18	shall be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of

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36 From the funds provided in the budget category "Personal 37 Services: Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits," funds may be 38 expended for the following purposes, in compliance with the 39 policies established by the State Personnel Board and any 40 conditions placed on such expenditures:

41 (a) The components of the Variable Compensation Plan
42 shall be maintained within the constraints of the funds
43 appropriated herein.

(b) Funds are provided to adjust the Variable
Compensation Plan, including realignment, to ensure that all
full-time employees with at least six (6) months of continuous
current service, as of June 30, 1999, receive an increase of One
Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). Funds are provided to
adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand
Dollars (\$1,000.00).

51 (c) If an employee is currently at or above the end salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall 52 53 be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any 54 increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a 55 current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently 56 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above 57 58 during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase 59 effective the date of the rating.

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It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.

65 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 66 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

71 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi 72 Department of Transportation under the provisions of Section 1 and authorized for expenditure in Section 2, the following amounts 73 74 shall be available for expenditure in the program budgets as 75 required by Section 27-103-127, Mississippi Code of 1972: 76 Administration and Other Expenses.....\$ 46,719,095.00 77 Construction.....\$ 665,299,894.00 Maintenance.....\$ 132,213,903.00 78 79 Debt Service.....\$ 27,020,000.00 80 Law Enforcement.....\$ 8,765,992.00 81 Aeronautics and Rails.....\$ 8,964,595.00 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and 82 authorized for expenditure in Section 2, it is the intention of 83 84 the Legislature that One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and 85 86 Parks for the Beaver Control or Eradication Program during the

87 Fiscal Year 2000.

SECTION 5. With the funds provided herein, it is the intention of the Legislature that the department set aside One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for the Emergency Contingency Fund. These funds will be taken from existing funds at the department's discretion from July 1, 1999, through March 31, 2000,

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93 at which time any unexpended funds can be utilized by the 94 department for normal operations. These funds may be used for the 95 correcting of hazardous road conditions due to inclement weather 96 or acts of God.

97 SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi 98 Department of Transportation, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars 99 (\$300,000.00) shall be used for the Statewide Litter Prevention 100 Program.

101 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 102 Mississippi Department of Transportation shall have the authority 103 to escalate and expend funds from any proceeds arising from 104 participation in drug seizure activities not to exceed Fifty 105 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00).

106 SECTION 8. Of the construction funds appropriated in Section 107 1 and allocated in Section 2, it is the intention of the Legislature that priority shall be given in letting paving 108 109 contracts on grade, drain and bridge projects which have been 110 completed for six (6) months or more. This action will not prohibit the Department of Transportation from letting paving 111 112 contracts on grade, drain and bridge projects which have been completed for less than six (6) months. 113

SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and allocated in Section 2, it is the intention of the Legislature that an amount no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall be utilized to repair and maintain welcome centers, hospitality centers and rest areas located on the highways of Mississippi.

SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the Department of Transportation may transfer between the various programs authorized in Section 3 funds not to exceed five percent (5%) of the total funds authorized in Section 1, except that transfers cannot be made into the "Administration and Other Expense Program." The Executive

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Director of the Department of Transportation shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the transfer.

131 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 132 Department of Transportation be allowed to escalate its budget in 133 the "Capital Outlay" major object of expenditure and the 134 appropriate corresponding program, with funds generated as a 135 result of third party damages an amount not to exceed Two Million 136 Dollars (\$2,000,000.00).

SECTION 12. With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Transportation shall provide a red light at the intersection of Highway 61 and Beatline Road at Tunica.

141 SECTION 13. Of the funds herein appropriated, funds not to 142 exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) are provided to 143 make the necessary repairs and renovations to the rest stop 144 located at Pocahontas.

145 SECTION 14. Of the funds herein appropriated, funds in the 146 amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) are provided 147 to construct turn lanes to Highway 145 to improve safety and 148 accessibility to Saltillo High School at Tupelo.

SECTION 15. With the funds herein appropriated, the Department of Transportation may implement, through the State Personnel Board, a reorganization of railroad inspectors using the same guidelines that were used to restructure the Weight Enforcement Division of the Mississippi Department of

154 Transportation authorized in fiscal year 1999.

155 SECTION 16. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 156 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 157 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 158 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

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Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. SECTION 17. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1999.

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
