We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S.B. No. 3159: Appropriation; Dept. of Corrections - Support and Reimb. Local Confinement.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

6	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be

13	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special						
14	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi						
15	Department of Corrections which is collected by or otherwise						
16	become available for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the						
17	Department, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending						
18	June 30, 2000\$ 16,263,220.00.						
19	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of						
20	Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall						
21	be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of

- 104 (b) Funds are provided to adjust the Variable
- 105 Compensation Plan, including realignment, to ensure that all
- 106 full-time employees with at least six (6) months of continuous
- 107 current service, as of June 30, 1999, receive an increase of One
- 108 Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). Funds are provided to
- 109 adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand
- 110 Dollars (\$1,000.00).
- 111 (c) If an employee is currently at or above the end
- 112 salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall
- 113 be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any
- 114 increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a
- 115 current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the
- 116 effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently
- 117 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above
- 118 during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase
- 119 effective the date of the rating.
- 120 It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds
- 121 required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal
- 122 Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for
- 123 that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the
- 124 agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.
- 125 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 126 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 128 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 129 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 130 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 131 SECTION 4. In addition to the salary adjustments provided in
- 132 Section 3 (b) of this act, from the funds provided herein, the
- 133 Mississippi Department of Corrections may, with the assistance of

           SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
      and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, it is the intention
163

     of the Legislature that any contractual service payments made by

      the department to defray medical expenses for inmates shall be at
      the currently established Medicaid reimbursement rate; however, if

     hospital and medical providers will not contract at the Medicaid

reimbursement rate, the Department of Corrections may enter into a

- 170 SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
- 171 none shall be expended for personnel housing under the
- 172 jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections unless the
- 173 department shall collect a reasonable rent, after a finding of
- 174 fact as to what is a reasonable rent, and/or the cost of utilities
- 175 furnished to said housing, except that the Superintendent of the
- 176 Central Mississippi Correctional Facility may be provided with a
- 177 housing expense allowance in lieu of being furnished with a
- 178 dwelling house. The Department of Corrections shall not pay for
- 179 the installation or monthly service of any telephone installed in
- 180 a staff residence under its jurisdiction.
- SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
- 182 and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, payment may be
- 183 authorized for court ordered attorney fees and any accrued
- 184 interest subject to the approval of the Office of the Attorney
- 185 General.
- SECTION 8. No part of the funds herein appropriated shall be
- 187 used for the purpose of returning escaped state convicts to the
- 188 State Penitentiary from a distance of over one hundred (100) miles
- 189 beyond the borders of the state, except upon approval of the
- 190 Governor in each specific case.
- 191 SECTION 9. None of the money herein appropriated shall be
- 192 paid to any person who by the provision of Section 47-5-47,
- 193 Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, is prohibited from being an
- 194 employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections. The State
- 195 Department of Finance and Administration shall at least annually
- 196 make a report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Performance
- 197 Evaluation and Expenditure Review and to the Attorney General
- 198 stating the name of any person prohibited under the provisions of
- 199 Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, from being
- 200 an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections who has
- 201 during the preceding year received any money herein appropriated.
- 202 In the event that any such person prohibited as hereinabove
- 203 provided from receiving funds herein appropriated should receive

- 204 any of said funds, the Attorney General shall immediately commence
- 205 action to recover the monies so paid to said person and to enjoin
- 206 the further employment of said person at the Mississippi
- 207 Department of Corrections.
- 208 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 209 Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections may
- 210 transfer between the divisions of Support, Medical Services,
- 211 Parole Board, Farming Operations and Local Confinement, both funds
- 212 and positions not to exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the
- 213 authorized budgets in the aggregate. The Commissioner of the
- 214 Mississippi Department of Corrections shall submit written
- 215 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office
- 216 and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the
- 217 fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the
- 218 transfer. It is further the intention of the Legislature that no
- 219 transfer may be made under the provisions of this section to
- 220 increase or decrease the salaries category of any budget set forth
- 221 in the original appropriations made under this act, but may be
- 222 used to contract with counties to house state inmates in
- facilities authorized by Section 47-5-931, Mississippi Code of
- 224 1972. It is further the intention of the Legislature that any
- 225 transfers made under the provisions of this paragraph shall be for
- the removal of state inmates from county jails or of an emergency
- 227 nature.
- 228 SECTION 11. It is the intent of the Legislature that all
- 229 prisoners at Parchman shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per
- 230 day, excluding prisoners with a physical disability or those
- 231 incarcerated in maximum security.
- SECTION 12. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 233 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 234 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 235 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 236 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
- 237 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
- 238 performance measures provided below:

276	Corrections for the purpose of paying the expenses of counties for
277	holding state prisoners in county jails, for the period beginning
278	July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000
279	\$ 9,665,044.00.
280	SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
281	of Section 2, telephone commission funds in an amount not to
282	exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) are provided and shall
283	be available to the Department of Corrections to defray the
284	expenses associated with contracts for certain new prison beds
285	that will become available to the Department of Corrections during
286	Fiscal Year 2000, prior to any other allocation of said funds.
287	SECTION 15. With the funds provided in this act, it is the
288	intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Department of
289	Corrections pay Gwen Chew Two Thousand Six Hundred Eleven Dollars
290	and Thirty-one Cents (\$2,611.31) for services provided in prior
291	fiscal years. This payment will be considered complete and total
292	compensation for prior services provided by Gwen Chew.
293	SECTION 16. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
294	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
295	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
296	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
297	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
298	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
