## SENATE BILL NO. 3137 (As Passed the Senate)

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF 1 2 STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING FOR THE SUPPORT AND 3 MAINTENANCE OF STUDENT FINANCIAL AID AND THE MISSISSIPPI POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE BOARD, FOR FISCAL 5 YEAR 2000. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 9 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning: (1) for the Omnibus 10 Loan or Scholarship Act of 1991, in accordance with Section 11 37-143-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972; (2) to defray the 12 13 expenses incurred by the State of Mississippi in accordance with 14 the terms of contracts between the State of Mississippi and the Southern Regional Education Board under the Southern Regional 15 16 Education Program, in accordance with Section 37-135-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972; (3) to provide instruction in graduate 17 and professional schools in institutions outside the state for 18 qualified students who are residents of Mississippi when such 19 instruction is not available for them in the regularly supported 20 21 Mississippi institutions of higher learning, in accordance with Section 37-101-221, Mississippi Code of 1972; (4) for the 2.2 23 Post-Secondary Education Assistance Fund, for the purpose of providing loans to students in accordance with Section 37-106-1 et 2.4 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972; (5) for the purpose of reimbursing 25 institutions for scholarships granted under the provisions of 26 2.7 Section 37-107-1 (deceased or disabled law enforcement officers'

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and firemen's spouses children); (6) for the purpose of
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- 29 reimbursing institutions for scholarships granted under the
- 30 provisions of Section 37-108-1 (POW or MIA children); (7) for the
- 31 Public Management Graduate Intern Program, for the purpose of
- 32 providing a practical work experience in a specific state or local
- 33 agency and office, including offices of the Legislature, to
- 34 students in accordance with Section 37-110-1 et seq., Mississippi
- 35 Code of 1972; (8) for the support and maintenance of the
- 36 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Program and the
- 37 Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant Program; (9) for the support
- 38 and maintenance of the Higher Education Legislative Plan; and (10)
- 39 for the support and maintenance of the Department of Student
- 40 Financial Aid, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and
- 41 ending June 30, 2000.....\$ 25,011,783.00.
- 42 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 43 necessary, is hereby authorized out of the proceeds derived from
- 44 any federal funds, research grants, donations, fees, or other
- 45 special source funds which are collected by or otherwise become
- 46 available, for: (1) the Consolidated Revolving Loan Fund, in
- 47 accordance with Section 37-143-19, Mississippi Code of 1972; (2)
- 48 the expenses incurred by the State of Mississippi in accordance
- 49 with the terms of contracts between the State of Mississippi and
- 50 the Southern Regional Education Board under the Southern Regional
- 51 Education Program; (3) the Post-Secondary Education Assistance
- 52 Fund, for the purpose of providing loans to students; (4) for the
- 53 Public Management Graduate Intern Program; and (5) for the support
- 54 and maintenance of the Department of Student Financial Aid, for
- 55 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending
- 56 June 30, 2000......\$ 6,669,680.00.
- 57 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in this act, not less
- 58 than Twenty Million Two Hundred Eighty-four Thousand Five Hundred
- 59 Dollars (\$20,284,500.00) shall be allocated for the support and
- 60 maintenance of the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant
- 61 Program, the Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant Program and the
- 62 Higher Education Legislative Plan.
- 63 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Four
- 64 Million Five Hundred Fifty-three Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-

- 65 seven Dollars (\$4,553,337.00) shall be derived from funds
- deposited pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of
- 67 1972.
- SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that of
- 69 the funds authorized for expenditure in Section 2, the amount of
- 70 Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) shall be used to defray the
- 71 costs of the Critical Teacher Shortage Scholarship Program.
- 72 SECTION 6. Any transfers or escalations shall be made in
- 73 accordance with the terms, conditions, and procedures established
- 74 by law.
- 75 Provided, however, that none of the funds apportioned in this
- 76 act for the Out-of-State Educational Program shall be paid to or
- 77 for the benefit of any student who enters a school outside the
- 78 State of Mississippi for the first time, subsequent to
- 79 July 1, 1982, in any discipline in the fields of medicine or
- 80 dentistry.
- 81 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that of
- 82 the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 1, the
- 83 Board of Trustees of the State Institutions of Higher Learning
- 84 shall expend from the support of the out-of-state graduate and
- 85 professional studies program an amount not exceeding the funding
- 86 necessary, contingent upon the availability of qualified
- 87 applicants, for ten (10) new entering optometry students and the
- 88 number of returning optometry students who received funding under
- 89 the program during the preceding school year; for ten (10) new
- 90 entering chiropractic students, with not more than twenty-five
- 91 (25) chiropractic students overall; and seven (7) new entering
- 92 osteopathic medical students and the number of returning
- 93 osteopathic medical students who received funding under the
- 94 program during the preceding school year, for these courses of
- 95 study.
- 96 SECTION 8. In the allocation of funds appropriated under the
- 97 provisions of Sections 1, 2 and 3 among the student financial aid

98 programs included herein, it is the intention of the Legislature

99 that priority shall be given and funds shall be first allocated to

- 100 all students eligible for financial aid under the provisions of
- 101 Sections 37-107-1 through 37-107-7 and Sections 37-108-1 through
- 102 37-108-5, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 103 SECTION 9. All funds provided for in this act shall be
- 104 accounted for in a detailed statement showing when, to whom, and
- 105 for what purpose applied, and this statement shall be submitted at
- 106 the next regular session of the Legislature within ten (10) days
- 107 after the convening thereof. A report of loans made and receipt
- 108 of repayment of loans to the fund shall be reported. The amount
- 109 of repayment that is in arrears shall also be included. Such
- 110 report shall include the number of students at each institution
- 111 receiving financial assistance and the amount of such assistance,
- 112 and an estimate of the financial requirement of the various loan
- 113 programs for the next year. No public or private institution of
- 114 higher learning receiving funds under the respective provisions of
- 115 this act, for the purpose of issuing scholarship grants or loans,
- 116 shall issue any official transcripts for any persons who have any
- 117 amount of repayment in arrears on that date such official
- 118 transcript is requested.
- 119 Furthermore, all funds received and expended shall be
- 120 reported and otherwise accounted for in accordance with the
- 121 provisions of Section 37-143-21, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 122 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 123 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2001 shall be submitted to
- 124 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 125 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 126 during the Fiscal Year 2000 budget request process.
- 127 SECTION 11. Any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and
- 128 paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be
- 129 in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of
- 130 Mississippi and Section 25-4-103, Mississippi Code of 1972.

131 SECTION 12. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 132 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 133 134 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 135 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 136 SECTION 13. This act shall take effect and be in force from 137 and after July 1, 1999. 138
