## REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

## MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H.B. No. 1622: Appropriation; Department of Environmental Quality.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

Funds are provided to 83 84 adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). 85 86 (c) If an employee is currently at or above the end 87 salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any 88 increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a 89 current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the 90 91 effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above 92 during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase 93 effective the date of the rating. 94 It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds 95 required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal 96

Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for

- 98 that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the
- 99 agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.
- 100 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 101 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 102 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 103 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 104 Unless expressly authorized herein by the Legislature, no
- 105 funds appropriated shall be expended to pay expenses incurred by
- 106 more than four (4) employees or other representatives of the
- 107 agency for attending the same conference, seminar or workshop,
- 108 either in-state or out-of-state; however, such funds may be
- 109 expended for expenses incurred by more than four (4) employees or
- 110 other representatives for attendance at the same conference,
- 111 seminar or workshop (a) if attendance is required in order to
- 112 maintain professional certification or licensure, which
- 113 certification or licensure is required by the employees' job
- 114 descriptions or by law, or (b) if such expenditure has received
- 115 the prior written approval of the Department of Finance and
- 116 Administration.
- 117 SECTION 4. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 118 Department of Environmental Quality shall have authority to
- 119 escalate the various budgets in both funds and positions, with the
- 120 approval of the State Fiscal Officer, from any special funds
- 121 collected or available, in the current fiscal year or any prior
- 122 fiscal year, not to exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00),
- 123 to the agency for expenditure. Upon such approval, the Department
- 124 of Environmental Quality may expend such funds in the manner
- 125 authorized by law.
- 126 The Executive Director of the Department of Environmental
- 127 Quality shall submit to the Department of Finance and
- 128 Administration a certified statement providing a detailed
- 129 explanation for any escalation, including a justification for the
- 130 establishment of any new positions or reclassification of existing
- 131 positions and the existence of any required matching funds for
- 132 those positions, and an assessment of the impact on the agency's

general fund budget for the three (3) fiscal years following the fiscal year in which the escalation is requested.

SECTION 5. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.

It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 6. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:
