

REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S.B. No. 2479: Salary of certain appointed and elected officials; revise.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

16 SECTION 1. Section 25-3-33, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
17 amended as follows:

18 25-3-33. The annual salaries of the following appointive

149 SECTION 2. Section 37-3-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
 150 amended as follows:

151 37-3-9. (1) * * * From and after July 1, 1984, there shall
 152 be a State Superintendent of Public Education who shall be
 153 appointed by the State Board of Education, with the advice and
 154 consent of the Senate, and serve at the board's will and pleasure.
 155 He shall be the chief administrative officer for the State
 156 Department of Education and shall administer the department in
 157 accordance with the policies established by the State Board of
 158 Education. He shall receive such compensation in an amount equal
 159 to ninety percent (90%) of the salary of the Commissioner of
 160 Higher Education. The State Superintendent of Public Education
 161 shall have at least a master's degree in any field and a minimum
 162 of five (5) years' experience in administration in the educational
 163 field.

164 (2) The state superintendent shall give bond in the penalty
 165 of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00), with sureties to be
 166 approved by the Governor, conditioned according to law. Said bond
 167 when approved shall be filed and recorded in the office of the
 168 Secretary of State.

169 SECTION 3. Section 25-3-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
 170 amended as follows:

171 25-3-35. (1) The annual salaries of the following judges
 172 are fixed as follows, to begin at the commencement of the next
 173 term of office immediately succeeding the existing term:

174 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court..... \$104,900.00
 175 Presiding Justice of the Supreme Court..... 102,900.00
 176 Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, each..... 102,300.00

177 However, in addition to their present official duties, there
 178 are imposed upon the Supreme Court Justices the extra duties of

179 making a special study of existing laws and reporting to each
180 regular session of the Legislature such constructive suggestions
181 as they may deem necessary for the improvement of the
182 administration of justice, and of advising and counseling with the
183 State Librarian in the selection of law books for purchase and use
184 in the State Law Library, advising with the librarian thereof upon
185 the removal from the library of any books which may be the least
186 frequently used, and for the placing of same in a convenient
187 location so as to provide additional space for such books and
188 other current publications which may be more frequently used or
189 called for. For such extra services each justice, from and after
190 the effective date of Senate Bill 2479, 1999 Regular Session,
191 shall receive a sum sufficient when added to the present salaries
192 of the justices to aggregate One Hundred Four Thousand Nine
193 Hundred Dollars (\$104,900.00) for the Chief Justice, One Hundred
194 Two Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$102,900.00) for the Presiding
195 Justice, and One Hundred Two Thousand Three Hundred Dollars
196 (\$102,300.00) for Associate Justices, per annum. As each existing
197 term expires and the above-captioned salaries become effective in
198 due course, the extra duties and compensation provided for shall
199 cease.

200 (2) The annual salaries of the judges of the Court of
201 Appeals of Mississippi are fixed as follows:

202 Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals..... \$ 98,300.00
203 Associate Judges of the Court of Appeals, each..... 95,500.00

204 (3) The annual salaries of the chancery and circuit court
205 judges are fixed as follows:

206 Chancery Judges, each..... \$94,700.00
207 Circuit Judges, each..... 94,700.00

208 In addition to their present official duties, there are
209 imposed upon the chancery and circuit court judges the extra
210 duties of making a special study of existing laws relating to
211 trial courts and reporting to the Supreme Court of the State of
212 Mississippi such constructive suggestions as they may deem
213 necessary for the improvement of the administration of justice,

214 which shall be recommended to the Legislature by the Supreme Court
215 in the manner provided by law. The judges shall advise and
216 supervise in the purchase of law books for the libraries of each
217 district, and shall study and evaluate the inventory of books and
218 facilities now existing in the libraries of each district to
219 effect the removal and relocation of obsolete publications so as
220 to provide additional space for those books and current
221 publications more frequently used. The judges shall study the
222 existing rules promulgated by the circuit and chancery court
223 judicial associations governing the operation of chancery and
224 circuit courts, and revise the same pursuant to existing laws.
225 For such extra services each judge, from and after the effective
226 date of Senate Bill No. 2479, 1999 Regular Session, shall receive
227 a sum sufficient when added to the present salaries of the judges
228 to aggregate Ninety-four Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars
229 (\$94,700.00) per annum for each judge. Upon the expiration of the
230 existing term, the above-captioned salaries become effective in
231 due course, and the extra duties and compensation provided for
232 shall cease.

233 (4) The Supreme Court shall prepare a payroll for chancery
234 judges and circuit judges and submit such payroll to the
235 Department of Finance and Administration.

236 (5) The annual salary of the full-time district attorneys
237 shall be Seventy-nine Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty Dollars
238 (\$79,830.00).

239 (6) The annual salary of the full-time legal assistants
240 shall be not less than Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) nor
241 more than Sixty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$67,500.00),
242 as established by the district attorney.

243 SECTION 4. Section 25-31-10, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
244 amended as follows:

245 25-31-10. (1) Any district attorney may appoint a full-time
246 criminal investigator.

247 (2) The district attorneys of the Third, Fifth, Ninth,
248 Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth, Fifteenth, Sixteenth, Seventeenth and

249 Twentieth Circuit Court Districts may appoint one (1) additional
250 full-time criminal investigator for a total of two (2) full-time
251 criminal investigators.

252 (3) The district attorneys of the First, Second, Fourth and
253 Seventh and Nineteenth Circuit Court Districts may appoint two (2)
254 additional full-time criminal investigators for a total of three
255 (3) full-time criminal investigators.

256 (4) No district attorney or assistant district attorney
257 shall accept any private employment, civil or criminal, in any
258 matter investigated by such criminal investigators.

259 (5) The full and complete compensation for all public duties
260 rendered by said criminal investigators shall be not * * * more
261 than Forty-five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000.00) per annum, to be
262 determined at the discretion of the district attorney based upon
263 the qualifications, education and experience of the criminal
264 investigator, plus necessary travel and other expenses, to be paid
265 in accordance with Section 25-31-8. * * * However, the maximum
266 salary under this subsection for a criminal investigator who has a
267 law degree may be supplemented by the district attorney from other
268 available funds, but not to exceed the maximum salary for a legal
269 assistant to a district attorney.

270 (6) Any criminal investigator may be designated by the
271 district attorney to attend the Law Enforcement Officers Training
272 Program set forth in Section 45-6-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of
273 1972. The total expenses associated with attendance by criminal
274 investigators at the Law Enforcement Officers Training Program
275 shall be paid out of the funds of the appropriate district
276 attorney.

277 SECTION 5. Section 5-1-41, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
278 amended as follows:

279 **[Until December 31, 1999, this section shall read as**
280 **follows:]**

281 5-1-41. Beginning with the 1986 Regular Session of the
282 Legislature of the State of Mississippi, each Senator and
283 Representative of the Legislature shall receive as compensation at

284 each regular session the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00)
285 and the mileage allowance provided by Section 25-3-41, for each
286 mile of the distance by the most direct route usually traveled in
287 coming to and returning from the place where the Legislature sits.
288 Beginning on April 16, 1997, each Senator and Representative shall
289 receive for attending each extraordinary session or called session
290 the sum of Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per day and mileage at
291 the same rate as per regular session. In addition to the above,
292 beginning on April 16, 1997, each Senator and Representative shall
293 receive the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00)
294 per month for expenses incidental to his office for every full
295 month of his term, except any month or major fraction thereof when
296 the Legislature is convened in regular or extraordinary session;
297 and payments shall be made to each Senator and Representative by
298 the State Treasurer between the first and tenth day of each month
299 following the month for which the payments are due. * * *

300 **[From and after January 1, 2000, this section shall read as**
301 **follows:]**

302 5-1-41. Beginning with the 1986 Regular Session of the
303 Legislature of the State of Mississippi, each Senator and
304 Representative of the Legislature shall receive as compensation at
305 each regular session the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00)
306 and the mileage allowance provided by Section 25-3-41, for each
307 mile of the distance by the most direct route usually traveled in
308 coming to and returning from the place where the Legislature sits.
309 Beginning on April 16, 1997, each Senator and Representative shall
310 receive for attending each extraordinary session or called session
311 the sum of Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per day and mileage at
312 the same rate as per regular session. In addition to the above,
313 beginning on April 16, 1997, each Senator and Representative and
314 the Lieutenant Governor shall receive the sum of One Thousand Five
315 Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per month for expenses incidental to
316 his office for every full month of his term, except any month or
317 major fraction thereof when the Legislature is convened in regular
318 or extraordinary session; and payments shall be made to each

319 Senator and Representative and the Lieutenant Governor by the
320 State Treasurer between the first and tenth day of each month
321 following the month for which the payments are due. * * *

322 SECTION 6. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
323 is directed to submit Sections 3 and 5 of this act, immediately
324 upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature
325 subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States
326 or to the United States District Court for the District of
327 Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights
328 Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

329 SECTION 7. Sections 1, 2 and 4 of this act shall take effect
330 and be in force from and after July 1, 1999. Sections 3 and 5 of
331 this act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1,
332 1999, if they are effectuated on or before that date under Section
333 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended. If
334 Sections 3 and 5 are effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
335 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, after July 1, 1999,
336 Section 3 and Section 5 shall take effect and be in force from and
337 after the date they are effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
338 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

**Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and
inserting in lieu thereof the following:**

12 REQUIREMENT THAT LEGISLATORS SIGN A WRITTEN REQUEST FOR THE 1997
