1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE AID OF THE PUBLIC COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI FOR FISCAL YEAR 2000.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may
6	be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid of the public
8	community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning
9	July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000 \$97,279,172.00.
10	(2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
11	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
12	Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the
13	aid of public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year
14	beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000
15	\$ 34,570,727.00.
16	(3) The money appropriated by this act shall be apportioned
17	as follows:
18	(a) The State Board for Community and Junior Colleges
19	shall distribute to each of the public community and junior
20	colleges, out of any money appropriated from the State General
21	Fund, the sum of Three Hundred Sixty-four Thousand Twenty-two
22	Dollars (\$364,022.00) and out of any money appropriated from the
23	Education Enhancement Fund, the sum of One Hundred Six Thousand
24	Six Hundred Ninety-seven Dollars (\$106,697.00).
25	(b) The remainder of the appropriation for public
26	community and junior colleges shall be distributed in twelve (12)

27 monthly installments beginning July 25, 1999, on the basis of the

28 number of full-time academic and technical public community and

- 29 junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the
- 30 last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent
- 31 of the preceding year counting only those students who reside
- 32 within the State of Mississippi. Provided, however, that
- 33 technical students shall be weighted at 1.19 times that of
- 34 academic students.
- 35 The Director of the State Board for Community and Junior
- 36 Colleges shall visit each public community and junior college and
- 37 shall determine, on the basis of an audit of students, who shall
- 38 be counted in each college and shall certify the number to the
- 39 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.
- If, pending determination of the full-time academic
- 41 enrollment of students at the public community and junior colleges
- 42 entitled to participate in this appropriation, as provided for in
- 43 this subsection, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges
- 44 shall find and determine that any such public or community junior
- 45 college does not have sufficient funds on hand for payment of the
- 46 necessary expenses of its operation for the period commencing
- 47 July 1, 1999, until distribution of the funds appropriated hereby,
- 48 then, in that event, the State Board for Community and Junior
- 49 Colleges is expressly authorized to make an advance to any such
- 50 public community or junior college or colleges not having
- 51 sufficient operating funds for such period from the funds
- 52 appropriated hereby; provided, however, that the amount of any
- 53 such advance to any one public community or junior college shall
- 54 not exceed thirty-three percent (33%) of the amount of state
- 55 appropriated funds received by such public community or junior
- 56 college during the preceding fiscal year; and provided, further,
- 57 that the amount of any such advance shall be deducted from the pro
- 58 rata part of the funds appropriated hereby accruing to said public
- 59 community or junior college when enrollment has been ascertained
- 60 and distribution of funds is made.
- 61 (4) No part of the amount herein appropriated shall be used
- 62 by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for
- 63 administrative or other purposes except in the manner and to the

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64 extent authorized in the act making an appropriation for the
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- 65 expenses of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.
- SECTION 2. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may
- 67 be necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the
- 68 State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support,
- 69 maintenance and equipping of vocational-technical departments in
- 70 the public community and junior colleges which meet the
- 71 requirements for vocational-technical education departments for
- 72 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30,
- 73 2000.....\$ 2,884,516.00.
- 74 (2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 75 necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the
- 76 Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the
- 77 support, maintenance and equipping of vocational-technical
- 78 departments in the public community and junior colleges which meet
- 79 the requirements for vocational-technical education departments
- 80 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending
- 81 June 30, 2000......\$ 1,035,771.00.
- 82 (3) Such departments shall be open to students enrolled in
- 83 the institutions, and to other students who may qualify for such
- 84 courses, and to those meeting requirements for either civilian or
- 85 veteran rehabilitation, whether or not enrolled in such
- 86 institutions as regular students.
- 87 (4) Such funds shall be disbursed to such public community
- 88 and junior colleges on the basis of the full-time vocational
- 89 enrollment of each such public community and junior college as of
- 90 the last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its
- 91 equivalent of the preceding year, counting only students who
- 92 reside within the State of Mississippi.
- 93 (5) No part of the funds hereby appropriated shall be spent
- 94 for building or for regular academic instruction.
- 95 (6) The funds disbursed under the provisions of this act
- 96 shall be accounted for through the State Board for Community and

97 Junior Colleges.

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- (2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the support of part-time academic credit courses operated by public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000......\$ 4,952,470.00.
- 110 (3) These funds shall be disbursed by the State Board for
 111 Community and Junior Colleges to such public community and junior
 112 colleges as may qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time
 113 equivalency of part-time and summer academic students, counting
 114 only students who reside within the State of Mississippi.
- 115 SECTION 4. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 116 117 General Fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for 118 Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of paying for nursing faculty supplement, in accordance with Section 37-129-1 et 119 120 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, and aid to nursing education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000 121 122\$ 5,790,106.00.
 - (2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of paying for nursing faculty supplement, in accordance with Section 37-129-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, and aid to nursing education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending

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130 June 30, 2000......$ 2,079,109.00.
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- 131 SECTION 5. The following public community and junior
- 132 colleges which qualify shall participate in the funds provided by
- 133 Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of this act:
- 134 Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln Community College,
- 135 East Central Community College, East Mississippi Community
- 136 College, Hinds Community College District, Holmes Community
- 137 College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior College,
- 138 Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta Community College,
- 139 Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College District, Northeast
- 140 Mississippi Community College, Northwest Mississippi Community
- 141 College, Pearl River Community College, and Southwest Mississippi
- 142 Community College.
- 143 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that none
- 144 of the General Funds appropriated herein shall be expended for the
- 145 purpose of paying salaries, wages, and fringe benefits of any
- 146 public community and junior college employee who is serving as a
- 147 member of the State of Mississippi Legislature.
- 148 SECTION 7. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 149 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
- 150 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated to the State
- 151 Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of hiring
- 152 nursing and allied health teachers, awarding interest free nursing
- 153 and allied health student loans and providing instructional
- 154 support for the Rural Health Corps for the fiscal year beginning
- 155 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000 \$ 1,200,000.00.
- Of the funds appropriated in this section, One Million Two
- 157 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,200,000.00) shall be derived from
- 158 Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section
- 159 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
- The funds appropriated in this section shall be allocated as
- 161 follows:
- 162 (1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen (15)

