REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H.B. No. 1636: Appropriation; State Department of Education - General Programs, Education Reform Act and Vocational Education.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be

14	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
15	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
16	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department
17	of Education which is comprised of special source funds collected
18	by or otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of
19	defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal year
20	beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000
21	\$ 594,769,086.00.
22	SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
23	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
24	Treasury to the credit of the Health Care Expendable Fund, created
25	under House Bill No. 519, 1999 Regular Session, for the purpose of
26	defraying the expenses of the State Department of Education for
27	the Mississippi Eye Screening Program for providing vision safety
28	services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending
29	June 30, 2000\$ 250,000.00.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law. No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this

act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

The State Department of Education shall prepare and present to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee and the Department of Finance and Administration and make available to the Legislature an accounting of program expenditures for all programs once at the beginning of the legislative session and once at the end of the fiscal year. The department at the same time shall present a

summary report for each program.

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 347 State Department of Education and Vocational and Technical Education Division shall maintain complete accounting and 348 349 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 350 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 351 352 1999. The Department of Finance and Administration shall insure that financial controls comparable to those utilized for Fiscal 353 354 Year 1999 are maintained throughout Fiscal Year 2000 for this 355 agency. The State Personnel Board shall insure that personnel 356 controls and records comparable to those utilized for Fiscal Year 357 1999 are maintained throughout Fiscal Year 2000 for this agency. 358 It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's 359 budget request for Fiscal Year 2001 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail 360 361 comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the 362 Fiscal Year 2000 budget request process. 363

SECTION 23. Any school district receiving conservatorship assistance from the State Department of Education shall pay for any additional assistance as determined by the State Department of Education from any source funds available.

SECTION 24. Should revenues generated and deposited to the 367 368 Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203 (1), Mississippi Code of 1972, and apportioned pursuant to Section 369 37-61-33 (6), Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds 370 appropriated herein from said source, the State Department of 371 372 Education shall notify the Department of Finance and 373 Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced to insure expenditures do not exceed actual revenues. 374

SECTION 25. Of the funds provided in Section 1 for the purpose of providing financial assistance for the education of exceptional children as determined under Section 37-23-63, Mississippi Code of 1972, children who are certified by the designated authority as requiring inpatient care in a private

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380 intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded or psychiatric residential treatment facility, with Medicaid 381 382 reimbursement, shall be eligible and entitled to receive state financial assistance under the provisions of Section 37-23-69, in 383 384 an amount not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) from state funds, per child per school year, if an approved private 385 386 school is operated as an integral part of the facility which 387 provides twenty-four (24) hours a day monitoring, treatment and education, except that the State Department of Education is 388 389 authorized to pilot a fee-for-service based cost system for

children served through Millcreek Schools, Inc. 390 SECTION 26. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 391

of Sections 1 and 2, the amount of Eighty-eight Million Eight 392 393 Hundred Seventeen Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-four Dollars 394 (\$88,817,684.00) shall be derived from the Interim School District Capital Expenditure Fund for the benefit of the school districts 395 as authorized in Senate Bill No. 2649, 1997 Regular Session. 396

SECTION 27. Of the funds provided in Section 1, Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000.00) shall be used to provide for a Director of School Nurses in the State Department of Education and the implementation of three (3) pilot projects for a variety of school health programs in an elementary school setting. Evaluations shall be developed to determine the program's effect

402 403 to drop-out rates, suspensions, expulsions, attendance and test 404 scores.

Income generated by the school-based clinics shall remain available for expenditure by the programs utilizing any special 406 407 fund authority provided in Section 2 for use by the State Department of Education and the pilots shall remain the same as in 409 Fiscal Year 1999.

410 SECTION 28. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department of Education shall have the authority to accept, 411 budget and expend any source funds not to exceed Thirty Million 412 413 Dollars (\$30,000,000.00), that become available to the department 414 to carry out the provisions of those funds in a manner consistent

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with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration.

SECTION 29. Funds are provided in this act for the reallocation of eighteen (18) positions for an amount not to exceed Fifty-eight Thousand Three Hundred Fifty-two Dollars (\$58,352.00). The eighteen (18) positions are as follows:
