## REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

## MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H.B. No. 1639: Appropriation; Schools for the Blind and the Deaf.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

6	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be		
7	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State		
8	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board of		
9	Education for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the		
10	Mississippi School for the Blind and the Mississippi School for		
11	the Deaf for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending		
12	June 30, 2000\$ 10,413,655.00.		
13	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be		
14	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special		
15	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Board of		
16	Education for the support of the Mississippi School for the Blind		
17	or the Mississippi School for the Deaf which is comprised of		
18	special source funds collected by or otherwise available to the		
19	schools, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the schools		
20	for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending		
21	June 30, 2000\$ 731,062.00.		
22	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of		
23	Section 1 and Section 2, the following positions are authorized:		
24	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:		
25	Permanent: Full Time 215		
26	Part Time 40		
27	Time-Limited: Full Time

- 29 From the funds provided herein, funds may be expended for the
- 30 following purposes, in compliance with the policies established by
- 31 the State Personnel Board and any conditions placed on such
- 32 expenditures:
- 33 (a) The components of the Variable Compensation Plan
- 34 shall be maintained within the constraints of the funds
- 35 appropriated herein.
- 36 (b) Funds are provided to adjust the Variable
- 37 Compensation Plan, including realignment, to ensure that all
- 38 full-time employees with at least six (6) months of continuous
- 39 current service, as of June 30, 1999, receive an increase of One
- 40 Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). Funds are provided to
- 41 adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand
- 42 Dollars (\$1,000.00).
- 43 (c) If an employee is currently at or above the end
- 44 salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall
- 45 be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any
- 46 increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a
- 47 current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the
- 48 effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently
- 49 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above
- 50 during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase
- 51 effective the date of the rating.
- It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds
- 53 required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal
- 54 Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for
- 55 that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the
- 56 agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 58 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by general law.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 60 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 61 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 62 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein provided shall be expended to hire

- 64 any person on a contractual basis, for any period for any purpose,
- 65 without the express prior approval of the State Personnel
- 66 Director. The State Personnel Director shall consider, in
- 67 approving such contracts, the availability of funds, the need for
- 68 services, compliance with the State Compensation Plan and the
- 69 qualifications of the persons offering to perform the services.
- 70 The State Fiscal Officer shall not pay any warrant that is in
- 71 violation of this section.
- 72 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 73 Mississippi School for the Blind and the Mississippi School for
- 74 the Deaf shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records
- 75 related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this
- 76 act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of
- 77 detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 1999. The Department of
- 78 Finance and Administration shall insure that financial controls
- 79 comparable to those utilized for Fiscal Year 1999 are maintained
- 80 throughout Fiscal Year 1999 for this agency. The State Personnel
- 81 Board shall insure that personnel controls and records comparable
- 82 to those utilized for Fiscal Year 1999 are maintained throughout
- 83 Fiscal Year 2000 for this agency. It is further the intention of
- 84 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year
- 85 2001 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee
- 86 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level
- 87 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 1999 budget request
- 88 process.
- 89 SECTION 5. With the funds provided herein, it is the
- 90 intention of the Legislature that the academic teachers at the
- 91 Mississippi School for the Deaf and the Mississippi School for the
- 92 Blind shall receive their annual increment and that the
- 93 Mississippi State Personnel Board and the Mississippi Department
- 94 of Education work together to adjust the special compensation plan
- 95 for these teachers to reflect the increase given to public school
- 96 teachers through the Minimum Program or the increase given to
- 97 state employees, whichever is greater, to be implemented July 1,
- 98 1999.

99	SECTION 6. Funds are provide	led in this act for the	
100	reallocations of eight (8) positi	ions not to exceed Thirty-one	
101	Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$31,890.00).		
102	SECTION 7. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by		
103	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the		
104	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon		
105	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal		
106	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the		
107	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law		
108	SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from		
109	and after July 1, 1999.
