REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S.B. No. 2479: Salary of certain appointed and elected officials; revise.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

(1) * * * From and after July 1, 1984, there shall be a State Superintendent of Public Education who shall be 152 153 appointed by the State Board of Education, with the advice and consent of the Senate, and serve at the board's will and pleasure. 154 155 He shall be the chief administrative officer for the State Department of Education and shall administer the department in 156 157 accordance with the policies established by the State Board of 158 Education. He shall receive such compensation in an amount equal to ninety percent (90%) of the salary of the Commissioner of 159 160 Higher Education. The State Superintendent of Public Education 161 shall have at least a master's degree in any field and a minimum of five (5) years' experience in administration in the educational 162 163 field.

164 (2) The state superintendent shall give bond in the penalty of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00), with sureties to be 165 approved by the Governor, conditioned according to law. Said bond 166 167 when approved shall be filed and recorded in the office of the 168 Secretary of State.

SECTION 3. Section 25-3-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 169 amended as follows: 170

25-3-35. (1) The annual salaries of the following judges 171 are fixed as follows, to begin at the commencement of the next 172 term of office immediately succeeding the existing term: 173 174 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court..... \$104,900.00 175 Presiding Justice of the Supreme Court..... 102,900.00 176 Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, each..... 102,300.00 177 However, in addition to their present official duties, there 178 are imposed upon the Supreme Court Justices the extra duties of

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179 making a special study of existing laws and reporting to each regular session of the Legislature such constructive suggestions 180 181 as they may deem necessary for the improvement of the administration of justice, and of advising and counseling with the 182 183 State Librarian in the selection of law books for purchase and use in the State Law Library, advising with the librarian thereof upon 184 185 the removal from the library of any books which may be the least 186 frequently used, and for the placing of same in a convenient location so as to provide additional space for such books and 187 188 other current publications which may be more frequently used or called for. For such extra services each justice, from and after 189 the effective date of Senate Bill 2479, 1999 Regular Session, 190 191 shall receive a sum sufficient when added to the present salaries 192 of the justices to aggregate One Hundred Four Thousand Nine 193 Hundred Dollars (\$104,900.00) for the Chief Justice, One Hundred Two Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$102,900.00) for the Presiding 194 195 Justice, and One Hundred Two Thousand Three Hundred Dollars 196 (\$102,300.00) for Associate Justices, per annum. As each existing 197 term expires and the above-captioned salaries become effective in 198 due course, the extra duties and compensation provided for shall 199 cease. 200 The annual salaries of the judges of the Court of (2) Appeals of Mississippi are fixed as follows: 201 202 Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals..... \$ 98,300.00 203 Associate Judges of the Court of Appeals, each..... 95,500.00 204 (3) The annual salaries of the chancery and circuit court judges are fixed as follows: 205 206 Chancery Judges, each..... \$94,700.00 207 Circuit Judges, each..... <u>94,700.00</u> 208 In addition to their present official duties, there are 209 imposed upon the chancery and circuit court judges the extra duties of making a special study of existing laws relating to 210 211 trial courts and reporting to the Supreme Court of the State of 212 Mississippi such constructive suggestions as they may deem 213 necessary for the improvement of the administration of justice,

The judges shall advise and 215 supervise in the purchase of law books for the libraries of each 216 district, and shall study and evaluate the inventory of books and 217 218 facilities now existing in the libraries of each district to effect the removal and relocation of obsolete publications so as 219 220 to provide additional space for those books and current publications more frequently used. The judges shall study the 221 existing rules promulgated by the circuit and chancery court 222 223 judicial associations governing the operation of chancery and 224 circuit courts, and revise the same pursuant to existing laws. 225 For such extra services each judge, from and after the effective date of Senate Bill No. 2479, 1999 Regular Session, shall receive 226 227 a sum sufficient when added to the present salaries of the judges 228 to aggregate <u>Ninety-four Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars</u> 229 (\$94,700.00) per annum for each judge. Upon the expiration of the existing term, the above-captioned salaries become effective in 230 due course, and the extra duties and compensation provided for 231 shall cease. 232

(4) The Supreme Court shall prepare a payroll for chancery
judges and circuit judges and submit such payroll to the
Department of Finance and Administration.

