## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 110

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING MS. FAYE BARHAM ON  
2 BEING SELECTED AS THE RECIPIENT OF THE COWAN AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE  
3 IN THE TEACHING OF ENGLISH.

4 WHEREAS, Ms. Faye Barham, an English instructor at Hinds  
5 Community College at the Raymond Campus, was recently selected as  
6 the recipient of the Cowan Award for Excellence in the teaching of  
7 English by the Southeast Two-Year College English Association; and

8 WHEREAS, the Cowan Award for Excellence in the Teaching of  
9 English was endowed in 1981 to honor Gregory Cowan, an exceptional  
10 teacher who made significant contributions to the field of  
11 teaching through his example in the classroom, writing of  
12 textbooks and involvement in professional organizations; and

13 WHEREAS, the Cowan Award assesses excellence in four areas  
14 and Ms. Barham excels in each of these areas, including quality of  
15 instruction; development of curriculum materials; effective  
16 leadership in the department; and participation in workshops and  
17 conferences related to the teaching of English; and

18 WHEREAS, because of her outstanding leadership and  
19 accomplishments, Ms. Barham was selected as the 1998 Outstanding  
20 Instructor at Hinds Community College and as the 1999 Faculty  
21 Representative of the Associate Student Government; and

22 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Legislature to recognize and  
23 commend such outstanding teachers as Ms. Faye Barham, who has  
24 dedicated her career to teaching the young people of this state,  
25 who are its future:

26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF

27 MISSISSIPPI, That we do commend and congratulate Ms. Faye Barham  
28 for being selected as the recipient of the Cowan Award for  
29 Excellence in the Teaching of English and extend to her our  
30 heartiest wishes for success in all her future endeavors.
