SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 644

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND COMMENDING THE JASPER COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT FOR THEIR QUICK RESPONSE TO THE 2 3 MASSIVE FIRE IN DOWNTOWN TAYLORSVILLE ON SUNDAY, JANUARY 31, 1999. 4 WHEREAS, a quick and massive response by the Jasper County 5 Sheriff's Department and by area volunteer fire departments on Sunday, January 31, 1999, prevented a building fire from 6 7 destroying downtown Taylorsville, Mississippi; and WHEREAS, more than 20 units from Smith and surrounding 8 9 counties responded to a call for help as the old Melroy Theater, a familiar Taylorsville landmark which housed the May Appliance 10 Center, became engulfed in flames that destroyed the building; and 11 12 WHEREAS, with assistance from volunteer fire departments from 13 Mize, Raleigh, Sylvarena, Richton, Shady Grove, Hebron, Pleasant Ridge, Powers, Soso, Myrick, Moselle, Mill Creek, Boggy Creek, 14 15 Northeast Jones, Sharon, Glade, Johnson, Mendenhall, Magee, Collins, Hot Coffee, East Covington, Stringer and Bay Springs, the 16 22-member Taylorsville Volunteer Fire Department battled the blaze 17 until about 2:00 a.m. Monday, February 1, 1999; and 18 WHEREAS, personnel from the Jasper County Police Department, 19 20 Smith County Sheriff's Department, Soso Police Department, Jones County Sheriff's Department and Mize County Sheriff's Department, 21 along with the Pine Belt Chapter of the American Red Cross and the 22 AMR Ambulance Service also responded to provide assistance, and 23 all are to be praised for their work; and 24 WHEREAS, according to official reports, flames had broken 25 26 through the roof of the building and blazed to a height of over 20

29 WHEREAS, firemen saturated the walls with water from a bucket 30 truck that Entergy had provided to prevent the fire from spreading 31 until help arrived, and it would have been worse if not for the 32 incredible response from other fire departments; and

33 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the hard 34 work and quick response of all these Mississippians who helped 35 their neighbor when they were most needed, by preventing a 36 building fire from destroying a Mississippi town:

37 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MISSISSIPPI STATE 38 SENATE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That we 39 do hereby recognize and commend the Jasper County Sheriff's 40 Department for their quick response to the massive fire in 41 downtown Taylorsville on Sunday, January 31, 1999, and express our 42 appreciation to all other units that assisted in this effort.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be presented to the Sheriff of Jasper County on behalf of all personnel responding to the fire, and that copies be made available to the Capitol Press Corps.
