SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 519
(As Adopted by Senate)

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING ALLISON
2 KELLOGG OF MADISON COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, UPON BEING SELECTED THE
3 1999 MISSISSIPPI JUNIOR MISS.

4 WHEREAS, Miss Allison Kellogg of Madison, Mississippi, has
5 been selected the 1999 Mississippi Junior Miss and will compete in
6 the national finals in Mobile, Alabama, in June 1999; and

7 WHEREAS, Allison is the first Mississippi Junior Miss winner
8 from Madison County in 23 years; and

9 WHEREAS, her high school honors and awards are quite
10 impressive, including the following: Who's Who Among American
11 High School Students; 1998 International Ballet Competition School
12 Full Scholarship; county and regional first place winner and
13 honorable mention at national level for the 1998 D.A.R. essay
14 contest; received all A's in Grade 10 with a present GPA of 4.17;
15 reporter for the Student Government Association; National Science
16 Merit Award in Grade 11; recipient of Mississippi Metropolitan
17 Ballet scholarship in Grades 9-11; cast as "Pretty Girl #1" in the
18 movie "My Dog Skip"; selected as a Page for the American Swedish
19 Business Conference; President of the Sister Cities Club;
20 Vice-President of the Bible Study Club; spiritual advisor for
21 Madison United Methodist Church Youth Group; French Club Reporter;
22 member of the Beta Honor Society; MCTA news anchor in Grade 11;
23 and member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes; and

24 WHEREAS, her community service activities include the
25 following: ballet class instructor for disadvantaged girls at the
26 Mississippi Metropolitan Ballet; dance performances for the Bond

27 Home, St. Catherine's Village and various churches; Habitat For
28 Humanity house project; American Diabetes Association fund-raiser;
29 served as host family for students from Sweden and Kyrgystan;
30 volunteer nursery work at Madison United Methodist Church; and
31 fund-raiser for needy children at the Swedish Sister Cities
32 Festival; and

33 WHEREAS, Allison will serve as 1999 Mississippi Junior Miss
34 for one year and is an excellent role model for the youth of our
35 state which are its future:
