A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AMY TUCK FOR HER DEDICATED 1 2 SERVICE AS SECRETARY OF THE MISSISSIPPI SENATE. 3 WHEREAS, Amy Tuck has announced her resignation as Secretary 4 of the Mississippi Senate in order to seek the Democratic 5 nomination for Lieutenant Governor; and WHEREAS, her resignation brings to a conclusion three years 6 7 of tireless service and commitment to the 52 Senators who serve in the Mississippi Senate; and 8 9 WHEREAS, in the Senate's top administrative job since January 1996, Amy Tuck has effectively supervised staff and overseen 10 11 day-to-day operations of the agency; and WHEREAS, prior to her appointment as Secretary of the Senate, 12 Amy Tuck served as a state Senator from 1991 to 1996, representing 13 14 the citizens of Choctaw, Montgomery, Oktibbeha and Webster 15 Counties; and 16 WHEREAS, Amy Tuck's tenure as a state Senator is noted by her appointment as Chairman of the County Affairs Committee 17 18 (1992-1996), and her earnest involvement in the passage of a bill 19 to establish a county bridge replacement and repair program; and WHEREAS, in 1995, Amy Tuck chose not to seek re-election as a 20 21 state Senator, opting instead to run for Secretary of State; and WHEREAS, during the February 4, 1999, Senators' reunion 2.2 23 ceremony, Amy Tuck was voted to receive the 1999 Senate 24 Distinguished Service Award by ballot of all present and former members of the Senate; and 25 WHEREAS, she is well known for her common sense, good nature 26
