding interest free nursing 152 153 and allied health student loans and providing instructional support for the Rural Health Corps for the fiscal year beginning 154 155 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000 . . . . . . \$ 1,200,000.00. 156 Of the funds appropriated in this section, One Million Two 157 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,200,000.00) shall be derived from 158 Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972. 159

160 The funds appropriated in this section shall be allocated as 161 follows:

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(1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen (15)

163 public community and junior colleges.

164 (2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of 165 full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and 166 junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the 167 last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent 168 of the preceding year counting only those students who reside 169 within the State of Mississippi.

The public community and junior colleges shall prepare and make available to the Legislature and the Legislative Budget Office an accounting of expenditures and program accomplishments of the Rural Health Corps Program for each of the individual community and junior colleges in a format and manner prescribed by the Legislative Budget Office.

176 SECTION 8. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 177 178 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid of the public 179 community and junior colleges, to fund health insurance, through the Public School Employees' Health Insurance Plan for all 180 181 employees of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 182 9,173,736.00. 183 

The funds allocated in this section shall only be used to participate in the Public School Employees' Health Insurance Plan and not for participation in any other type of health insurance plan. Any funds appropriated in these sections which are not expended during the fiscal year shall be carried forward for the same purposes during the next succeeding fiscal year.

190 SECTION 9. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 191 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 192 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the 193 purpose of establishing and operating One-Stop Career Centers at 194 each of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal 195 year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000.....

196 ..... \$ 4,500,000.00.

197 The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from 198 the Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section 199 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.

200 SECTION 10. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 201 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 202 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the 203 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of 204 defraying the cost of Sign Language Interpreter Training at the 205 public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... \$ 179,050.00. 206 207 The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from the Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section 208 209 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 11. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of the Education Technology Program at the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... \$ 3,599,160.00.

217 SECTION 12. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 218 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 219 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the cost of the Education Technology Program 220 221 at the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 222 223 .....\$ 1,500,000.00. 224 The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from 225 the Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section 27-

226 103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.

227 SECTION 13. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 228 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the

Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of servicing the debt on bonds issued for the Education Technology Program at the community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending

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 June 30, 2000
 \$ 3,148,050.00.

The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 14. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of making capital improvements to the grounds and facilities of the community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000...... \$ 1,500,000.00.

The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section 247 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.

248 The funds appropriated in this section shall be allocated as 249 follows:

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(1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen

251 (15) public community and junior colleges.

(2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent of the preceding year counting only those students who reside within the State of Mississippi.

258 SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 259 of this act, it is the intention of the Legislature that the 260 amount of Eleven Million Three Hundred Seventy-seven Thousand Two 261 Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$11,377,280.00) shall be used to award

salary increases for faculty of the public community and junior colleges and the amount of Eight Million Nine Hundred Thirty-nine Thousand Two Hundred Ninety-two Dollars (\$8,939,292.00) shall be used to award salary increases for non-faculty staff.

266 SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 (2), 267 2 (2), 3 (2), and 4 (2), Twenty-seven Million Three Hundred Seventeen Thousand Six Hundred Forty-six Dollars (\$27,317,646.00) 268 269 shall be derived from Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 270 271 1972 and Eleven Million Eight Hundred Eighty-six Thousand Six Hundred Eight Dollars (\$11,886,608.00) shall be derived from 272 273 Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section 274 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 17. Should revenues generated and deposited to the 275 Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203 (1), 276 277 Mississippi Code of 1972, and apportioned pursuant to Section 278 37-61-33 (6), Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds appropriated herein from said source, the State Board for 279 280 Community and Junior Colleges shall notify the Department of 281 Finance and Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced 282 to insure that expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.

SECTION 18. A Mississippi Prepaid Affordable College Tuition (MPACT) program beneficiary shall be considered a Mississippi resident for the purposes of participating in this appropriation regardless of the beneficiary's residence on the date of enrollment, as set out in Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 37-155-5(d)(iii).

SECTION 19. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted

The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 331 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 332 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for 333 Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the 334 cost of the Golden Triangle Education Center for Manufacturing 335 Technology, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending 336 June 30, 2000...... \$ 100,000.00.

337 SECTION 21. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 338 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 339 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 340 341 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 342 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 343 SECTION 22. This act shall take effect and be in force from 344 and after July 1, 1999.
