

## REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

### MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H.B. No. 154: County prosecuting attorney; increase salary in certain counties.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

6 SECTION 1. Section 25-3-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is  
7 amended as follows:

8 25-3-9. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2) and (3)  
9 of this section, the county prosecuting attorney may receive for  
10 his services an annual salary to be paid by the board of  
11 supervisors as follows:

12 (a) For counties with a total population of more than  
13 two hundred thousand (200,000), a salary not to exceed  
14 Twenty-eight Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$28,500.00).

15 (b) For counties with a total population of more than  
16 one hundred thousand (100,000) and not more than two hundred  
17 thousand (200,000), a salary not to exceed Twenty-six Thousand  
18 Five Hundred Dollars (\$26,500.00).

19 (c) For counties with a total population of more than  
20 fifty thousand (50,000) and not more than one hundred thousand  
21 (100,000), a salary not to exceed Twenty-one Thousand Seven  
22 Hundred Dollars (\$21,700.00).

23 (d) For counties with a total population of more than  
24 thirty-five thousand (35,000) and not more than fifty thousand  
25 (50,000), a salary not to exceed Twenty Thousand Four Hundred  
26 Dollars (\$20,400.00).

27 (e) For counties with a total population of more than  
28 twenty-five thousand (25,000) and not more than thirty-five

29 thousand (35,000), a salary not to exceed Nineteen Thousand Three  
30 Hundred Dollars (\$19,300.00).

31 (f) For counties with a total population of more than  
32 fifteen thousand (15,000) and not more than twenty-five thousand  
33 (25,000), a salary not to exceed Seventeen Thousand Seven Hundred  
34 Dollars (\$17,700.00).

35 (g) For counties with a total population of more than  
36 ten thousand (10,000) and not more than fifteen thousand (15,000),  
37 a salary not to exceed Sixteen Thousand One Hundred Dollars  
38 (\$16,100.00).

39 (h) For counties with a total population of more than  
40 six thousand (6,000) and not more than ten thousand (10,000), a  
41 salary not to exceed Fourteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars  
42 (\$14,500.00).

43 (i) For counties with a total population of six  
44 thousand (6,000) or less, the board of supervisors, in its  
45 discretion, may appoint a county prosecuting attorney, and it may  
46 pay such county prosecuting attorney an annual salary not to  
47 exceed Twelve Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$12,900.00).

48 In all cases of conviction there shall be taxed against the  
49 convicted defendant, as an item of cost, the sum of Three Dollars  
50 (\$3.00), which shall be turned in to the county treasury as a part  
51 of the general county funds; however, the Three Dollars (\$3.00)  
52 shall not be taxed in any case in which it is not the specific  
53 duty of the county attorney to appear and prosecute.

54 From and after October 1, 1993, in addition to the salaries  
55 provided for in this subsection, the board of supervisors of any  
56 county, in its discretion, may pay the county prosecuting attorney  
57 an additional amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the  
58 maximum allowable salary prescribed herein.

59 (2) In the following counties, the county prosecuting  
60 attorney shall receive for his services an annual salary to be  
61 paid by the board of supervisors, as follows:

62 (a) In any county bordering upon the Mississippi River  
63 and having a population of not less than thirty thousand (30,000)

64 and not more than thirty-five thousand five hundred (35,500)  
65 according to the federal census of 1990, and in counties having a  
66 population of not more than thirty-seven thousand (37,000)  
67 according to the federal census of 1990 in which Interstate  
68 Highway 55 and U.S. Highway 98 intersect, the county prosecuting  
69 attorney shall receive a salary equal to the justice court judge  
70 of such county; and in any county wherein is located the state's  
71 oldest state-supported institution of higher learning and wherein  
72 Mississippi State Highways 7 and 6 intersect, the county  
73 prosecuting attorney shall receive an annual salary equal to that  
74 of a member of the board of supervisors of such county.

75 (b) In counties having a population in excess of fifty  
76 thousand (50,000) in the 1960 federal census, wherein is located a  
77 state-supported university and in which U.S. Highways 49 and 11  
78 intersect, the salary of the county prosecuting attorney shall be  
79 not less than Seventeen Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$17,400.00)  
80 per year. The Board of Supervisors of Forrest County,  
81 Mississippi, may, in its discretion, and by agreement with the  
82 county prosecuting attorney, employ the county prosecuting  
83 attorney as a full-time elected official during his/her term of  
84 office, designate additional duties and responsibilities of the  
85 office and pay additional compensation up to, but not in excess  
86 of, ninety percent (90%) of the annual compensation and salary of  
87 the county court judge and the youth court judge of Forrest County  
88 as authorized by law and provide a reasonable office and  
89 reasonable office expenses to the county prosecuting attorney.  
90 The salary authorized by this paragraph (b) for the county  
91 prosecuting attorney shall be the sole and complete salary for  
92 such prosecuting attorney in each county to which this paragraph  
93 applies, notwithstanding any other provision of law to the  
94 contrary.

95 (c) In any county wherein is housed the seat of State  
96 Government, wherein U.S. Highways 80 and 49 intersect, and having  
97 two (2) judicial districts, the annual salary of the county  
98 prosecuting attorney shall be no more than Thirty-three Thousand

99 Dollars (\$33,000.00).

100 (d) In any county which has two (2) judicial districts  
101 and wherein Highway 8 and Highway 15 intersect, having a  
102 population of greater than seventeen thousand (17,000), according  
103 to the 1980 federal decennial census, the board of supervisors  
104 shall pay the county prosecuting attorney a salary equal to that  
105 of a member of the board of supervisors of such county; provided  
106 that if such county prosecuting attorney is paid a sum for the  
107 purpose of defraying office or secretarial expenses, then the  
108 salary prescribed herein shall be reduced by that amount.

109 (e) In any county bordering the State of Tennessee and  
110 in which Mississippi Highways No. 4 and 15 intersect, and having a  
111 population of less than twenty thousand (20,000) in the 1970  
112 federal census, the salary of the county prosecuting attorney  
113 shall be no less than Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00).

114 (f) In any county having a population of more than  
115 twenty-five thousand (25,000) and in which U.S. Highways 72 and 45  
116 intersect, the salary of the county attorney shall be paid not  
117 less than Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00).

118 In addition, such county prosecuting attorney shall receive  
119 the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per month  
120 for the purpose of defraying secretarial expense.

121 (g) In any county wherein I-20 and State Highway 15  
122 intersect; and in any county wherein I-20 and State Highway 35  
123 intersect, the salary of the county prosecuting attorney shall be  
124 not less than Eight Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$8,400.00).

125 (h) In any Class 1 county bordering on the Mississippi  
126 River, lying in whole or in part within a levee district, wherein  
127 U.S. Highways 82 and 61 intersect, bounded by the Sunflower River  
128 and Stales Bayou, the salary of the county prosecuting attorney  
129 shall be Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) or a salary  
130 equal to that of a justice court judge in such county, whichever  
131 is greater. In addition, such county prosecuting attorney shall  
132 receive the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per month for  
133 the purpose of defraying secretarial expenses.

134           (i) In any county bordering on the Gulf of Mexico  
135 having two (2) judicial districts, and wherein U.S. Highways 90  
136 and 49 intersect, the salary of the county prosecuting attorney  
137 shall be not less than Nineteen Thousand Dollars (\$19,000.00) per  
138 year. The Board of Supervisors of Harrison County, Mississippi,  
139 may, in its discretion, and by agreement with the county  
140 prosecuting attorney, employ the county prosecuting attorney and  
141 his/her assistant during his/her term of office, and designate  
142 additional duties and responsibilities of the office and pay  
143 additional compensation up to, but not in excess of, ninety  
144 percent (90%) of the annual compensation and salary of the county  
145 court judges of Harrison County as authorized by law and provide  
146 adequate office space and reasonable office expenses to the county  
147 prosecuting attorney and his/her assistant. The salary authorized  
148 by this paragraph (i) for the county prosecuting attorney and  
149 his/her assistant shall be the sole and complete salary paid by  
150 the county for such prosecuting attorney and his/her assistant in  
151 each county to which this paragraph applies, notwithstanding any  
152 other provision of law to the contrary.

