## HOUSE BILL NO. 65

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56.12, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 2 1972, TO AUTHORIZE ACTIVE AND RETIRED MEMBERS OF THE MISSISSIPPI 3 NATIONAL GUARD AND OF THE UNITED STATES RESERVES TO PURCHASE 4 VETERANS TAGS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56.12, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

27-19-56.12. In recognition of the patriotic service 8 rendered by Mississippians who are honorably discharged veterans 9 who served in the United States Armed Forces in Saudi Arabia or 10 Kuwait during Operation Desert Storm or Operation Desert Shield, 11 in Panama during the invasion, in Grenada during the invasion, 12 13 during the Vietnam Conflict, during the Korean Conflict, during World War II or during World War I, and in recognition of the 14 15 patriotic service rendered by Mississippians who are active duty or retired members of the Mississippi National Guard or the United 16 States Reserves, including both enlisted and officer personnel, 17 any such person is privileged to obtain one (1) distinctive motor 18 vehicle license plate or tag identifying him as a veteran. 19 The State Tax Commission is further authorized to develop a decal to 20 21 be affixed to the license tag indicating the veteran's service in 22 the above enumerated wars or conflicts or service in the

H. B. No. 65 00\HR40\R57 PAGE 1 23 <u>Mississippi National Guard or the United States Reserves</u>. The 24 distinctive plates or tags shall be of a color and design 25 designated by the Tax Commission.

The distinctive license plates shall be prepared by the Tax 26 Commission and shall be issued through the tax collectors of the 27 28 counties in the same manner as are other motor vehicle license plates or tags. An additional tag fee of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) 29 shall be collected by the tax collector for such license plates or 30 tags and shall be forwarded to the Tax Commission which shall 31 deposit such fee to the credit of a fund to be administered by the 32 board overseeing the veterans nursing homes in this state for the 33 benefit of indigent veterans who are residents of such nursing 34 35 homes.

36 An applicant for such distinctive plates shall present to the issuing official written evidence of the veteran's service. Such 37 38 evidence shall include a copy of the applicant's DD-214 form or an 39 equivalent document. However, an applicant who is a member of the Mississippi National Guard or of the United States Reserves, shall 40 present to the issuing official proof of his membership by means 41 of a certificate signed by the commanding officer of such 42 applicant on forms prescribed by the Adjutant General of 43 Mississippi. A retired member of the Mississippi National Guard 44 45 or of the United States Reserves applying for such plates shall present to the issuing official a copy of his active duty 46 retirement orders or other proof of retirement from active 47 48 <u>service.</u> The distinctive license plates or tags so issued shall be 49 used only upon a personally or jointly owned private passenger 50

51 vehicle (to include station wagons, recreational motor vehicles 52 and pickup trucks) registered in the name, or jointly in the name, 53 of the person making application therefor, and when issued to such

H. B. No. 65 00\HR40\R57 PAGE 2 54 person shall be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of 55 the standard license plate or license tag normally issued for such 56 vehicle.

57 The distinctive license plates shall not be transferable 58 between motor vehicle owners; and in the event the owner of a 59 vehicle bearing a distinctive plate shall sell, trade, exchange or 60 otherwise dispose of the vehicle, such plate shall be retained by 61 such owner and returned to the tax collector.

62 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 63 and after July 1, 2000.
