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         SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in this act, not less
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- 66 than Nineteen Million Six Hundred Twenty-eight Thousand Three
- 67 Hundred Ninety-seven Dollars (\$19,628,397.00) shall be allocated
- 68 for the support and maintenance of the Mississippi Resident
- 69 Tuition Assistance Grant Program, the Mississippi Eminent Scholars
- 70 Grant Program and the Higher Education Legislative Plan.
- 71 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Four

- 89 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that of

- 94 necessary, contingent upon the availability of qualified

- 108 all students eligible for financial aid under the provisions of
- 109 Sections 37-107-1 through 37-107-7 and Sections 37-108-1 through
- 110 37-108-5, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 111 SECTION 10. All funds provided for in this act shall be
- 112 accounted for in a detailed statement showing when, to whom, and
- 113 for what purpose applied, and this statement shall be submitted at
- 114 the next regular session of the Legislature within ten (10) days
- 115 after the convening thereof. A report of loans made and receipt
- 116 of repayment of loans to the fund shall be reported. The amount
- 117 of repayment that is in arrears shall also be included. Such
- 118 report shall include the number of students at each institution
- 119 receiving financial assistance and the amount of such assistance,
- 120 and an estimate of the financial requirement of the various loan
- 121 programs for the next year. No public or private institution of
- 122 higher learning receiving funds under the respective provisions of
- 123 this act, for the purpose of issuing scholarship grants or loans,
- 124 shall issue any official transcripts for any persons who have any
- 125 amount of repayment in arrears on that date such official
- 126 transcript is requested.
- 127 Furthermore, all funds received and expended shall be
- 128 reported and otherwise accounted for in accordance with the
- provisions of Section 37-143-21, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 130 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 131 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2001 shall be submitted to
- 132 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 133 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 134 during the Fiscal Year 2000 budget request process.
- 135 SECTION 12. Any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and

136	paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be	
137	in compliance with Section 109 of	the Constitution of the State of
138	Mississippi and Section 25-4-103, Mississippi Code of 1972.	
139	SECTION 13. Should revenues generated and deposited to the	
140	Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203 (1),	
141	Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds appropriated herein	
142	from said source, the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of	
143	Higher Learning shall notify the Department of Finance and	
144	Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced to insure	
145	that expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.	
146	SECTION 14. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by	
147	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the	
148	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon	
149	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal	
150	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the	
151	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law	
152	SECTION 15. This act shall take effect and be in force from	
153	and after July 1, 1999.
