96 From the funds provided in the budget category "Personal 97 Services: Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits," funds may be 98 expended for the following purposes, in compliance with the 99 policies established by the State Personnel Board and any 100 conditions placed on such expenditures:

101 (a) The components of the Variable Compensation Plan
102 shall be maintained within the constraints of the funds
103 appropriated herein.

(b) Funds are provided to adjust the Variable
Compensation Plan, including realignment, to ensure that all
full-time employees with at least six (6) months of continuous
current service, as of June 30, 1999, receive an increase of One
Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). Funds are provided to
adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand
Dollars (\$1,000.00).

(c) If an employee is currently at or above the end 111 112 salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any 113 increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a 114 115 current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently 116 117 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase 118 effective the date of the rating. 119

120 It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds 121 required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal 122 Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for

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123 that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the 124 agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.

125 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 126 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law.

127 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 128 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 129 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 130 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

131 SECTION 4. In addition to the salary adjustments provided in 132 Section 3 (b) of this act, from the funds provided herein, the 133 Mississippi Department of Corrections may, with the assistance of 134 the State Personnel Board, implement a reorganization of the 135 following correctional personnel positions:

- 138 Major

- 141 Correctional Officer IV
- 142 Correctional Officer III

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None of the increase authorized above shall be implemented before all Correctional Officers Trainee I, II, III and IV have received an increase. It is the intention of the Legislature that a complete reporting of the implementation of this reorganization be provided to the House Appropriations Committee, the Senate Appropriations Committee and the Joint Legislative Budget Committee.

162 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, it is the intention 163 164 of the Legislature that any contractual service payments made by 165 the department to defray medical expenses for inmates shall be at the currently established Medicaid reimbursement rate; however, if 166 167 hospital and medical providers will not contract at the Medicaid reimbursement rate, the Department of Corrections may enter into a 168 169 negotiated contract.

170 SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 171 none shall be expended for personnel housing under the 172 jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections unless the department shall collect a reasonable rent, after a finding of 173 174 fact as to what is a reasonable rent, and/or the cost of utilities 175 furnished to said housing, except that the Superintendent of the 176 Central Mississippi Correctional Facility may be provided with a housing expense allowance in lieu of being furnished with a 177 dwelling house. The Department of Corrections shall not pay for 178 179 the installation or monthly service of any telephone installed in a staff residence under its jurisdiction. 180

181 SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 182 and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, payment may be 183 authorized for court ordered attorney fees and any accrued 184 interest subject to the approval of the Office of the Attorney 185 General.

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6 SECTION 8. No part of the funds herein appropriated shall be

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187 used for the purpose of returning escaped state convicts to the 188 State Penitentiary from a distance of over one hundred (100) miles 189 beyond the borders of the state, except upon approval of the 190 Governor in each specific case.

191 SECTION 9. None of the money herein appropriated shall be 192 paid to any person who by the provision of Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, is prohibited from being an 193 194 employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections. The State 195 Department of Finance and Administration shall at least annually 196 make a report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Performance 197 Evaluation and Expenditure Review and to the Attorney General stating the name of any person prohibited under the provisions of 198 Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, from being 199 200 an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections who has 201 during the preceding year received any money herein appropriated. 202 In the event that any such person prohibited as hereinabove 203 provided from receiving funds herein appropriated should receive 204 any of said funds, the Attorney General shall immediately commence 205 action to recover the monies so paid to said person and to enjoin 206 the further employment of said person at the Mississippi Department of Corrections. 207

SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 208 209 Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections may 210 transfer between the divisions of Support, Medical Services, 211 Parole Board, Farming Operations and Local Confinement, both funds and positions not to exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the 212 213 authorized budgets in the aggregate. The Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections shall submit written 214 215 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office 216 and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the 217 218 transfer. It is further the intention of the Legislature that no

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219 transfer may be made under the provisions of this section to 220 increase or decrease the salaries category of any budget set forth 221 in the original appropriations made under this act, but may be 222 used to contract with counties to house state inmates in facilities authorized by Section 47-5-931, Mississippi Code of 223 224 1972. It is further the intention of the Legislature that any transfers made under the provisions of this paragraph shall be for 225 226 the removal of state inmates from county jails or of an emergency 227 nature.

228 SECTION 11. It is the intent of the Legislature that all 229 prisoners at Parchman shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per 230 day, excluding prisoners with a physical disability or those 231 incarcerated in maximum security.

232 SECTION 12. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 233 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 234 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 235 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 236 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 237 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted 238 performance measures provided below:

In addition to all other sums herein 273 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 274 275 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 276 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of 277 Corrections for the purpose of paying the expenses of counties for 278 holding state prisoners in county jails, for the period beginning 279 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 280\$ 9,665,044.00. 281 SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 282 of Section 2, telephone commission funds in an amount not to

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exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) are provided and shall be available to the Department of Corrections to defray the expenses associated with contracts for certain new prison beds that will become available to the Department of Corrections during Fiscal Year 2000, prior to any other allocation of said funds.

SECTION 15. With the funds provided in this act, it is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Department of Corrections pay Gwen Chew Two Thousand Six Hundred Eleven Dollars and Thirty-one Cents (\$2,611.31) for services provided in prior fiscal years. This payment will be considered complete and total compensation for prior services provided by Gwen Chew.

294 SECTION 16. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 295 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 296 297 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 298 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 299 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 300 SECTION 17. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1999. 301

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
