- 20 Affairs, in 1962, to her most recent account of the history of her
- 21 Natchez ancestors, <u>Truth: Four Stories I am Finally Old Enough to</u>
- 22 <u>Tell</u>, Ellen Douglas has used Mississippi towns as the settings for
- 23 her stories; and

- 25 published in England, Sweden, Germany and the Netherlands; and
