- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE
- HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That there is hereby 4
- 5 created the Mississippi Commission on the Status of Women.
- commission shall be composed of thirteen (13) members to be 6
- 7 appointed as follows:
- (a) Five (5) members shall be appointed by the 8
- 9 Governor.
- 10 Five (5) members shall be appointed by the
- 11 Lieutenant Governor.
- 12 (c) Three (3) members shall be appointed by the
- Attorney General. 13
- The members of the commission shall be women and men of 14
- recognized ability and achievement who are representative of the 15
- 16 ethnic and cultural diversity of the population of this state.
- 17 Members shall serve for terms of four (4) years each, and no
- member may serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms. All 18
- 19 vacancies shall be filled by the appointing authority for the
- 20 unexpired term.
- The commission shall elect a chairman, vice-chairman and 21
- secretary from among its members for terms of two (2) years each, 2.2
- 23 and any member is eligible for successive elections to office.
- 24 A quorum for transacting business shall be a majority of the
- members of the commission. 25
- 26 Members of the commission shall be reimbursed for expenses as

- 27 provided in Section 25-3-41, Mississippi Code of 1972, and shall
- 28 receive per diem as provided in Section 25-3-69, Mississippi Code
- 29 of 1972.
- 30 The Lieutenant Governor and the Attorney General shall notify
- 31 the Governor after they have made their appointments, and the
- 32 Governor shall then designate a place and time for the initial,
- 33 organizational meeting of the commission.
- 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the commission shall have the
- 35 powers and authority necessary to carry out the duties imposed
- 36 upon it by this resolution, including, but not limited to, the
- 37 following:
- 38 (a) To employ such administrative, technical and other
- 39 personnel as may be necessary for the performance of its powers
- 40 and duties;
- 41 (b) To hold hearings, make and sign any agreements and
- 42 do or perform any acts which may be necessary, desirable or proper
- 43 to carry out the purposes of this resolution;
- 44 (c) To cooperate with any state agency, authority,
- 45 board, commission, department or institution to facilitate its
- 46 implementation of the powers and duties granted to the commission
- 47 in this resolution; and each such state agency, authority, board,
- 48 commission, department or institution shall cooperate with the
- 49 commission in the performance of its duties;
- 50 (d) To appoint advisers or advisory committees from
- 51 time to time when the commission determines that the experience or
- 52 expertise of such advisers or advisory committees is needed for
- 53 projects of the commission; and
- (e) To apply for and accept funds, grants, gifts and
- 55 services from the state, the government of the United States or
- 56 any of its agencies, or any other public or private source, for
- 57 the purpose of defraying clerical and administrative costs as may
- 58 be necessary in carrying out its duties under this resolution.
- 59 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the commission shall study the

- 60 following:
- 61 (a) Women's educational and employment problems, needs
- 62 and opportunities;
- (b) State laws in regard to the civil and political
- 64 rights of women, including pensions, tax requirements, property
- 65 rights, marriage and dissolution of marriage provisions, and
- 66 similar matters;
- 67 (c) The effect of social attitudes and pressures and
- 68 economic considerations in shaping the roles to be assumed by
- 69 women in the society; and
- 70 (d) Any laws, practices or conditions concerning or
- 71 affecting women which impose special limitations or burdens upon
- 72 them or upon society, or which limit or tend to limit
- 73 opportunities available to women.
- 74 The commission shall act as an information center on the
- 75 status of women and women's educational, employment and other
- 76 related needs.
- 77 The commission shall recommend, develop, prepare or
- 78 coordinate materials, projects or other activities and shall give
- 79 technical and consultative advice to public or private groups or
- 80 persons concerned with any of the following:
- 81 (a) Preventing or minimizing problems brought about by
- 82 the changing roles and responsibilities of women; and
- 83 (b) Developing programs to encourage and enable women
- 84 to be fully contributing members of society.
- The commission may encourage women's organizations and other
- 86 groups to institute local self-help activities designed to meet
- 87 women's educational, employment and related needs.
- 88 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the commission shall make a
- 89 report to the Legislature at the close of each fiscal year on its
- 90 activities, findings and recommendations.