- 163 public community and junior colleges.
- 164 (2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of
- 165 full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and
- 166 junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the
- 167 last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent
- 168 of the preceding year counting only those students who reside
- 169 within the State of Mississippi.
- The public community and junior colleges shall prepare and
- 171 make available to the Legislature and the Legislative Budget
- 172 Office an accounting of expenditures and program accomplishments
- 173 of the Rural Health Corps Program for each of the individual
- 174 community and junior colleges in a format and manner prescribed by
- 175 the Legislative Budget Office.
- SECTION 8. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 177 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
- 178 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid of the public
- 179 community and junior colleges, to fund life and health insurance,
- 180 for all employees of the public community and junior colleges for
- 181 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000.
- 182\$ 9,836,976.00.
- The funds allocated in this section shall only be used to
- 184 participate in the State and School Employees' Life and Health
- 185 Insurance Plan. Any funds appropriated in these sections which
- 186 are not expended during the fiscal year shall be carried forward
- 187 for the same purposes during the next succeeding fiscal year.
- 188 SECTION 9. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 189 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
- 190 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the
- 191 purpose of establishing and operating One-Stop Career Centers at
- 192 each of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal
- 193 year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000......
- 194\$ 4,500,000.00.
- 195 The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from

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196 the Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section
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- 197 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 198 SECTION 10. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 199 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
- 200 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
- 201 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of
- 202 defraying the cost of Sign Language Interpreter Training at the
- 203 public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning
- 204 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000...... \$ 179,050.00.
- The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from
- 206 the Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section
- 207 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 208 SECTION 11. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 209 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
- 210 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for
- 211 Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the
- 212 cost of the Education Technology Program at the public community
- 213 and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999,
- 214 and ending June 30, 2000......\$ 3,599,160.00.
- 215 SECTION 12. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 216 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
- 217 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the
- 218 purpose of defraying the cost of the Education Technology Program
- 219 at the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year
- 220 beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000......
- 221\$ 1,500,000.00.
- The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from
- 223 the Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section 27-
- 224 103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 225 SECTION 13. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 226 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
- 227 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
- 228 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of

- 229 defraying the cost of servicing the debt on bonds issued for the
- 230 Education Technology Program at the community and junior colleges
- 231 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending
- 232 June 30, 2000.....\$ 3,148,050.00.
- The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from
- 234 Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section
- 235 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
- SECTION 14. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 237 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
- 238 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
- 239 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of
- 240 making capital improvements to the grounds and facilities of the
- 241 community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning
- 242 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000.....\$ 1,500,000.00.
- 243 The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from
- 244 Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section
- 245 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
- The funds appropriated in this section shall be allocated as
- 247 follows:
- 248 (1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen
- 249 (15) public community and junior colleges.
- 250 (2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of
- 251 full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and
- 252 junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the
- 253 last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent
- 254 of the preceding year counting only those students who reside
- 255 within the State of Mississippi.
- 256 SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- 257 of this act, it is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 258 amount of Nine Million Fifty-six Thousand Five Hundred Forty-one
- 259 Dollars (\$9,056,541.00) shall be used to award salary increases
- 260 for faculty of the public comunity and junior colleges and the
- 261 amount of Seven Million One Hundred Fifteen Thousand Eight Hundred

- 262 Fifty-three Dollars (\$7,115,853.00) shall be used to award salary
- 263 increases for non-faculty staff.
- SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 (2),
- 265 2 (2), 3 (2), and 4 (2), Twenty-eight Million Five Hundred Twenty-
- 266 three Thousand Three Hundred Seventy-three Dollars
- 267 (\$28,523,373.00) shall be derived from Education Enhancement Funds
- 268 deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi
- 269 Code of 1972 and Fourteen Million One Hundred Fourteen Thousand
- 270 Seven Hundred Four Dollars (\$14,114,704.00) shall be derived from
- 271 Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section
- 272 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 273 SECTION 17. Should revenues generated and deposited to the
- 274 Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203 (1),
- 275 Mississippi Code of 1972, and apportioned pursuant to Section
- 277 appropriated herein from said source, the State Board for
- 278 Community and Junior Colleges shall notify the Department of
- 279 Finance and Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced
- 280 to insure that expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.
- 281 SECTION 18. A Mississippi Prepaid Affordable College Tuition
- 282 (MPACT) program beneficiary shall be considered a Mississippi
- 283 resident for the purposes of participating in this appropriation
- 284 regardless of the beneficiary's residence on the date of
- 285 enrollment, as set out in Mississippi Code Annotated, Section
- 286 37-155-5(d)(iii).
- SECTION 19. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 288 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 289 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 290 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 291 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
- 292 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
- 293 performance measures provided below:

328	SECTION 20. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
329	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
330	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for
331	Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the
332	cost of the Golden Triangle Education Center for Manufacturing
333	Technology, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending
334	June 30, 2000\$ 100,000.00.
335	SECTION 21. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
336	necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the
337	Education Enhancement Fund No. 4302 in the State Treasury to the
338	credit of the Public Community and Junior Colleges, for the fiscal
339	year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000
340	\$ 750,000.00.
341	SECTION 22. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
342	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
343	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
344	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
345	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
346	proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
347	SECTION 23. This act shall take effect and be in force from
348	and after July 1, 1999.
