## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 94

1 A RESOLUTION DECLARING EACH WEEK BEFORE CERTAIN HOLIDAYS TO 2 BE KNOWN AS "SAFE DRIVER AWARENESS WEEK."

3 WHEREAS, driver fatigue contributes significantly to the 4 traffic accidents that result in death and serious injury to 5 Mississippi motorists and pedestrians; and

6 WHEREAS, the National Highway Transportation Safety 7 Administration reports that driver fatigue is responsible for over 8 100,000 crashes per year which kill 1,500 people, injure 71,000 9 people and is the cause of a number of motor vehicle fatalities 10 annually in Mississippi; and

11 WHEREAS, drivers must perform a series of coordinated tasks 12 using their hands, feet, eyes, ears and body movements to drive 13 safely and defensively, and effective performance of such tasks 14 may be affected by fatigue; and

WHEREAS, driver fatigue and impairment is often caused by excessive driving and the foregoing of necessary sleep in order to make deadlines and schedules; and

WHEREAS, while the use of alcoholic beverages is frequently 18 19 blamed for automobile accidents, driver fatigue and impairment may often be caused or worsened by the use of substances other than 20 alcohol which may include herbal remedies, "designer drugs," and 21 sedating medications - both prescription and over-the-counter; and 22 23 WHEREAS, Citizens Against Drug Impaired Drivers reports that 24 of the approximately 43,000 annual motor fatalities in the United 25 States, 10,000 to 15,000 fatalities involve substances other than alcohol; and 26

S. R. No. 94 99\SS26\R1554 PAGE 1 27 WHEREAS, the law enforcement community of Mississippi is 28 united in its opposition to drivers' use of any substance to the 29 extent that it might impair driving performance; and

30 WHEREAS, Mississippi has enacted a law that imposes penalties 31 on drivers who have been identified as driving impaired as a 32 result of the improper use of sedating substances; and

33 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety, Division of Public 34 Safety Planning has been vigilant in its efforts to keep the 35 motoring public informed of the dangers of driving impaired as a 36 result of excessive fatigue or the use of sedating substances 37 other than alcohol, and should be commended for its efforts; and

38 WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper in the interest of public 39 safety, to periodically call special attention to the drivers of 40 Mississippi to the dangers of driving while fatigued, sedated or 41 otherwise impaired and the potential that various substances other 42 than alcohol, when consumed before driving a motor vehicle, may 43 impair a driver's ability to safely maneuver a motor vehicle:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MISSISSIPPI STATE
SENATE, That each week immediately preceding the driving holidays
of Memorial Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and New Year's Day is
hereby declared "Safe Driver Awareness Week" in the State of
Mississippi.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we urge all necessary actions be taken by the appropriate state agencies to publicize these special weeks and, within the limitations of their existing resources, to inform and educate the public throughout the year on the dangers of driving while fatigued or under the influence of any substance, whether alcoholic or nonalcoholic.
