REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H.B. No. 1589: Appropriation; Mississippi Department of Transportation.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

6	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
7	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
8	Treasury to the credit of the Department of Transportation Funds,
9	for the purpose of defraying the administrative expenses of the
10	Mississippi Department of Transportation for the fiscal year
11	beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000
12	\$ 963,727,779.00.
13	SECTION 2. The following offices are supported by the funds
14	appropriated in Section 1: The Office of Administrative Services,
15	the Office of Highways, the Office of Aeronautics and Rails and
16	the Office of Enforcement. Of the funds appropriated under the
17	provisions of Section 1, not more than the amounts set forth below
18	shall be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of
19	expenditure:

36	From the funds provided in the budget category "Personal
37	Services: Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits," funds may be
38	expended for the following purposes, in compliance with the
39	policies established by the State Personnel Board and any
40	conditions placed on such expenditures:
41	(a) The components of the Variable Compensation Plan
42	shall be maintained within the constraints of the funds
43	appropriated herein.
44	(b) Funds are provided to adjust the Variable
45	Compensation Plan, including realignment, to ensure that all
46	full-time employees with at least six (6) months of continuous
47	current service, as of June 30, 1999, receive an increase of One
48	Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). Funds are provided to
49	adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand
50	Dollars (\$1,000.00).
51	(c) If an employee is currently at or above the end
52	salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall
53	be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any
54	increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a
55	current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the
56	effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently
57	receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above
58	during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase
59	effective the date of the rating.
60	It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds
61	required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal
62	Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for
63	that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the

- 64 agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 66 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 68 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 69 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 70 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 71 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi
- 72 Department of Transportation under the provisions of Section 1 and
- 73 authorized for expenditure in Section 2, the following amounts
- 74 shall be available for expenditure in the program budgets as
- 75 required by Section 27-103-127, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- Administration and Other Expenses.....\$ 43,572,069.00
- 77 Construction.....\$ 712,536,340.00
- 78 Maintenance.....\$ 137,607,052.00
- 79 Debt Service.....\$ 51,770,000.00
- 80 Law Enforcement.....\$ 9,249,542.00
- 81 Aeronautics, Rails and other.....\$ 8,992,776.00
- 82 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and
- 83 authorized for expenditure in Section 2, it is the intention of
- 84 the Legislature that One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00)
- 85 shall be transferred to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce
- 86 for the Beaver Control or Eradication Program during the Fiscal
- 87 Year 2000.
- 88 SECTION 5. With the funds provided herein, it is the
- 89 intention of the Legislature that the department set aside One
- 90 Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for the Emergency Contingency
- 91 Fund. These funds will be taken from existing funds at the
- 92 department's discretion from July 1, 1999, through March 31, 2000,
- 93 at which time any unexpended funds can be utilized by the
- 94 department for normal operations. These funds may be used for the
- 95 correcting of hazardous road conditions due to inclement weather
- 96 or acts of God.
- 97 SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi
- 98 Department of Transportation, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars

- 99 (\$300,000.00) shall be used for the Statewide Litter Prevention
- 100 Program.
- 101 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 102 Mississippi Department of Transportation shall have the authority
- 103 to escalate and expend funds from any proceeds arising from
- 104 participation in drug seizure activities not to exceed Fifty
- 105 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00).
- 106 SECTION 8. Of the construction funds appropriated in Section
- 107 1 and allocated in Section 2, it is the intention of the
- 108 Legislature that priority shall be given in letting paving
- 109 contracts on grade, drain and bridge projects which have been
- 110 completed for six (6) months or more. This action will not
- 111 prohibit the Department of Transportation from letting paving
- 112 contracts on grade, drain and bridge projects which have been
- 113 completed for less than six (6) months.
- 114 SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and
- 115 allocated in Section 2, it is the intention of the Legislature
- that an amount no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00)
- 117 shall be utilized to repair and maintain welcome centers,
- 118 hospitality centers and rest areas located on the highways of
- 119 Mississippi.
- 120 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 121 Executive Director of the Department of Transportation may
- 122 transfer between the various programs authorized in Section 3
- 123 funds not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the total funds
- 124 authorized in Section 1, except that transfers cannot be made into
- 125 the "Administration and Other Expense Program." The Executive
- 126 Director of the Department of Transportation shall submit written
- 127 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office
- 128 and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the
- 129 fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the
- 130 transfer.
- 131 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 132 Department of Transportation be allowed to escalate its budget in
- 133 the "Capital Outlay" major object of expenditure and the

- 134 appropriate corresponding program, with funds generated as a
- 135 result of third party damages an amount not to exceed Two Million
- 136 Dollars (\$2,000,000.00).
- 137 SECTION 12. The Mississippi Department of Transportation is
- 138 hereby authorized and directed to conduct a pilot maintenance
- 139 project on U. S. Highway 78 between the Tennessee and Alabama
- 140 state lines that is projected to save the department monies over a
- 141 five-year period.
- 142 SECTION 13. Of the funds herein appropriated, funds in the
- amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) are provided
- 144 to construct turn lanes to Highway 145 to improve safety and
- 145 accessibility to Saltillo High School at Saltillo.
- 146 SECTION 14. With the funds provided herein, the department
- 147 may reallocate the appropriate existing positions to the following
- 148 titles: One (1) DOT-Assistant to the Commissioner and six (6)
- 149 DOT-District Surveyors.
- 150 SECTION 15. In addition to all other sums heretofore
- 151 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 152 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
- 153 Treasury to the credit of the Department of Transportation, for
- 154 the purpose of defraying the expenses to the Department of
- 155 Transportation in the Major Objects Of Expenditure "Contractual
- 156 Services" and the appropriate corresponding program for the fiscal
- 157 year ending June 30, 1999......\$ 15,000,000.00,
- 158 and in the Major Objects Of Expenditure "Capital Outlay: Other
- 159 Than Equipment" and the appropriate corresponding program for the
- 160 fiscal year ending June 30, 1999...... \$ 40,000.000.00.
- 161 SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated, whatever amount as
- 162 may be necessary shall be used to begin the process of
- reestablishing and reopening the rest area at Pocahontas on
- 164 Highway 49 North.
- 165 SECTION 17. Funds are provided herein to establish new job
- 166 classifications of DOT Rails Inspectors, as approved by the
- 167 State Personnel Board.
- 168 SECTION 18. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be

169 necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money not expended in Fiscal Year 1999 by the Department of Transportation in the 170 171 equipment category for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000.....\$ 172 3,400,000.00. 173 SECTION 19. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 174 of Section 1 and allocated under the provisions of Section 2 to 175 the budget category "Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits," funds 176 are provided to establish the following positions: One (1) Database Analyst I, two (2) Programmer Analysts II, one (1) 177 178 Business Systems Analyst II, two (2) Systems Administrators II, one (1) Senior Systems Specialist, one (1) Senior Network 179 180 Specialist, one (1) Systems Manager II, one (1) Business Systems Analyst II, two (2) DOT-Assistants to the Commissioner and one (1) 181 182 DOT-State Surveyor. 183 SECTION 20. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 184 185 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 186 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 187 188 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. SECTION 21. This act shall take effect and be in force from 189 and after July 1, 1999, except Section 15 which shall be in force 190

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