(5) The annual salary of the full-time district attorneys
shall be Seventy-nine Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty Dollars
(\$79,830.00).

(6) The annual salary of the full-time legal assistants
shall be not less than Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) nor
more than Sixty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$67,500.00),
as established by the district attorney.

243 SECTION 4. Section 25-31-10, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 244 amended as follows:

245 25-31-10. (1) Any district attorney may appoint a full-time 246 criminal investigator.

247 (2) The district attorneys of the Third, Fifth, Ninth,248 Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth, Fifteenth, Sixteenth, Seventeenth and

shall accept any private employment, civil or criminal, in any

259 The full and complete compensation for all public duties (5) 260 rendered by said criminal investigators shall be not * * * more than Forty-five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000.00) per annum, to be 261 262 determined at the discretion of the district attorney based upon 263 the qualifications, education and experience of the criminal 264 investigator, plus necessary travel and other expenses, to be paid in accordance with Section 25-31-8. * * * However, the maximum 265 salary under this subsection for a criminal investigator who has a 266 law degree may be supplemented by the district attorney from other 267 268 available funds, but not to exceed the maximum salary for a legal 269 assistant to a district attorney.

(6) Any criminal investigator may be designated by the district attorney to attend the Law Enforcement Officers Training Program set forth in Section 45-6-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972. The total expenses associated with attendance by criminal investigators at the Law Enforcement Officers Training Program shall be paid out of the funds of the appropriate district attorney.

277 SECTION 5. Section 5-1-41, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 278 amended as follows:

279 [Until December 31, 1999, this section shall read as 280 follows:]

5-1-41. Beginning with the 1986 Regular Session of the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, each Senator and Representative of the Legislature shall receive as compensation at

In addition to the above, 292 beginning on April 16, 1997, each Senator and Representative shall 293 receive the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per month for expenses incidental to his office for every full 294 295 month of his term, except any month or major fraction thereof when the Legislature is convened in regular or extraordinary session; 296 297 and payments shall be made to each Senator and Representative by 298 the State Treasurer between the first and tenth day of each month following the month for which the payments are due. * * * 299

300 [From and after January 1, 2000, this section shall read as 301 follows:]

Beginning with the 1986 Regular Session of the 302 5-1-41. 303 Legislature of the State of Mississippi, each Senator and 304 Representative of the Legislature shall receive as compensation at 305 each regular session the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and the mileage allowance provided by Section 25-3-41, for each 306 307 mile of the distance by the most direct route usually traveled in 308 coming to and returning from the place where the Legislature sits. 309 Beginning on April 16, 1997, each Senator and Representative shall receive for attending each extraordinary session or called session 310 311 the sum of Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per day and mileage at 312 the same rate as per regular session. In addition to the above, 313 beginning on April 16, 1997, each Senator and Representative and 314 the Lieutenant Governor shall receive the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per month for expenses incidental to 315 his office for every full month of his term, except any month or 316 major fraction thereof when the Legislature is convened in regular 317 318 or extraordinary session; and payments shall be made to each

322 SECTION 6. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 323 is directed to submit Sections 3 and 5 of this act, immediately 324 upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature 325 subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States 326 or to the United States District Court for the District of 327 Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights 328 Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

SECTION 7. Sections 1, 2 and 4 of this act shall take effect 329 330 and be in force from and after July 1, 1999. Sections 3 and 5 of 331 this act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 332 1999, if they are effectuated on or before that date under Section 333 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended. Τf 334 Sections 3 and 5 are effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, after July 1, 1999, 335 Section 3 and Section 5 shall take effect and be in force from and 336 after the date they are effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 337 338 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
