1	AMEND by deleting lines 162 and 163, and inserting in lieu
2	thereof the following:
3 4	SECTION 3. Section 25-3-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
5	amended as follows:
6	25-3-35. (1) The annual salaries of the following judges
7	are fixed as follows, to begin at the commencement of the next
8	term of office immediately succeeding the existing term:
9	Chief Justice of the Supreme Court \$108,400.00
0	Presiding Justice of the Supreme Court 106,400.00
.1	Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, each 105,800.00
.2	However, in addition to their present official duties, there
.3	are imposed upon the Supreme Court Justices the extra duties of
_4	making a special study of existing laws and reporting to each
.5	regular session of the Legislature such constructive suggestions
6	as they may deem necessary for the improvement of the
7	administration of justice, and of advising and counseling with the
-8	State Librarian in the selection of law books for purchase and use
_9	in the State Law Library, advising with the librarian thereof upon
20	the removal from the library of any books which may be the least
21	frequently used, and for the placing of same in a convenient
22	location so as to provide additional space for such books and
23	other current publications which may be more frequently used or
24	called for. For such extra services each justice, from and after

25	the effective date of <u>Senate Bill No. 2479</u> , 1999 <u>Regular Session</u> ,
26	shall receive a sum sufficient when added to the present salaries
27	of the justices to aggregate One Hundred Eight Thousand Four
28	<u>Hundred Dollars (\$108,400.00)</u> for the Chief Justice, <u>One Hundred</u>
29	Six Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$106,400.00) for the Presiding
30	Justice, and One Hundred Five Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars
31	(\$105,800.00) for Associate Justices, per annum. As each existing
32	term expires and the above-captioned salaries become effective in
33	due course, the extra duties and compensation provided for shall
34	cease.
35	(2) The annual salaries of the judges of the Court of
36	Appeals of Mississippi are fixed as follows:
37	Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals \$101,800.00
38	Associate Judges of the Court of Appeals, each 99,000.00
39	(3) The annual salaries of the chancery and circuit court
40	judges are fixed as follows:
41	Chancery Judges, each\$96,200.00
42	Circuit Judges, each
43	In addition to their present official duties, there are
44	imposed upon the chancery and circuit court judges the extra
45	duties of making a special study of existing laws relating to
46	trial courts and reporting to the Supreme Court of the State of
47	Mississippi such constructive suggestions as they may deem
48	necessary for the improvement of the administration of justice,
49	which shall be recommended to the Legislature by the Supreme Court
50	in the manner provided by law. The judges shall advise and
51	supervise in the purchase of law books for the libraries of each
52	district, and shall study and evaluate the inventory of books and
53	facilities now existing in the libraries of each district to
54	effect the removal and relocation of obsolete publications so as
55	to provide additional space for those books and current
56	publications more frequently used. The judges shall study the

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- 57 existing rules promulgated by the circuit and chancery court
- 58 judicial associations governing the operation of chancery and
- 59 circuit courts, and revise the same pursuant to existing laws.
- 60 For such extra services each judge, from and after the effective
- 61 date of <u>Senate Bill No. 2479, 1999 Regular Session</u>, shall receive
- 62 a sum sufficient when added to the present salaries of the judges
- to aggregate Ninety-six Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$96,200.00)
- 64 per annum for each judge. Upon the expiration of the existing
- 65 term, the above-captioned salaries become effective in due course,
- 66 and the extra duties and compensation provided for shall cease.
- 67 (4) The Supreme Court shall prepare a payroll for chancery
- 68 judges and circuit judges and submit such payroll to the
- 69 Department of Finance and Administration.
- 70 (5) The annual salary of the full-time district attorneys
- 71 shall be Seventy-nine Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty Dollars
- 72 (\$79,830.00).
- 73 (6) The annual salary of the full-time legal assistants
- 74 shall be not less than Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) nor
- 75 more than Sixty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$67,500.00),
- 76 as established by the district attorney.
- 77 SECTION 4. Section 25-31-10, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 78 amended as follows:
- 79 25-31-10. (1) Any district attorney may appoint a full-time
- 80 criminal investigator.
- 81 (2) The district attorneys of the Third, Fifth, Ninth,
- 82 Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth, Fifteenth, Sixteenth, Seventeenth and
- 83 Twentieth Circuit Court Districts may appoint one (1) additional
- 84 full-time criminal investigator for a total of two (2) full-time
- 85 criminal investigators.
- 86 (3) The district attorneys of the First, Second, Fourth and
- 87 Seventh and Nineteenth Circuit Court Districts may appoint two (2)
- 88 additional full-time criminal investigators for a total of three

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- 89 (3) full-time criminal investigators.
- 90 (4) No district attorney or assistant district attorney
- 91 shall accept any private employment, civil or criminal, in any
- 92 matter investigated by such criminal investigators.
- 93 (5) The full and complete compensation for all public duties
- 94 rendered by said criminal investigators shall be not \* \* \* more
- 95 than Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) per annum, to be
- 96 determined at the discretion of the district attorney based upon
- 97 the qualifications, education and experience of the criminal
- 98 investigator, plus necessary travel and other expenses, to be paid
- 99 in accordance with Section 25-31-8. Provided, however, the
- 100 maximum salary under this subsection for a criminal investigator
- 101 who has a law degree may be supplemented by the district attorney
- 102 from other available funds, but not to exceed the maximum salary
- 103 for a legal assistant to a district attorney.
- 104 (6) Any criminal investigator may be designated by the
- 105 district attorney to attend the Law Enforcement Officers Training
- 106 Program set forth in Section 45-6-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of
- 107 1972. The total expenses associated with attendance by criminal
- 108 investigators at the Law Enforcement Officers Training Program
- 109 shall be paid out of the funds of the appropriate district
- 110 attorney.
- 111 SECTION 5. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
- 112 is directed to submit Sections 3 and 4 of this act, immediately
- 113 upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature
- 114 subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States
- 115 or to the United States District Court for the District of
- 116 Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights
- 117 Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
- 118 SECTION 6. Sections 3 and 4 of this act shall take effect
- 119 and be in force from and after July 1, 1999, if they are
- 120 effectuated on or before that date under Section 5 of the Voting

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- 121 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended. If they are
- 122 effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as
- amended and extended, after July 1, 1999, Sections 3 and 4 of this 123
- 124 act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date they
- are respectively effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights 125
- 126 Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
- SECTION 7. Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall take effect 127
- and be in force from and after July 1, 1999. 128
