SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 547 (As Adopted by Senate)

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION TO MEMORIALIZE THE CONGRESS AND THE 1 2 PRESIDENT TO ENACT LEGISLATION THAT RECOGNIZES THE IMPORTANCE THAT 3 THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT MAINTAIN ITS COMMITMENT TO AMERICA'S 4 MILITARY RETIREES BY PROVIDING LIFETIME HEALTH CARE FOR MILITARY 5 RETIREES OVER THE AGE OF 65 YEARS, LEGISLATION TO REQUIRE OPENING THE FEDERAL EMPLOYEES HEALTH BENEFIT PROGRAM TO ELIGIBLE UNIFORMED 6 7 SERVICES BENEFICIARIES, AND ANY OTHER APPROPRIATE LEGISLATION THAT WOULD ADDRESS THE CONCERNS SET FORTH IN THE MEASURE. 8

9 WHEREAS, military retirees who have served honorably for 20 10 or more years constitute a significant part of the aging 11 population in the United States; and

12 WHEREAS, these retirees were encouraged to make the United 13 States Armed Forces a career, in part by the promise of lifetime 14 health care for themselves and their families; and

15 WHEREAS, prior to the age of 65 years, these retirees are 16 provided health services by the United States Department of 17 Defense's TRICARE Prime program, but those retirees who reach the 18 age of 65 years lose a significant portion of the promised health 19 care due to medicare eligibility; and

20 WHEREAS, many of these retirees are also unable to access 21 military treatment facilities for health care and life maintenance 22 medications because they live in areas where there are no military 23 treatment facilities, or where these facilities have downsized so 24 significantly that available space for care has become

25 nonexistent; and

26 WHEREAS, the loss of access to health care services provided 27 by the military has resulted in the government breaking its 28 promise of lifetime health care; and

29 WHEREAS, without continued affordable health care, including

S. C. R. No. 547 99\SS02\R775 PAGE 1 30 pharmaceuticals, these retirees have limited access to quality 31 health care, and significantly less care than other retired 32 federal civilians have under the Federal Employees Health Benefits 33 Program (FEHBP); and

34 WHEREAS, it is necessary to enact legislation that would 35 restore health care benefits equitable with those of other retired 36 federal workers; and

WHEREAS, several proposals to meet this requirement are 37 38 currently under consideration before the United States Congress, and the federal Department of Defense (DoD) and Department of 39 Health and Human Services (HHS). Of these proposals, the federal 40 government has already begun to establish demonstration projects 41 42 around the country to be conducted over the next three years, which would allow Medicare to reimburse DoD for the costs of 43 providing military retirees and their dependents health care. 44 45 This project would allow a limited number of Medicare-eligible beneficiaries to enroll in DoD's TRICARE Prime program and receive 46 47 all of their health care under that program:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MISSISSIPPI STATE
SENATE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That the
Legislature calls upon the United States government to maintain
its commitment to America's military retirees by providing
lifetime health care for military retirees over the age of 65
years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Legislature respectfully 54 55 memorializes the President and Congress of the United States to provide America's military retirees and their families with the 56 57 health care they were promised, by enacting comprehensive legislation that affords military retirees the ability to access 58 59 health care either through military treatment facilities or 60 through the military's network of health care providers, as well 61 as legislation to require opening the Federal Employees Health 62 Benefit Program (FEHBP) to those uniformed services beneficiaries

65 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Legislature respectfully 66 memorializes the President and the Congress of the United States 67 to enact any other appropriate legislation that would address the 68 concerns set forth in this measure.

69 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate 70 transmit copies of this resolution to the President and 71 Vice-President of the United States, the Speaker of the House of 72 Representatives, the Chairpersons of the House and Senate 73 Committees on Aging, and to each Senator and Representative from 74 Mississippi in the Congress of the United States.
