SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 70
(As Adopted by Senate)

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE MISSISSIPPI
2 STATE HOSPITAL COMMUNITY SERVICES HOMELESS PROGRAM UPON ITS
3 RECEIPT OF THE GOVERNOR'S EXCELLENCE IN THE ARTS COMMUNITY ARTS
4 AWARD.

5 WHEREAS, since its inception, the Mississippi State Hospital
6 Community Services Homeless Program has successfully used creative
7 arts activities to encourage the homeless to utilize the medical
8 and counseling services available to them; and

9 WHEREAS, this program, also known as Stubbs House, has
10 provided excellent opportunities for esteem building and
11 empowerment through artistic expression; and

12 WHEREAS, mobile art and writing workshops, public exhibitions
13 of homeless art, and publication of selected pieces in a yearly
14 magazine aptly titled, "The Survivor," have increased public
15 awareness and heightened understanding toward this rapidly growing
16 segment of our society; and

17 WHEREAS, a national traveling exhibit called "Doorways:
18 Expressions from the Heart of America's Homeless," which began
19 touring in 1994, included works of art from the Stubbs House
20 workshops; and

21 WHEREAS, "Outreach Through Art" seminars were conducted by
22 the program last year for the Southeastern Regional Conference on
23 Homelessness and also for Women in Community Services in New
24 Orleans; and

25 WHEREAS, in October, workshop artists have been invited to
26 exhibit their work in Memphis in conjunction with National
27 Homeless Awareness Month; and

28 WHEREAS, it is with pride that we recognize one of our finest
29 state agencies for excellence in the arts:

30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
31 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend and congratulate the
32 Mississippi State Hospital Community Services Homeless Program
33 upon its receipt of the Governor's Awards for Excellence in the
34 Arts Community Arts Award.

35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
36 representatives of the program at the awards ceremony on March 19,
37 1999, and be made available to the Capitol Press Corps.
