Pending AMENDMENT No. 1 PROPOSED TO

House Bill NO. 333

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 10 SECTION 1. Section 17-23-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 11 amended as follows:
- 12 17-23-1. (1) There is established a rural fire truck
- 13 acquisition assistance program to be administered by the
- 14 Department of Insurance for the purpose of assisting counties and
- 15 municipalities in the acquisition of fire trucks.
- 16 (2) There is created in the State Treasury a special fund to
- 17 be designated as the "Rural Fire Truck Fund." The Legislature may
- 18 appropriate during the 1999 Regular Session an amount not to
- 19 exceed Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00), or that amount
- 20 obligated by the Department of Insurance, from the State General
- 21 Fund to such special fund, which sum shall be added to the
- 22 remainder of the money transferred on July 1, 1995, and
- 23 $\underline{\text{appropriated}}$ during the 1996 $\underline{\text{and 1998}}$ Regular Sessions to the
- 24 Rural Fire Truck Fund. * * * Such monies as are deposited into
- 25 the fund under the provisions of this section may be available
- 26 after the 1999 Regular Session and such monies must be obligated
- 27 by December 31, 2000, upon legislative appropriation, and upon
- 28 requisition therefor by the Commissioner of Insurance, in
- 29 accordance with the provisions of this section. Unexpended
- 30 amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall

- 31 not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on
- 32 amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund.
- 33 It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of
- 34 Insurance continue to accept applications from the counties for
- 35 fire trucks from the additional funds authorized by this
- 36 subsection. The Department of Insurance shall include these funds
- 37 in the fiscal years 2000 and 2001 budget requests.
- 38 (3) (a) A county that meets the requirements provided
- 39 herein may receive an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Ten
- 40 Thousand Dollars (\$210,000.00) as provided in subparagraphs (i),
- 41 (ii), (iii) and (iv) of this paragraph, and such amount shall be
- 42 divided equally with not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars
- 43 (\$50,000.00) per fire truck. Monies distributed under this
- 44 chapter shall be expended only for the purchase of new fire trucks
- 45 and such trucks must meet the National Fire Protection Association
- 46 (NFPA) standards in the 1900 series. Provided, however, that not
- 47 more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per county from the
- 48 monies distributed under this chapter shall be made available by
- 49 the Mississippi Department of Insurance exclusively for the
- 50 purchase, operation, upkeep and training of personnel necessary
- 51 for the operation of defibrillators by the volunteer fire
- 52 <u>departments in the State of Mississippi.</u>
- (i) Any county that has not applied for a fire
- 54 truck under this section is eligible to submit applications for
- 55 <u>four (4)</u> fire trucks at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars
- 56 (\$50,000.00) per truck or a total of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 57 (\$200,000.00).
- 58 (ii) Any county that has received one (1) fire
- 59 truck under this section is eligible to submit applications for
- 60 three (3) fire trucks at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars
- 61 (\$50,000.00) per truck or a total of One Hundred Fifty Thousand
- 62 <u>Dollars (\$150,000.00)</u>.
- (iii) Any county that has received two (2) fire

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- 64 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for
- 65 $\underline{\text{two (2)}}$ fire trucks or a total of not more than $\underline{\text{One Hundred}}$
- 66 Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00).
- 67 (iv) Any county that has received three (3) fire
- 68 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for
- 69 one (1) fire truck or a total of not more than Fifty Thousand
- 70 <u>Dollars (\$50,000.00)</u>.
- 71 (b) The board of supervisors of the county shall submit
- 72 its request for the receipt of monies to the Department of
- 73 Insurance. A committee composed of the Commissioner of Insurance,
- 74 the State Fire Coordinator, the Director of the Rating Bureau and
- 75 the Director of the State Fire Academy shall review the requests
- 76 by the boards of supervisors and shall determine whether the
- 77 county or municipality for which the board of supervisors has
- 78 requested a truck meets the requirements of eligibility under this
- 79 chapter.
- 80 (c) To be eligible to receive monies under this
- 81 chapter:
- 82 (i) A county or municipality must pledge to set
- 83 aside or dedicate each year as matching funds, for a period not to
- 84 extend over ten (10) years, local funds in an amount equal to or
- 85 not less than one-tenth (1/10) of the amount of monies for which
- 86 it is requesting distribution from the Rural Fire Truck Fund,
- 87 which pledged monies may be derived from local ad valorem tax
- 88 authorized by law or from any other funds available to the county
- 89 or municipality, except for those funds received by municipalities
- 90 or counties from the Municipal Fire Protection Fund or the County
- 91 Volunteer Fire Department Fund, as defined in Sections 83-1-37 and
- 92 83-1-39.
- 93 (ii) A municipality must provide adequate
- 94 documentation of its contract with the county that requires the
- 95 municipality to provide fire protection in rural areas. The term
- 96 "rural areas" means any area within the county located outside the

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- 97 boundaries of an incorporated municipality or any incorporated
- 98 municipality with a population of two thousand five hundred
- 99 (2,500) or less.
- 100 (d) The Department of Insurance shall maintain an
- 101 accurate record of all monies distributed to counties and
- 102 municipalities and the number of fire trucks purchased and the
- 103 cost for each fire truck, such records to be kept separate from
- 104 other records of the Department of Insurance; notify counties and
- 105 municipalities of the rural fire truck acquisition assistance
- 106 program and the requirements for them to become eligible to
- 107 participate; adopt and promulgate such rules and regulations as
- 108 may be necessary and desirable to implement the provisions of this
- 109 chapter; and file with the Legislature on or before January 2,
- 110 1999, and July 1, 1999, a report detailing how monies made
- 111 available under this chapter were distributed and spent during the
- 112 preceding portion of the fiscal year in each county and
- 113 municipality, the number of fire trucks purchased, the counties
- 114 and municipalities making such purchases and the cost of each fire
- 115 truck purchased.
- 116 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 117 and after July 1, 1999.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 17-23-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW CERTAIN COUNTIES TO APPLY FOR THE FOURTH ROUND OF FIRE TRUCKS UNDER THE RURAL FIRE TRUCK ACQUISITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM;
- TO PROVIDE FOR AN ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION OF MONIES TO THE RURAL FIRE TRUCK FUND DURING THE 1999 REGULAR SESSION; TO AUTHORIZE A
- 6 CERTAIN PORTION OF SUCH FUNDS FOR THE PURCHASE AND OPERATION OF
- 7 DEFIBRILLATORS BY VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENTS; AND FOR RELATED
- 8 PURPOSES.
