REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

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We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S.B. No. 3135: Appropriation; Jr. Colleges - Support.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

(1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may 5 SECTION 1. 6 be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid of the public 8 community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... \$97,279,172.00. 9 10 The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 11 Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the 12 13 aid of public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000...... 14 15\$ 34,570,727.00. 16 The money appropriated by this act shall be apportioned 17 as follows: 18 The State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall distribute to each of the public community and junior 19 20 colleges, out of any money appropriated from the State General 21 Fund, the sum of Three Hundred Sixty-four Thousand Twenty-two 22 Dollars (\$364,022.00) and out of any money appropriated from the Education Enhancement Fund, the sum of One Hundred Six Thousand 23 Six Hundred Ninety-seven Dollars (\$106,697.00). 24 25 (b) The remainder of the appropriation for public 26 community and junior colleges shall be distributed in twelve (12)

monthly installments beginning July 25, 1999, on the basis of the

number of full-time academic and technical public community and

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- 29 junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the
- 30 last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent
- 31 of the preceding year counting only those students who reside
- 32 within the State of Mississippi. Provided, however, that
- 33 technical students shall be weighted at 1.19 times that of
- 34 academic students.
- 35 The Director of the State Board for Community and Junior
- 36 Colleges shall visit each public community and junior college and
- 37 shall determine, on the basis of an audit of students, who shall
- 38 be counted in each college and shall certify the number to the
- 39 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.
- 40 If, pending determination of the full-time academic
- 41 enrollment of students at the public community and junior colleges
- 42 entitled to participate in this appropriation, as provided for in
- 43 this subsection, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges
- 44 shall find and determine that any such public or community junior
- 45 college does not have sufficient funds on hand for payment of the
- 46 necessary expenses of its operation for the period commencing
- 47 July 1, 1999, until distribution of the funds appropriated hereby,
- 48 then, in that event, the State Board for Community and Junior
- 49 Colleges is expressly authorized to make an advance to any such
- 50 public community or junior college or colleges not having
- 51 sufficient operating funds for such period from the funds
- 52 appropriated hereby; provided, however, that the amount of any
- 53 such advance to any one public community or junior college shall
- not exceed thirty-three percent (33%) of the amount of state
- 55 appropriated funds received by such public community or junior
- 56 college during the preceding fiscal year; and provided, further,
- 57 that the amount of any such advance shall be deducted from the pro
- 58 rata part of the funds appropriated hereby accruing to said public
- 59 community or junior college when enrollment has been ascertained
- 60 and distribution of funds is made.
- 61 (4) No part of the amount herein appropriated shall be used
- 62 by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for
- 63 administrative or other purposes except in the manner and to the

- 64 extent authorized in the act making an appropriation for the
- 65 expenses of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.
- 66 SECTION 2. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may
- 67 be necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the
- 68 State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support,
- 69 maintenance and equipping of vocational-technical departments in
- 70 the public community and junior colleges which meet the
- 71 requirements for vocational-technical education departments for
- 72 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30,
- 73 2000.....\$ 2,884,516.00.
- 74 (2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 75 necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the
- 76 Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the
- 77 support, maintenance and equipping of vocational-technical
- 78 departments in the public community and junior colleges which meet
- 79 the requirements for vocational-technical education departments
- 80 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending
- 81 June 30, 2000.....\$ 1,035,771.00.
- 82 (3) Such departments shall be open to students enrolled in
- 83 the institutions, and to other students who may qualify for such
- 84 courses, and to those meeting requirements for either civilian or
- 85 veteran rehabilitation, whether or not enrolled in such
- 86 institutions as regular students.
- 87 (4) Such funds shall be disbursed to such public community
- 88 and junior colleges on the basis of the full-time vocational
- 89 enrollment of each such public community and junior college as of
- 90 the last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its
- 91 equivalent of the preceding year, counting only students who
- 92 reside within the State of Mississippi.
- 93 (5) No part of the funds hereby appropriated shall be spent
- 94 for building or for regular academic instruction.
- 95 (6) The funds disbursed under the provisions of this act
- 96 shall be accounted for through the State Board for Community and
- 97 Junior Colleges.
- 98 SECTION 3. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may

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- (2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the support of part-time academic credit courses operated by public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000......\$ 4,952,470.00.
- 110 (3) These funds shall be disbursed by the State Board for
 111 Community and Junior Colleges to such public community and junior
 112 colleges as may qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time
 113 equivalency of part-time and summer academic students, counting
 114 only students who reside within the State of Mississippi.
- 115 SECTION 4. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may 116 be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for 117 118 Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of paying for nursing faculty supplement, in accordance with Section 37-129-1 et 119 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, and aid to nursing education for 120 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000 121\$ 5,790,106.00. 122
- 123 (2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 124 necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the 125 126 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of 127 paying for nursing faculty supplement, in accordance with Section 37-129-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, and aid to nursing 128 129 education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending 130 June 30, 2000.....\$ 2,079,109.00.
- SECTION 5. The following public community and junior

 colleges which qualify shall participate in the funds provided by

 Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of this act:

