4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999 and ending June 30, 2000
LO	\$ 22,360,610.00.
L1	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L2	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
L3	source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available
L4	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi
L5	Cooperative Extension Service for the fiscal year beginning
L6	July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000
L7	\$ 14,062,779.00.
L8	SECTION 3. No general funds authorized to be expended herein
L9	shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds
20	which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions
21	of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
22	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
23	Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service provide programs in the
24	emphasis areas of Agriculture, Home Economics, 4-H, and Community
25	Resource Development in each county.
26	SECTION 5. No part of the funds appropriated or authorized
27	to be expended hereby shall be spent directly or indirectly for

- 28 payment of attorneys' fees for the services of any attorney who
- 29 was not employed by the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service
- 30 pursuant to the express authorization of the Board of Trustees of
- 31 Institutions of Higher Learning prior to performance of such legal
- 32 services.
- 33 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 34 agency's budget request for fiscal year 2001 shall be submitted to
- 35 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 36 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 37 during the fiscal year 2000 budget request process.
- 38 SECTION 7. It is the intent of the Legislature that if the
- 39 funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act are used directly or
- 40 indirectly to match or otherwise secure any federal grants,
- 41 research grants or donations, such special source funds not
- 42 classified as current restricted funds shall be added and
- 43 accounted for under Section 2 of this act. Further, it is the
- 44 intention of the Legislature that all such aforementioned special

- 104 the funds authorized for expenditures in Section 2, One Hundred
- 105 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) shall be allocated to defray

- 108 SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that of

- 129 SECTION 18 Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of

Section 1, One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be 130 allocated to defray the costs of a Production Economist at the 131 132 Delta Research and Extension Center at Stoneville, Mississippi. 133 SECTION 19. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 134 135 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 136 137 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 138 139 SECTION 20. This act shall take effect and be in force from 140 and after July 1, 1999.