153           (j) In any county bordering on the State of Alabama,  
154 having a population in excess of seventy-five thousand (75,000)  
155 according to the 1980 decennial census in which is located an  
156 institution of higher learning and a United States military  
157 installation and which is traversed by an interstate highway, the  
158 salary of the county prosecuting attorney shall not be less than  
159 Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00) nor more than the amount of  
160 the annual salary received by a member of the board of supervisors  
161 of that county.

162           (k) In any county with a land area wherein Mississippi  
163 Highways 8 and 9 intersect, the salary of the county prosecuting  
164 attorney shall be not less than Eight Thousand Five Hundred  
165 Dollars (\$8,500.00) per year.

166           (l) In any Class 2 county wherein Mississippi Highways  
167 6 and 3 intersect, the salary of the county prosecuting attorney  
168 shall be not less than Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00) per

169 year nor more than the amount of the annual salary received by a  
170 member of the board of supervisors of that county.

171 (m) In any county wherein Interstate Highway 55 and  
172 State Highway 8 intersect, the salary of the county prosecuting  
173 attorney shall be not less than Twelve Thousand Dollars  
174 (\$12,000.00) per year.

175 (n) In any county wherein U.S. Highway 51 intersects  
176 Mississippi Highway 6, and having two (2) judicial districts, the  
177 salary of the county prosecuting attorney shall be not less than  
178 Three Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$3,600.00) per year.

179 (o) In any county bordering on the Alabama state line,  
180 having a population of greater than fifteen thousand (15,000)  
181 according to the 1970 federal decennial census, wherein U.S.  
182 Highway 45 and Mississippi Highway 18 intersect, the salary of the  
183 county prosecuting attorney shall be not less than Three Thousand  
184 Six Hundred Dollars (\$3,600.00) nor greater than that of a member  
185 of the board of supervisors of such county. All prior acts,  
186 orders and resolutions of the board of supervisors of such county  
187 which authorized the payment of the salary in conformity with the  
188 provisions of this paragraph, whether or not heretofore  
189 specifically authorized by law are hereby ratified, approved and  
190 confirmed.

191 (p) In any county wherein is located a state-supported  
192 institution of higher learning and wherein U.S. Highway 82 and  
193 Mississippi Highway 389 intersect, the salary of the county  
194 prosecuting attorney shall be not less than Twelve Thousand  
195 Dollars (\$12,000.00) nor greater than Twenty Thousand Four Hundred  
196 Dollars (\$20,400.00).

197 (q) In any county having two (2) judicial districts  
198 wherein Mississippi Highway 32 intersects U.S. Highway 49E, the  
199 salary of the county prosecuting attorney shall be not less than  
200 Twelve Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$12,700.00).

201 (r) In any county traversed by the Natchez Trace  
202 Parkway wherein U.S. Highway 45 and Mississippi Highway 4  
203 intersect, the salary of the county prosecuting attorney shall be

204 not less than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) nor more than the  
205 annual salary of justice court judges in the county.

206 (s) In any county having a population of more than  
207 fourteen thousand (14,000) according to the 1970 census and which  
208 county is bordered on the north by the State of Tennessee and on  
209 the east by the State of Alabama and in which U.S. Highway No. 72  
210 and Highway No. 25 intersect, the salary of the county prosecuting  
211 attorney shall be not less than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00)  
212 nor more than the annual salary of justice court judges in the  
213 county.

214 (t) (i) In any county wherein Interstate Highway 55  
215 and State Highway 22 intersect, and which is also traversed in  
216 whole or part by U.S. Highways 49 and 51, and State Highways 16,  
217 17, 43 and the Natchez Trace Parkway, and also containing a part  
218 of a public lake or reservoir, in excess of thirty thousand  
219 (30,000) acres, the annual salary of the county prosecuting  
220 attorney shall be Twenty-four Thousand Dollars (\$24,000.00).

221 (ii) From and after October 1, 1993, in addition  
222 to the salary provided for item (i) of this paragraph, the board  
223 of supervisors, in its discretion, may pay the county prosecuting  
224 attorney an additional amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of  
225 the maximum allowable salary prescribed herein.

226 (u) In any county having a population in the 1970  
227 census in excess of thirty-five thousand (35,000) and in which  
228 U.S. Highways 49W and 82 intersect, and in which is located a  
229 state penitentiary, the annual salary of a county prosecuting  
230 attorney shall be Thirty Thousand Four Hundred Twenty Dollars  
231 (\$30,420.00).

232 (v) In any county wherein Mississippi Highway 50  
233 intersects U.S. Highway 45-Alternate, and having a population  
234 greater than twenty thousand (20,000) according to the 1980  
235 federal decennial census, a salary equal to that of a member of  
236 the board of supervisors of such county; provided that if such  
237 county prosecuting attorney is paid a sum for the purpose of  
238 defraying office or secretarial expenses, then the salary

239 prescribed herein shall be reduced by that amount.

240 (w) In any county in which the 1975 assessed valuation  
241 was Forty Million Seven Hundred Thirty-nine Thousand Four Hundred  
242 Sixty-six Dollars (\$40,739,466.00) and wherein U.S. Highway 45 and  
243 Mississippi Highway 8 intersect, the salary of the county  
244 prosecuting attorney shall be equal to that of a member of the  
245 board of supervisors of such county; provided that if such county  
246 prosecuting attorney is paid a sum for the purpose of defraying  
247 office or secretarial expenses, then the salary prescribed herein  
248 shall be reduced by that amount.

249 (x) In any county bordering on the Mississippi River  
250 having a population greater than fifty thousand (50,000) according  
251 to the 1980 federal decennial census and also having a national  
252 military park and national cemetery, an annual salary of  
253 Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) or a salary equal to  
254 that of a member of the board of supervisors in such county,  
255 whichever is greater. In addition, such county prosecuting  
256 attorney shall receive the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00)  
257 per month for the purpose of defraying secretarial expenses.

258 (y) In any county bordering on the Alabama state line,  
259 traversed by the Chickasawhay River, and wherein U.S. Highway 45  
260 and U.S. Highway 84 intersect, a salary that shall be equal to the  
261 annual salary of a member of the board of supervisors of such  
262 county. All prior acts, orders and resolutions of the board of  
263 supervisors of such county which authorize the payment of the  
264 salary of the county prosecuting attorney in conformity with the  
265 provisions of this section as it existed immediately prior to the  
266 effective date of Chapter 506, Laws of 1985, are hereby ratified,  
267 approved, confirmed and validated.

268 (z) In any county having a population greater than  
269 sixty-five thousand five hundred eighty (65,580) but less than  
270 sixty-five thousand five hundred ninety (65,590) according to the  
271 1990 federal decennial census, wherein U.S. Highway 45 intersects  
272 with Mississippi Highway 6, an annual salary equal to Thirty  
273 Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00).



274 (aa) In any county where an institution of higher  
275 learning is located and wherein U.S. Highway 82 and U.S. Highway  
276 45 intersect, the salary of county prosecuting attorney shall be  
277 not less than that of a member of the board of supervisors in such  
278 county, and the board of supervisors may, in its discretion, pay  
279 such county prosecuting attorney a salary in an amount not to  
280 exceed the amount of the salary of the District Attorney for the  
281 Sixteenth Judicial District of Mississippi.

282 (bb) In any county having a population greater than six  
283 thousand (6,000) according to the federal decennial census and  
284 wherein U.S. Highway 61 and Highway 48 intersect, the board of  
285 supervisors, in its discretion, may pay the county prosecuting  
286 attorney an annual salary equal to the annual salary of members of  
287 the board of supervisors in the county.

288 (cc) In any county having a population greater than  
289 thirty-one thousand (31,000) according to the 1990 federal  
290 decennial census and wherein U.S. Highway 61 and U.S. Highway 49  
291 intersect, a salary of not less than the annual salary of justice  
292 court judges in the county.

293 (dd) In any county having a population greater than  
294 eighty-seven thousand (87,000) but less than eighty-seven thousand  
295 two hundred (87,200) according to the 1990 federal census, in  
296 which is located an international airport, an annual salary of  
297 Twenty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$29,000.00). In addition, such  
298 county prosecuting attorney shall receive the sum of One Thousand  
299 Dollars (\$1,000.00) per month for the purpose of defraying  
300 secretarial expenses.

301 (ee) In any county having a population greater than  
302 eight thousand (8,000) but less than eight thousand two hundred  
303 (8,200) according to the 1990 federal census, and in which U.S.  
304 Highway 61 and Mississippi Highway 4 intersect, the board of  
305 supervisors may, in its discretion, pay the county prosecuting  
306 attorney an amount not to exceed Fourteen Thousand Dollars  
307 (\$14,000.00), in addition to the maximum allowable salary for that  
308 attorney under subsection (1), beginning on April 1, 1997.

309           (ff) In any county having a population greater than  
310 thirty thousand three hundred (30,300) but less than thirty  
311 thousand four hundred (30,400) according to the 1990 federal  
312 census, and in which U.S. Highway 78 and Mississippi Highway 7  
313 intersect, a salary of not less than the annual salary of a member  
314 of the board of supervisors in such county.

315           (gg) In any county having a population greater than  
316 thirteen thousand three hundred (13,300) but less than thirteen  
317 thousand four hundred (13,400) according to the 1990 federal  
318 census, and in which Mississippi Highway 24 and Mississippi  
319 Highway 48 intersect, the board of supervisors may, in its  
320 discretion, pay the county prosecuting attorney an additional  
321 amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the maximum allowable  
322 salary for that attorney under subsection (1).

323           (hh) In any county having a population greater than  
324 eight thousand three hundred (8,300) but less than eight thousand  
325 four hundred (8,400) according to the 1990 federal census, and in  
326 which U.S. Highway 84 and U.S. Highway 98 intersect, the board of  
327 supervisors may, in its discretion, pay the county prosecuting  
328 attorney an additional amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of  
329 the maximum allowable salary for that attorney under subsection  
330 (1).

331           (ii) After September 30, 1993, in any county having a  
332 population of more than thirty thousand four hundred (30,400) and  
333 which is traversed in whole or part by I-59, U.S. Highways 98 and  
334 11 and State Highway 13, the annual salary of the county  
335 prosecuting attorney shall be Twenty-five Thousand Dollars  
336 (\$25,000.00). In addition, such county prosecuting attorney shall  
337 receive after September 30, 1993, the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty  
338 Dollars (\$750.00) per month for the purpose of defraying office or  
339 secretarial expenses.

340           (jj) In any county having a population greater than  
341 twenty thousand (20,000) according to the 1990 federal census and  
342 wherein U.S. Highway 78 and Mississippi Highway 25 intersect, the  
343 salary of the county prosecuting attorney shall be not less than

344 Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) nor more than the annual salary  
345 of justice court judges in the county.

346 (kk) In any county having a population greater than  
347 twelve thousand four hundred (12,400) but less than twelve  
348 thousand five hundred (12,500) according to the 1990 federal  
349 census, and in which U.S. Highway 84 and Mississippi Highway 27  
350 intersect, the board of supervisors may, in its discretion, pay  
351 the county prosecuting attorney an additional amount not to exceed  
352 ten percent (10%) of the maximum allowable salary for that  
353 attorney under subsection (1).

