3	WHEREAS, J. Kelley Williams, Chairman and Chief Executive
4	Officer of ChemFirst, Inc., in Jackson, Mississippi, was recently
5	selected for induction into the Mississippi Business Hall of Fame;

7	WHEREAS, J. Kelley Williams was chosen not only because of
8	his accomplishments in the business world, but also because of his
9	contributions to his community and state; and
10	WHEREAS, he joins other laureates who have been inducted into
11	the Mississippi Business Hall of Fame since its founding in 1989
12	by Junior Achievement of Mississippi and its co-sponsor, The
13	<u>Clarion-Ledger</u> ; and
14	WHEREAS, a 17-person selection committee, composed of
15	business leaders and educators from across the state, chose
16	Williams from over 100 nominations submitted statewide; and
17	WHEREAS, J. Kelley Williams, as head of ChemFirst, Inc.,

- 34 WHEREAS, J. Kelley Williams serves on the Mississippi

- 36 and a Georgia Tech advisory board, and is Chairman of the
