53	current service, as of June 30, 1999, receive an increase of One				
54	Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). Funds are provided to				
55	adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand				
56	Dollars (\$1,000.00).				
57	(c) If an employee is currently at or above the end				
58	salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall				
59	be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any				
60	increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a				
61	current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the				
62	effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently				

- 63 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above
- 64 during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase
- 65 effective the date of the rating.
- It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds
- 67 required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal
- 68 Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for
- 69 that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the
- 70 agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.
- 71 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 72 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.
- 73 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 74 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 75 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 76 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 77 SECTION 4. The Mississippi Department of Archives and
- 78 History is hereby authorized to accept and expend any grant,
- 79 donation or contribution from any individual, public or private
- 80 organization, or government entity for purposes of defraying the
- 81 operational costs of the department. Such grants, donations or
- 82 contributions shall be received and expended under the rules and
- 83 regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a
- 84 manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.
- 85 SECTION 5. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 86 Mississippi Department of Archives and History shall charge the
- 87 maximum amount allowable for services rendered, consistent with
- 88 the cost of providing such services. The funds derived from these
- 89 charges shall be deposited into a special fund account in the
- 90 State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Department of
- 91 Archives and History.
- 92 SECTION 6. It is the intent of the Legislature that no part
- 93 of the funds herein appropriated shall be required to be used for
- 94 the payment of rent for the museum and public space in the State
- 95 Historical Museum, Old Capitol Restoration.
- 96 SECTION 7. In addition to all other sums herein
- 97 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be

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necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds from the Local
Government Records Fund in the State Treasury to defray the cost
of such program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and
ending June 30, 2000......$ 259,734.00.
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- 102 With the funds appropriated in this section, the following 103 positions are authorized:
- 105 SECTION 8. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 106 necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the State
- 107 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of

- 185 Register of Historic Places property in Vicksburg, Mississippi.
- 186 The Department of Archives and History may enter into cooperative
- 187 agreements with the City of Vicksburg and Tabernacle No. 19,
- 188 Independent Order of Brothers and Sisters of Love and Charity to
- 189 implement the restoration of the Beulah Cemetery.
- 190 SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated herein, Five Thousand
- 191 Dollars (\$5,000.00) is provided for the portraits of Governor
- 192 Allain and Governor Fordice.
- 193 SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and
- 194 allocated in Section 3, One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) is
- 195 provided for enhancement grants authorized by the Transportation
- 196 Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21), administered by the
- 197 Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT).
- 198 SECTION 15. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 199 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 200 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 201 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 202 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the

203	proper person, officer or officer	s, in the manner provided by law.
204	SECTION 16. This act shall	take effect and be in force from
205	and after July 1, 1999.
