SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 592 (As Adopted by House and Senate)

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE 1 2 DECLARATION OF ARBROATH, THE SCOTTISH DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE. 3 WHEREAS, April 6 has a special significance for all 4 Americans, and especially those Americans of Scottish descent, 5 because the Declaration of Arbroath, the Scottish Declaration of Independence, was signed on April 6, 1320, and the American 6 7 Declaration of Independence was modeled on that inspirational 8 document; and

9 WHEREAS, the Declaration of Arbroath, the Scottish 10 Declaration of Independence in 1320, contains the lines "For we 11 fight not for glory, nor riches, nor honors, but for freedom 12 alone, which no man gives up except with his life," daring words 13 that will not lie quiet and will never be forgotten; and 14 WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi possesses a rich history 15 filled with the character and strength of a truly diverse

16 population, including many Scots and Scots-Irish; and

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi has 38 towns and cities with names appearing on the map of Scotland and 67 towns, cities, and counties with the names of Scottish families who came to America; and

21 WHEREAS, this resolution honors the major role that Scottish 22 Americans played in the founding of this nation, such as the fact 23 that almost half of the signers of the Declaration of Independence 24 were of Scottish descent, the Governors in 9 of the original 13 25 states were of Scottish ancestry, and Scottish Americans 26 successfully helped shape this country in its formative years and

WHEREAS, this resolution commends the more than 200 organizations throughout the United States that honor Scottish heritage, tradition and culture, representing the hundreds of thousands of Americans of Scottish descent, residing in every state, who already have made the observance of Tartan Day on April 6 a success:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
we do hereby commemorate the anniversary of the Declaration of
Arbroath, the Scottish Declaration of Independence.
