SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 516

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTIONS 99
2 AND 106, MISSISSIPPI CONSTITUTION OF 1890, TO REVISE THE
3 APPOINTMENT OF THE STATE LIBRARIAN; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF
5 MISSISSIPPI, TWO-THIRDS OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
6 CONCURRING THEREIN, WHICH TWO-THIRDS CONSISTS OF NOT LESS THAN A
7 MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE, That the following
8 amendments to the Mississippi Constitution of 1890 be submitted to
9 the qualified electors of the state for ratification or rejection
10 at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first
11 Monday of November 1999:

12 Amend Section 99, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
13 as follows:

14 Section 99. The Legislature shall not elect any other than
15 its own officers * * *.

16 Amend Section 106, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
17 as follows:

18 Section 106. There shall be a State Librarian, to serve at
19 the will and pleasure of the Supreme Court, whose duties and
20 compensation shall be as prescribed by law.

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State is hereby
22 directed to give public notice of an election in the manner and
23 for the time provided by Section 273 of the Constitution, and an
24 election is hereby called and fixed to be held on the first
25 Tuesday after the first Monday in November 1999, for the purpose
26 of submitting this and other amendments to the Constitution to

27 qualified electors of this state for approval or rejection, with
28 the amendments in this resolution being voted on as one amendment
29 since the proposed amendments pertain to one subject, such
30 election to be conducted and held as provided by law for statewide
31 general elections.

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of the amendment
33 for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed
34 constitutional amendment provides for the appointment of the State
35 Librarian by the Supreme Court rather than by the Legislature."
