It is the intention of the Legislature that the

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317 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall 318 first use special funds to the greatest extent possible to defray 319 the costs of providing remediation at the state-supported 320 institutions of higher learning.

SECTION 10. None of the funds appropriated by this act shall 321 322 be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the Board 323 324 of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, or any of the powers or duties of any institution under the jurisdiction of 325 the board of trustees, that are authorized by the Mississippi 326 327 Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules or regulations that implement state or federal law. 328

SECTION 11. The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 329 Higher Learning shall submit to the Committee on Appropriations of 330 331 both houses of the Mississippi Legislature by January 1, 2000, a consolidated report for all the several institutions under its 332 333 jurisdiction, on forms and in a manner to be prescribed by the 334 Legislative Budget Committee, which reflects the anticipated current restricted fund revenues for the 2000 fiscal year, and the 335 336 budgeted use of such current restricted funds by major object category. For purposes of this section, the term "current 337 338 restricted funds" shall be defined as those public funds available for financing university operations which are limited by the 339 340 donor, or by an agency external to the Board of Trustees of State 341 Institutions of Higher Learning, to specific purposes, programs, departments or schools, but shall not include endowment funds or 342 343 private gifts exempted under the provisions of Section 27-103-5, 344 Mississippi Code of 1972.

345 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 346 budget requests of the individual institutes, laboratories and 347 programs consolidated in this bill for Fiscal Year 2001 shall be 348 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format

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349 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 350 provided during the Fiscal Year 2000 budget request process.

351 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 352 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning 353 continue to review, and eliminate when possible, duplicating 354 programs and degrees in the existing institutions of higher 355 learning in this state.

356 SECTION 14. No state appropriations or student tuition and 357 fee receipts, except those specifically charged for the provision 358 of the services, shall be used to support auxiliary enterprises, 359 with the exception of intercollegiate athletics at a level 360 designated by the board of trustees. It is the intent of the 361 Legislature that auxiliary enterprises shall be self-supporting; 362 and that deficits not be taken from funds intended for instruction 363 and academic programs.

364 SECTION 15. However, none of the funds herein appropriated 365 shall be spent to defray tuition cost or subsidize in any way the 366 direct cost of education, ordinarily paid by the student, of any 367 nonresident alien enrolled in any state-supported institution of 368 higher learning in the State of Mississippi. However, this will not apply to any nonresident alien student if the United States 369 370 has a reciprocal agreement with their country on subsidizing the 371 education of a United States citizen student.

372 SECTION 16. The Board of Trustees shall report yearly to the 373 Legislature the institution compliance with Section 97-11-51, 374 Mississippi Code of 1972, which prohibits deficit spending.

375 SECTION 17. Any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and 376 paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be 377 in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of 378 Mississippi and Section 25-4-103, Mississippi Code of 1972.

379 SECTION 18. Should revenues generated and deposited to the 380 Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1),

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Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds appropriated herein from said source, the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall notify the Department of Finance and Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced to insure that expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.

386 SECTION 19. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 387 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 388 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 389 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 390 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 391 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted 392 performance measures provided below:

The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 463 464 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 465 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 466 467 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 468 469 SECTION 21. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1999. 470

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
