## SENATE BILL NO. 3155

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE 2 DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 3 2000.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 5 SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as б may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 7 State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to defray the expenses of the Department of Economic and Community Development 8 9 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending 10 June 30, 2000.....\$ 29,905,248.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 13 Treasury to the credit of the Department of Economic and Community Development or the appropriate special fund for the purpose of 14 defraying the expenses incurred in the operation of the various 15 divisions of the department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 16 1999 and ending June 30, 2000..... 17 \$ 121,960,819.00. 18 SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions 19 20 of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized: 21 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 2.2 Permanent: Full Time. . . . . . . . . 325 23 Part Time. . . . . . . . . 9 24 Time-Limited: Full Time. . . . . . . . 42 Part Time. . . . . . . . . 25 3 From the funds provided in this act, funds may be expended 26

27 for the following purposes, in compliance with the policies 28 established by the State Personnel Board and any conditions placed 29 on such expenditures:

30 (a) The components of the Variable Compensation Plan
31 shall be maintained within the constraints of the funds
32 appropriated herein.

(b) Funds are provided to adjust the Variable Compensation Plan, including realignment, to ensure that all full-time employees with at least six (6) months of continuous current service, as of June 30, 1999, receive an increase of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). Funds are provided to adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).

40 (C) If an employee is currently at or above the end salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall 41 42 be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any 43 increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a 44 current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently 45 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above 46 47 during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase effective the date of the rating. 48

It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

58 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the 59 amount of Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000.00) shall

the expenses of the Department of Economic and Community
Development in operating the state welcome centers.

63 SECTION 5. The acceptance and expenditure of funds, and 64 interest on such funds, received from, or by virtue of consent or 65 other orders of or agreements involving any agency, 66 instrumentality, or judicial tribunal of any state or the United

States for petroleum price compliance and allocation which may 67 68 become available during the fiscal year for the support of the 69 Department of Economic and Community Development or any programs sponsored under the terms of the receipt of these funds are hereby 70 71 authorized not to exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) and 72 approved, provided such receipts and expenditures are reported and otherwise accounted for in accordance with Section 27-103-101 et 73 seq., and Section 27-104-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972. 74

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Economic and Community Development is hereby authorized to escalate and expend funds from any source not to exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 82 SECTION 7. Department of Economic and Community Development shall maintain 83 complete accounting and personnel records related to the 84 85 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as 86 maintained for Fiscal Year 1999. It is further the intention of 87 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 88 89 2001 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee 90 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level 91 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2000 budget request 92 process.

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93 SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, the amount of Nine Million Two Hundred Thousand Dollars 94 95 (\$9,200,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is provided for the purpose of supporting Mississippi Tourism 96 97 Advertising and Promotion for Fiscal Year 2000. The expenditure of funds authorized in this section shall be exempt from Section 98 99 25-9-120, Mississippi Code of 1972. 100 SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, the

amount of Two Million Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,200,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is provided for the purpose of supporting, marketing, and facilitating Mississippi business growth for Fiscal Year 2000. The expenditure of funds authorized in this section shall be exempt from Section 25-9-120, Mississippi Code of 1972.

107 SECTION 10. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 108 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 109 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 110 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 111 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 112 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted

SECTION 13. This act shall take effect and be in force from 170 and after July 1, 1999. 171
