## **REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE**

## **MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:**

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H.B. No. 1638: Appropriation; Department of Education - Minimum Program.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

## Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

101 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 102 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by general law.

103 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 104 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 105 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 106 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

107 The State Department of Education, in reporting expenditures 108 and disbursements to the Legislature, shall report the amounts 109 expended and disbursed in categories corresponding to the elements 110 outlined in this section.

111 SECTION 6. The State Department of Education is authorized 112 to transfer district allotments for insurance separately from 113 regular Minimum Program allotments to insure funds are received by 114 school districts for timely payment of premiums.

SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

166	appropriated herein from said source, the State Department of		
167	Education shall notify the Department of Finance and		
168	Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced to insure		
169	expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.		
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170 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 171 State Department of Education be allowed to receive, budget and 172 expend funds from any source available not to exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00), that may become available to the 173 174 department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the 175 Department of Finance and Administration.

SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 176 177 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 178 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 179 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 180 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 181 182 SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from 183 and after July 1, 1999.