- 134 Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln Community College,
- 135 East Central Community College, East Mississippi Community
- 136 College, Hinds Community College District, Holmes Community
- 137 College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior College,
- 138 Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta Community College,
- 139 Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College District, Northeast
- 140 Mississippi Community College, Northwest Mississippi Community
- 141 College, Pearl River Community College, and Southwest Mississippi
- 142 Community College.
- 143 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that none
- of the General Funds appropriated herein shall be expended for the
- 145 purpose of paying salaries, wages, and fringe benefits of any
- 146 public community and junior college employee who is serving as a
- 147 member of the State of Mississippi Legislature.
- 148 SECTION 7. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 149 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
- 150 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated to the State
- 151 Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of hiring
- 152 nursing and allied health teachers, awarding interest free nursing
- and allied health student loans and providing instructional
- 154 support for the Rural Health Corps for the fiscal year beginning
- 155 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000 \$ 1,200,000.00.
- Of the funds appropriated in this section, One Million Two
- 157 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,200,000.00) shall be derived from
- 158 Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section
- 159 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
- The funds appropriated in this section shall be allocated as
- 161 follows:
- 162 (1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen (15)
- 163 public community and junior colleges.
- 164 (2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of
- 165 full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and
- 166 junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the
- last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent
- 168 of the preceding year counting only those students who reside

169 within the State of Mississippi.

The public community and junior colleges shall prepare and
make available to the Legislature and the Legislative Budget
Office an accounting of expenditures and program accomplishments
of the Rural Health Corps Program for each of the individual
community and junior colleges in a format and manner prescribed by
the Legislative Budget Office.

SECTION 8. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid of the public community and junior colleges, to fund life and health insurance, for all employees of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000.

\$ 9,836,976.00.

The funds allocated in this section shall only be used to participate in the State and School Employees' Life and Health Insurance Plan. Any funds appropriated in these sections which are not expended during the fiscal year shall be carried forward for the same purposes during the next succeeding fiscal year.

The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from the Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 10. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of Sign Language Interpreter Training at the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning

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July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000...... $ 179,050.00.
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          The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from
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     the Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section
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     27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
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          SECTION 11. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
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     necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
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     General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for
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     Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the
     cost of the Education Technology Program at the public community
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     and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999,
     and ending June 30, 2000..... $ 3,599,160.00.
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          SECTION 12. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
     necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
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     Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the
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     purpose of defraying the cost of the Education Technology Program
     at the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year
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     beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000......
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      .....$ 1,500,000.00.
          The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from
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     the Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section 27-
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     103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
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          SECTION 13. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
     necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
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     Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
     State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of
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     defraying the cost of servicing the debt on bonds issued for the
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     Education Technology Program at the community and junior colleges
     for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending
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     June 30, 2000.....$ 3,148,050.00.
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          The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from
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     Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section
     27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
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          SECTION 14. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
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     necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
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Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the

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- 239 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of
- 240 making capital improvements to the grounds and facilities of the
- 241 community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning
- 242 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000.....\$ 1,500,000.00.
- 243 The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from
- 244 Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section
- 245 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
- The funds appropriated in this section shall be allocated as

- 248 (1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen
- 249 (15) public community and junior colleges.
- 250 (2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of
- 251 full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and
- junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the
- 253 last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent
- of the preceding year counting only those students who reside
- 255 within the State of Mississippi.
- 256 SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- of this act, it is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 258 amount of Nine Million Fifty-six Thousand Five Hundred Forty-one
- Dollars (\$9,056,541.00) shall be used to award salary increases
- 260 for faculty of the public comunity and junior colleges and the
- 261 amount of Seven Million One Hundred Fifteen Thousand Eight Hundred
- 262 Fifty-three Dollars (\$7,115,853.00) shall be used to award salary
- 263 increases for non-faculty staff.
- SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 (2),
- 265 2 (2), 3 (2), and 4 (2), Twenty-eight Million Five Hundred Twenty-
- 266 three Thousand Three Hundred Seventy-three Dollars
- 267 (\$28,523,373.00) shall be derived from Education Enhancement Funds
- deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi
- 269 Code of 1972 and Fourteen Million One Hundred Fourteen Thousand
- 270 Seven Hundred Four Dollars (\$14,114,704.00) shall be derived from
- 271 Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section
- 272 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 273 SECTION 17. Should revenues generated and deposited to the

274	Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203 (1),		
275	Mississippi Code of 1972, and apportioned pursuant to Section		
276	37-61-33 (6), Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds		
277	appropriated herein from said source, the State Board for		
278	Community and Junior Colleges shall notify the Department of		
279	Finance and Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced		
280	to insure that expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.		
281	SECTION 18. A Mississippi Prepaid Affordable College Tuition

286	37-155-5(d)(iii).		
287	SECTION 19. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance		
288	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of		
289	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized		
290	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the		
291	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,		
292	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
