A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION TO COMMEND THE LEE MIDDLE SCHOOL

- 2 ODYSSEY OF THE MIND PARTICIPANTS.
- 3 WHEREAS, to be successful in today's world, young people need
- 4 to develop problem-solving techniques; and
- 5 WHEREAS, one place students can learn this valuable skill, as
- 6 well as creativity and teamwork, is by participating in the
- 7 Odyssey of the Mind program; and
- 8 WHEREAS, this program focuses on the development of self
- 9 confidence, resourcefulness, leadership and risk taking, being the
- 10 largest worldwide creative problem-solving competition for
- 11 children; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Odyssey of the Mind is an international program that
- 13 challenges students to think both logically and creatively as they
- 14 work together in teams consisting of five to seven members; and
- 15 WHEREAS, the teams are allowed to choose between five
- 16 different "problems," which are newly created each year, in which
- 17 to compete; and
- 18 WHEREAS, nine teams from Lee Middle School competed in the
- 19 Regional Competition at Morton, Mississippi, on March 21, 1998,
- 20 out of which five teams qualified to participate in the State
- 21 Finals in Ridgeland, Mississippi, held on April 4, 1998; and
- 22 WHEREAS, an incredible three Lee Middle School teams took top
- 23 honors, going on to Walt Disney World in May to compete against
- 24 the 6,000 brightest and most creative young minds from 48 states,
- 25 the District of Columbia and 30 foreign countries at the World
- 26 Finals; and

- 27 WHEREAS, scoring for each team includes the judges'
- 28 evaluations of a team's solutions to one of the five problems,
- 29 each team's individual enhancement of the solution, and what is
- 30 called "spontaneous": a problem which is presented to the team on
- 31 the day of competition; and
- 32 WHEREAS, the culminating activity of the three-day
- 33 competition was the closing ceremony, where the top six teams were
- 34 recognized; and
- 35 WHEREAS, the "Marvelous Mentor" team, consisting of Kim
- 36 Caraig, Kerry Ellis, Lindsey Kempton, Richard Lancaster, Eileen
- 37 Tagdulang and Kristy Watkins, took first place by a margin of 38
- 38 points; and
- 39 WHEREAS, the other two teams that competed had solid
- 40 finishes: "Pageant Wagon," consisting of Brent Burge, Sarah
- 41 Conroy, Elizabeth Davidson, Justin Davis, Gaby McCallister, Bess
- 42 Pearson and Lauren Vanderpool, came in 13th, and "Create and
- 43 Animate, "consisting of J.B. Brewcyznski, Jack Catton, Adele
- 44 Champlin, Zach Foster, Stephanie LaBella, Jared Stork and Eric
- 45 Tipton, finished 17th; and
- WHEREAS, in the history of Mississippi's participation in
- 47 Odyssey of the Mind, only one other team has placed first:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 49 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 50 we do hereby commend and congratulate the Marvelous Mentors,
- 51 Pageant Wagon and Create and Animate Odyssey of the Mind teams of
- 52 Lee Middle School.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we do hereby commend each of the
- 54 student members of those teams and all of Lee Middle School for
- 55 providing an environment that fosters such creativity and
- 56 achievement, the school administration, all the teams' teacher and
- 57 parent coaches and supporters, and we encourage these students to
