- DEVELOP A MENTORING PROGRAM UNDER WHICH LOCAL PROFESSIONALS
- 3 VOLUNTEER TO MENTOR TO STUDENTS ON A ONE-ON-ONE BASIS; AND FOR
- 4 RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The State Department of Education shall
- 7 develop a mentoring program for the purpose of helping to promote
- 8 confidence and self-esteem in youth. Under the program, a school
- 9 district may arrange for professionals within the local community
- 10 to volunteer to act as mentors to students.
- 11 (2) The teachers and principal in a school shall select
- 12 students for participation in the mentoring program. Priority
- 13 shall be given to those students considered to be at risk.
- 14 (3) Each professional participating in the program shall be
- 15 assigned to act as the mentor for one (1) student for the school
- 16 year. The school district shall allow for mentors to meet weekly
- 17 with the students at the school throughout the school year.
- 18 (4) The goals and objectives of a professional participating
- 19 in the mentoring program shall include the following:
- 20 (a) To develop an ongoing relationship with the student
- 21 and to provide positive attention, support and inspiration to the
- 22 student;

- 23 (b) On an academic level, to encourage the student by
- 24 assisting with class work and test preparations and by conferring
- 25 with the student's teachers;
- 26 (c) To reinforce the importance of academics to the
- 27 student by praising him or her for classroom accomplishments and
- 28 by serving as personal proof to the student that an education can
- 29 lead to a better life;
- 30 (d) To encourage the student on a personal level
- 31 through guidance and counseling as a caring and thoughtful adult
- 32 who listens as a friend and nurtures the student's interests and
- 33 talents; and
- 34 (e) To encourage proper behavior by the student,
- 35 consistent with state and federal law, school rules and other
- 36 sources of authority.
- 37 (5) Subject to the availability of appropriations, the State
- 38 Department of Education shall allocate funds to those school
- 39 districts participating in the mentoring program to help defray
- 40 any costs incurred in association with the program.
- 41 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 42 and after July 1, 2000.
