A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION TO DESIGNATE APRIL AS ALCOHOL 1 2 AWARENESS MONTH IN MISSISSIPPI AND INVITE ALL MISSISSIPPIANS TO 3 PARTICIPATE IN AN ALCOHOL-FREE WEEKEND APRIL 2-4, 1999. 4 WHEREAS, the month of April is hereby designated as Alcohol Awareness Month in Mississippi, and all Mississippians are invited 5 to participate in an Alcohol-Free Weekend April 2-4, 1999; and 6 7 WHEREAS, alcoholism is a chronic, progressive and potentially fatal disease characterized by tolerance and physical dependency 8 9 or pathological organ changes, or both, which are the direct or indirect consequences of the alcohol ingested; and 10 WHEREAS, underage drinking is the number one drug problem 11 12 among the nation's youth; and 13 WHEREAS, binge drinking in high school is strongly predictive of binge drinking in college; and 14 15 WHEREAS, binge drinking among high school seniors has steadily increased over the past five years; and 16 WHEREAS, binge drinking is defined as consuming five or more 17 drinks in a row at one sitting for boys, and four or more in a row 18 for girls; and 19 20 WHEREAS, binge drinking, which can lead to fatal injury and alcohol poisoning, is widely recognized as the most serious 21 22 problem facing college campuses today; and WHEREAS, 43% of college students say they are binge drinkers 23 and 21% say they binge frequently; and 24 WHEREAS, 80% of students who live on college campuses but who 25 26 do not binge drink report that they have experienced at least one