354 (ll) In any county having a population greater than  
355 thirty thousand two hundred (30,200) but less than thirty thousand  
356 three hundred (30,300) according to the 1990 federal census, and  
357 in which U.S. Interstate 55 and Mississippi Highway 84 intersect,  
358 the board of supervisors may, in its discretion, pay the county  
359 prosecuting attorney an additional amount not to exceed ten  
360 percent (10%) of the maximum allowable salary for that attorney  
361 under subsection (1).

362 (mm) In any county on the Mississippi River levee,  
363 having a population greater than forty-one thousand eight hundred  
364 (41,800) but less than forty-one thousand nine hundred (41,900)  
365 according to the 1990 federal census wherein U.S. Highway 61 and  
366 Mississippi Highway 8 intersect, a salary of not less than the  
367 annual salary of justice court judges in the county.

368 (nn) In any county having a population greater than  
369 twenty-four thousand seven hundred (24,700) and less than  
370 twenty-four thousand nine hundred (24,900) according to the 1990  
371 federal census, wherein Mississippi Highways 15 and 16 intersect,  
372 the board of supervisors, in its discretion, may pay the county  
373 prosecuting attorney an annual salary equal to the annual salary  
374 of members of the board of supervisors in the county.

375 (oo) In any county having a population greater than  
376 thirty-seven thousand (37,000) but less than thirty-eight thousand  
377 (38,000) according to the 1990 federal census, in which is located  
378 a state supported institution of higher learning, and in which

379 U.S. Highway 82 and Mississippi Highway 7 intersect, the board of  
380 supervisors may, in its discretion, pay the county prosecuting  
381 attorney a salary in an amount not to exceed the amount of the  
382 salary of the District Attorney for the Fourth Judicial District  
383 of Mississippi.

384 (pp) In any county in which U.S. Highway 78 and  
385 Mississippi Highway 15 intersect and which is traversed by the  
386 Tallahatchie River, a salary equal to that of members of the board  
387 of supervisors of the county, which salary shall be in addition to  
388 any sums received for the purpose of defraying office or  
389 secretarial expenses and sums received as youth court prosecutor  
390 fees.

391 (qq) In any county bordering on the State of Tennessee  
392 and the State of Arkansas, wherein Interstate Highway 55 and  
393 Mississippi Highway 302 intersect, the board of supervisors, in  
394 its discretion, may pay the county prosecuting attorney an annual  
395 salary in the amount of Twenty-six Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars  
396 (\$26,700.00).

397 (rr) In any county that is traversed by the Natchez  
398 Trace Parkway and in which Mississippi Highway 35 and Mississippi  
399 Highway 12 intersect, the board of supervisors, in its discretion,  
400 may pay the county prosecuting attorney an annual salary in the  
401 amount of the annual salary of justice court judges in the county.

402 (ss) In any county in which Mississippi Highway 14 and  
403 Mississippi Highway 25 intersect, the board of supervisors, in its  
404 discretion, may pay the county prosecuting attorney an annual  
405 salary in the amount of Twenty-two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000.00).

406 (tt) In any county in which Interstate Highway 59 and  
407 U.S. Highway 84 intersect, the board of supervisors, in its  
408 discretion, may pay the county prosecuting attorney an annual  
409 salary equal to the annual salary of members of the boards of  
410 supervisors in the county.

411 (3) In any case where a salary, expense allowance or other  
412 sum is authorized or paid by the board of supervisors pursuant to  
413 this section, that salary, expense allowance or other sum shall

414 not be reduced or terminated during the term for which the county  
415 attorney was elected.

416 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of  
417 Mississippi shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by  
418 the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a  
419 veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the  
420 United States District Court for the District of Columbia in  
421 accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965,  
422 as amended and extended.

423 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from  
424 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting  
425 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

**Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and  
inserting in lieu thereof the following:**

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO  
2 AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN CERTAIN COUNTIES TO INCREASE
