REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

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We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S.B. No. 3125: Appropriation; Finance & Admin. Consol.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as
6	may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
7	State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to defray the
8	expenses of the Department of Finance and Administration for the
9	fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999 and ending June 30, 2000
10	\$ 15,011,470.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
13	Treasury to the credit of the Department of Finance and
14	Administration for the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred
15	in the operation of the various offices of the department for the
16	fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999 and ending June 30, 2000
17	\$ 15,629,646.00.
18	SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions
19	of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized:

25	Provided that a report based on expenditures incurred during
26	the current and immediate-past fiscal years shall be provided to
27	each regularly scheduled legislative session. This report should
28	reflect expenditures as a result of the operation of the Robert E.
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29 Lee Building, the Woolfolk State Office Building, the Gartin and Sillers Buildings, the Capitol Buildings, the Central High School 30 31 Building, the 301 Building and other state buildings, and this report should contain any steps taken to reduce operating costs. 32 33 It is also the intention of the Legislature that no 34 state-owned aircraft shall be utilized by any person except for 35 official business only. 36 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, the amount of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00), or 37 38 so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be expended for premium payments for flood insurance on state-owned facilities. However, 39 no such premium shall be paid until reviewed and approved by the 40 Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property Management. 41 42 payments are to be made from accrued interest earnings from loans 43 under the Disaster Assistance Program. 44 SECTION 5. In addition to all other sums herein 45 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 46 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Tort Claims Fund 47 48 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Tort Claims Board in the administration of the Tort Claims Act for the fiscal year 49 beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000...... 50\$ 11,104,004.00. 51 52 SECTION 6. With the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 5, the following positions are authorized: 53 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 54 55 Full Time. Permanent: 56 Part Time. Time-Limited: Full Time. 57 58 Part Time. 59 SECTION 7. From the funds provided in this act, funds may be expended for the following purposes, in compliance with the 60 61 policies established by the State Personnel Board and any

conditions placed on such expenditures:

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- 64 shall be maintained within the constraints of the funds
- 65 appropriated herein.
- (b) Funds are provided to adjust the Variable
- 67 Compensation Plan, including realignment, to ensure that all
- 68 full-time employees with at least six (6) months of continuous
- 69 current service, as of June 30, 1999, receive an increase of One
- 70 Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). Funds are provided to
- 71 adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand
- 72 Dollars (\$1,000.00).
- 73 (c) If an employee is currently at or above the end
- 74 salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall
- 75 be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any
- 76 increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a
- 77 current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the
- 78 effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently
- 79 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above
- 80 during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase
- 81 effective the date of the rating.
- It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds
- 83 required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal
- 84 Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for
- 85 that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the
- 86 agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.
- Any transfers within each specific budget or escalations
- 88 shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and
- 89 procedures established by law.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 91 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 92 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 93 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 94 SECTION 8. The Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property
- 95 Management of the Office of General Services is hereby expressly
- 96 authorized and empowered to receive, budget and expend any state,
- 97 local or other source funds designated for supplemental funding of
- 98 construction and/or repairs and renovation projects.

- 99 SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the
- 100 following amounts are authorized to be spent out of the Statewide
- 101 Cost Allocation Fund No. 3143 by the Department of Finance and
- 102 Administration:
- 103 (a) One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00)
- 104 for the purpose of defraying computer expenses.
- 105 (b) Five Hundred Sixty Thousand Eight Hundred
- 106 Thirty-nine Dollars (\$560,839.00) for the purpose of defraying the
- 107 cost of the acquisition, development and implementation of the
- 108 Statewide Automated Accounting System.
- 109 (c) One Hundred Fifty-three Thousand Four Hundred
- 110 Dollars (\$153,400.00) for an imaging/electronic processing
- 111 feasibility study and initial phase of implementation.
- 112 SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Two
- 113 Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$275,000.00) is authorized
- 114 to be spent out of the Local Disaster Loan Fund No. 3144 by the
- 115 Department of Finance and Administration for the purpose of
- 116 defraying the cost of the Air Transport Services.
- 117 SECTION 11. The Office of Capitol Facilities, Department of
- 118 Finance and Administration, is hereby expressly authorized and
- 119 empowered to receive funds from state agencies for the rent of
- 120 office space in the Eldon Bolton Office Building in Biloxi,
- 121 Mississippi, and the State Service Center in Hattiesburg,
- 122 Mississippi. The Office of Capitol Facilities is further
- 123 authorized and empowered to budget and expend any such funds
- received to operate and maintain, and up to Five Dollars (\$5.00)
- 125 per square foot of rental receipts to finish tenant space, in the
- 126 Eldon Bolton Office Building in Biloxi, Mississippi, and the State
- 127 Service Center in Hattiesburg, Mississippi, as state office
- 128 buildings. Monies received for rent of such office space are to
- 129 be deposited in a special fund in the State Treasury. Any funds
- on hand at the end of the fiscal year shall lapse into the State
- 131 General Fund.
- 132 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 133 Department of Finance and Administration shall maintain complete

- 134 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
- 135 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
- in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
- 137 Year 1999. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
- 138 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2001 shall be
- 139 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
- 140 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
- 141 provided during the Fiscal Year 2000 budget request process.
- 142 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 143 positions currently assigned to the Department of Information
- 144 Technology Services for operation of the Mississippi Management
- 145 and Reporting System and paid by funds of the Department of
- 146 Finance and Administration be transferred to the Department of
- 147 Finance and Administration. The Executive Director of the
- 148 Department of Information Technology Services and the Executive
- 149 Director of the Department of Finance and Administration are
- 150 hereby authorized to effect such transfers as of July 1, 1999.
- 151 The Department of Finance and Administration is further authorized
- 152 to escalate the number of positions herein authorized up to but
- 153 not to exceed fifteen (15) positions for such transfers.
- This is a transfer of positions with no funds involved.
- 155 SECTION 14. Of the funds provided herein, Two Hundred
- 156 Ninety-eight Thousand Thirty-three Dollars (\$298,033.00) in State
- 157 General Funds and ten (10) positions are provided to Capitol
- 158 Facilities to improve and maintain the grounds of the Capitol
- 159 Complex.
- 160 SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in this act, funds in
- 161 the amount of Thirty-eight Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars
- 162 (\$38,250.00) are included to defray the cost of realigning the DFA
- 163 Budget Analyst IV positions (PIN 1772, 1778, 1773, and 1776) at
- an annualized cost not to exceed Six Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars
- 165 (\$6,900.00) for each position, and the DFA Budget Analyst Senior
- 166 position (PIN 1771) at an annualized cost not to exceed Ten
- 167 Thousand Six Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$10,650.00).
- 168 SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated in this act, funds in

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      the amount of One Hundred Thirty-six Thousand Four Hundred Twenty-
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      two Dollars ($136,422.00) are included to defray the cost of
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      realigning the General Services - Architect positions (PIN 1753,
      1757, 1764, 1766 and 9008), the General Services - Building
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      Inspector positions (PIN 1754, 1758, 1761, 1765, and 9036) and the
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      Buildings, Grounds, Real Property Management Bureau Assistant
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      Director position (PIN 1767) at an annualized cost not to exceed
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      Twelve Thousand Four Hundred Two Dollars ($12,402.00) for each
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     position.
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           SECTION 17.
                       In addition to all other sums herein
      appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
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      necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
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      General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of
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      Finance and Administration for the purpose of completing the
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      construction of the Dr. Eldon Langston Bolton State Office
      Building in Biloxi, Mississippi, for the period beginning upon
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      passage and through June 30, 2000.....$

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           SECTION 18. With the funds appropriated in this act, the
      Department of Finance and Administration shall spend not more than
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      Five Hundred Thousand Dollars ($500,000.00) to conduct and prepare
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      a study to determine whether there is a significant statistical
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      disparity between the qualified minority contractors in the State
      of Mississippi and the number of minority contractors actually
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      engaged by the State of Mississippi or the prime contractors of
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      the state.
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           SECTION 19.
                        The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
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      the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
      credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
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      warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
      Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
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     proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
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           SECTION 20. This act shall take effect and be in force from
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      and after July 1, 1999, except for Section 17 which shall take
