REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S.B. No. 3143: Appropriation; Agriculture & Commerce - Support and Grain Div.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
8	defraying the expenses of the State Department of Agriculture and
9	Commerce Support and Grain Division for the fiscal year beginning
10	July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000 \$ 8,637,464.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
13	source funds, which are collected by or otherwise become available
14	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department
15	of Agriculture and Commerce, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
16	1999, and ending June 30, 2000
17	\$ 2,158,900.00.
18	The funds authorized for expenditure under the provisions of
19	this section include subscription fees produced from the Market
20	Bulletin and admission fees produced from the Mississippi
21	Agriculture and Forestry Museum.
22	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
23	Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall
24	be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of
25	expenditure:

94	Year 2001 do not ex	ceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for
95	that purpose unless	programs or positions are added to the
96	agency's budget by	the Mississippi Legislature.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with

- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 100 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 101 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 102 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 103 SECTION 4. The funds appropriated and authorized to be
- 104 expended under the provisions of this act shall be expended for
- 105 the purpose of defraying all expenses incurred by the State
- 106 Department of Agriculture and Commerce in the operation of all
- 107 programs and activities (except operation of the State Lime Plants
- 108 and the Division of Plant Industry, Veterinary Laboratory, Pink
- 109 Bollworm-Plant Quarantine Inspection Stations and Fire Ant
- 110 Program) authorized to be conducted and carried on by said
- 111 department; including, but not limited to: the administration of
- the Feed, Fertilizer and Dairy Act; the Weights and Measure Act;
- 113 the Meat Inspection Act of 1968; the Mississippi Pure Seed Law;
- and the following additional programs and activities: enforcement
- of the egg law; publication and distribution of the Mississippi
- 116 Market Bulletin, agricultural statistics, market news service at
- 117 Stoneville, Mississippi; operation of the grain laboratory;
- inspection, grading and certifying of fruits, vegetables, hay,
- 119 grain, meat and meat products, milk and dairy products, pecans,
- 120 seed, syrup, and port grain inspection.
- 121 SECTION 5. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and
- 122 Commerce shall from time to time adjust the schedule of fees
- 123 collected under the grain inspection program so that the revenue
- 124 therefrom equals or exceeds the operational costs of the grain
- inspection program and the expenses incurred in complying with the
- 126 requirements of the United States Grain Standards Act, P. L.
- 127 94-583.
- 128 SECTION 6. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and
- 129 Commerce, with the assistance of the State Department of Audit and
- 130 the Department of Finance and Administration, shall establish non-
- 131 budgeted enterprise funds for all "for profit" activities related
- 132 to the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. The funds

133	shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted
134	accounting principles and regulations prescribed by the Department
135	of Finance and Administration.
136	SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that any
137	regulations promulgated by the State Department of Agriculture and
138	Commerce concerning the labeling of liming materials include the
139	actual analysis of said lime. Nothing in the regulations shall
140	prevent any manufacturer from selling his products to any consumer
141	as long as the labeling is accurate.
142	SECTION 8. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
143	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
144	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of
145	Agriculture and Commerce for the support of the Beaver Control
146	Program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending
147	June 30, 2000\$ 500,000.00.
148	SECTION 9. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
149	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
150	Treasury to the credit of the Beaver Control Program, to the
151	Department of Agriculture and Commerce for the support of the
152	Beaver Control Program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999,
153	and ending June 30, 2000\$ 402,216.00.
154	The special funds authorized in this Section for the Beaver
155	Control Program are to be derived as follows: Two Hundred Twenty-
156	seven Thousand Six Hundred Eight Dollars (\$227,608.00) from
157	counties; One Hundred Seventy-four Thousand Six Hundred Eight
158	Dollars (\$174,608.00) from fees charged private
159	persons/organizations.
160	SECTION 10. In addition to all other sums heretofore
161	appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
162	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
163	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Mississippi
164	Department of Agriculture and Commerce for the purpose of
165	defraying the cost of the Boar Goat Show in Bay Springs,
166	Mississippi, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1999
167	\$ 7,500.00.

SECTION 11. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 169 170 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 171 172 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 173 SECTION 12. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1999, except for Section 10 which shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
