9	counties responded to a call for help as the old Melroy Theater, a
10	familiar Taylorsville landmark which housed the May Appliance
11	Center, became engulfed in flames that destroyed the building; and
12	WHEREAS, with assistance from volunteer fire departments from
13	Taylorsville, Mize, Raleigh, Sylvarena, Richton, Shady Grove,
14	Pleasant Ridge, Powers, Soso, Myrick, Moselle, Mill Creek, Boggy
15	Creek, Northeast Jones, Sharon, Glade, Johnson, Mendenhall, Magee,
16	Collins, Hot Coffee, East Covington, Stringer and Bay Springs, the
17	Hebron Volunteer Fire Department battled the blaze until about
18	2:00 a.m. Monday, February 1, 1999; and
19	WHEREAS, according to official reports, flames had broken
20	through the roof of the building and blazed to a height of over 20
21	feet, threatening to quickly spread to other structures due to the

truck that Entergy had provided to prevent the fire from spreading

until help arrived, and it would have been worse if not for the

incredible response from other fire departments; and
